Holy Angels is a Catholic community of faith joining past, present, and future members on a journey with Christ to the Father.



Holy Angels Service Scholarship

This scholarship is awarded to Holy Angels' seniors. It is based on church and PRE attendance, service to Holy Angels, community service and attitude. Father Patrick, the DRE, PRE teachers, and high school teachers will also give input. It is not based on academics or financial need. A short written essay is required. The recipient(s) are chosen by a committee consisting of adult members of the parish. All monies are paid directly to the school chosen by the student for his or her continuing education. ▶▶▶ THE COMPLETED APPLICATION AND ESSAY ARE DUE IN THE PARISH OFFICE by 3:00pm ON MONDAY, FEBRUARY 2, 2020. ◄ ◄ Place your application and essay in a sealed envelope; clearly marked "Attention Scholarship Committee" on the envelope. Drop your envelope by the parish office during normal business hours or in the Sunday collection basket. Applications can be found by contacting your DRE, Carrie Beld.

SACRAMENTS

<u>Baptism</u> - A preparation class is required of the parents requesting Baptism for their first child. Parents and godparents are encouraged to attend the class before the baby's birth.

<u>Confirmation</u> - is celebrated with students who are at least in the 8th grade and have completed the requirements for the preparation process in our PRE program.

Matrimony - Couples planning to marry should contact the Pastor at least 6 months prior to the proposed date so all parish and diocesan requirements may be completed.

<u>Holy Orders</u> - If you feel called to a vocation in the priesthood or religious life, please contact the pastor.

Anointing of the Sick - If you wish to receive this sacrament, contact the pastor. If there is an emergency situation, an immediate family member should contact the pastor.

NOVEMBER - Month of All Souls

The theme of suffering and redemption go hand in hand in Christian theology. Good Friday leads to Easter Sunday. Death to sinfulness leads to Christ's invitation to the fullness of life. In the same way, Christ describes the end times being preceded by turmoil and trials. Whatever we may face, our faith in Jesus Christ teaches us to trust that his redeeming love will always win out at the end. This is true for the end times and for the daily struggles and trials we face in our lives. Sustaining hope in our everyday ups and downs helps us to mature in faith as we await the return of Christ at the end of time.

FIRST READING (Malachi 3:19-20a) The prophet Malachi issues a dire warning about the end time. It will be a day of justice; the evildoers will be reduced to stubble by fire; but those who fear the name of the Lord will be saved. The words of the prophet would have been addressed to the people of Israel, calling them out of their infidelity to the covenant with God.

The day of the Lord will be a day of judgment and vindication: for all who were faithful. It will be a time of healing and wholeness. That day is coming soon, says the prophet Malachi.

RESPONSORIAL PSALM (Psalm 98:5-6, 7-8, 9) Psalm 98 is a hymn of praise for the Lord. It calls on the people to sing joyfully and play instruments. Even creation is to rejoice: the sea and the rivers are to clap their hands and the mountains should shout for joy. All this acclamation is due to the Lord for he rules earth and its people with justice and equity.

The coming of the Lord who brings justice and judgment is reason for all the earth to break forth in to joy-filled songs of praise.

SECOND READING (2 Thessalonians 3:7-12) Paul reminds the brothers and sisters in Thessalonica of how he worked among them without expecting pay for his labors. He holds this up to them as an example that should imitate. Apparently Paul did not want to be a burden on their resources, though it is likely that they showed him some form of hospitality. He takes issue with those who have been busybodies, acting in a disorderly fashion. This is not acceptable among those who should be doing the Lord's work.

The Thessalonians are to imitate Paul's example in working for their livelihood to avoid being a burden on anyone. They are to be focused on the Lord Jesus and the work that is theirs, not dissipated in their thoughts and actions.

GOSPEL (Luke 21:5-19) This passage from Luke is often referred to as an eschatological text; it points to the end times and includes cosmic signs and natural disasters that speak of the end of things known and familiar. The positive message is that only God has a hand in the matters of life and death and those who persevere in faith will not be saved by the events of the world buy by God.

Speculation about the end-time has been around for a long time. When will it happen? What signs will precede it? People have always wanted certainty about it. In today's Gospel, Jesus warns his listeners against false prophets and mistaken signs. With foreboding words, he tells his disciples that before the end comes, they will suffer and be persecuted because of his name—even my members of their own families. He assures the disciples of his presence with them and promises that through perseverance they will save their lives.
