Feb 29th — Annual Diocesan Wedding Anniversary Mass with The Most Reverend Bishop David P. Talley will be celebrated on Saturday, February 29, 2020 at 10:00am at St. Louis Catholic Church on 203 S. White Station Rd. in Memphis. The Diocesan Mass is to recognize couples celebrating 25, 40, 50, or more years of married life. Due to the large volume of participation each year, only couples who are celebrating one of the designated anniversary years may register to be recognized, and the anniversary must fall within that calendar year. Pre-Registration is required. No registrations are accepted at the door on the day of the Mass. All registered couples will be presented with a certificate in honor of their marriage anniversary and a special reception will be held immediately following at the Clunan Center. SACRAMENTS

Baptism - A preparation class is required of the parents requesting Baptism for their first child. Parents and godparents are encouraged to attend the class before the baby’s birth.

Confirmation - is celebrated with students who are at least in the 8th grade and have completed the requirements for the preparation process in our PRE program.

Matrimony - Couples planning to marry should contact the Pastor at least 6 months prior to the proposed date so all parish and diocesan requirements may be completed.

Holy Orders - If you feel called to a vocation in the priesthood or religious life, please contact the pastor.

Anointing of the Sick - If you wish to receive this sacrament, contact the pastor. If there is an emergency situation, an immediate family member should contact the pastor.



JANUARY -- Month of the Holy Name

FIRST READING (Isaiah 8:23—9:3) Isaiah recalls Israel's history when the northern tribes were conquered by the Assyrians and placed in exile. Their situation is described as "darkness" and their living conditions as being "in the land of gloom." Their eventual freedom is attributed to the intervention of God who came to them as a light. The result of this freedom was "great rejoicing" and "abundant joy". The prophet compares their jubilation to the joy that happens when the spoils of the harvest are shared, and when those in slavery are given their freedom.

RESPONSORIAL PSALM (Psalm 27:1, 4, 13-14) Fittingly, today's Responsorial Psalm acclaims the Lord as light and salvation. His protection and help casts out fear in times of distress. The first verse is a declaration of praise of the Lord. The second is a petition to dwell with the Lord, expressing such longing to see the Lord, is fulfilled whenever we turn to Jesus. The third is an affirmation of confidence in the Lord. The Lord is addressed with three metaphors: light, salvation, and refuge. Each ascribes to the Lord both the desire and the power to take care of the psalmist and, by inference, all those who know the Lord. The petition to "dwell in the house of the Lord" could be understood to dwell in the embrace of the Lord.



SECOND READING (1 Corinthians 1:10-13, 17) On more than one occasion, Paul takes the Church in Corinth to task for the divisions that arise among them. Today's text is one example. Although Paul considers them brothers and sisters in the Lord, he still takes responsibility for their spiritual welfare and for the harmony that should be among them. He dismisses their bickering over whom they should follow by reminding them that it is Christ Jesus who has saved them. The Gospel he preaches is that of Christ; and that is what they are to follow.

Paul wrote to the people of Corinth: let "there be no divisions among you...be united in mind and in the same purpose." I have heard "that there are rivalries among you...Is Christ divided?" The divisions in the Corinthian community, based on rivalries stemming from self-designated status, literally tear the community apart. Paul begs that the divisions cease and that the unity befitting the Lord's community be realized. They must take the Lord, who emptied himself and died the meanest of deaths, as the wisdom of their lives.

GOSPEL (Matthew 4:12-23 or 4:12-17) Today's reading is Matthew's account of the beginning of Jesus' public ministry. One of Matthew's themes is the connection between Jesus' mission and that foretold by the prophets. He does this by quoting the Isaiah passage that was the first reading. Jesus is presented as the light for the nations. Now that John the Baptist has been arrested, Jesus takes up his ministry and calls the first four apostles. The immediate response of the four fishermen has become an example for every disciple who intends to follow the Lord. The last lines of the Gospel announce the nature and scope of Jesus' mission.

Jesus said to Simon Peter and Andrew, "Come after me, and I will make you fishers of men." Immediately they followed him. Jesus began to proclaim this: "Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand." He cured many people. Isaiah's words (First Reading) are cited by Matthew in today's Gospel. Their juxtaposition with the beginning of Jesus's ministry casts Jesus as this Light. We hear Jesus calling his first disciples who immediately respond to him. Jesus's ministry of teaching and healing brought enlightenment and smashed the yokes that burdened the people.
