**June 21<sup>st</sup> — Memorial of St. Aloysius Gonzaga, Religious** (1568-1591) St. Aloysius Gonzaga, SJ was born to a noble family in Italy who destined him for the military. He died at age 23 while tending the sick who were dying from an epidemic in Rome. He is patron of young people and individuals living with HIV/AIDS. While recovering from an illness, he read the lives of the saints and spent time in prayer. As a result, Aloysius decided to dedicate himself to God as a Jesuit. Most of his family was against it, but he joined anyway, making his vows in 1587. In 1591, the plague broke out in Rome. Aloysius volunteered to care for the victims and became sick himself. He recovered, but his health was broken, and he died within a few months. Many schools are named for him because he is the patron saint of Catholic youth.

**June 23<sup>rd</sup> — Scriptural Rosary** The Scriptural Rosary will be recited on Wednesday, June 23<sup>rd</sup> at 5:45pm in the Church. Following the life of Christ, we will be reciting the Glorious Mysteries this week.

**June 24<sup>th</sup> — The Nativity of John the Baptist** The celebration of the birth of John the Baptist is one of three birthdays (along with the Nativities of Jesus and of the Blessed Virgin Mary) commemorated in the liturgical year. John's birth is observed during the summer solstice, on the longest day of the year, but immediately afterward the days begin to grow shorter. Jesus' birthday is celebrated, however, during the winter solstice, the shortest day of the year. But gradually and almost imperceptibly the days grow longer. It is no accident that John's Gospel account speaks about light. John was not the light but came to testify to the light. No wonder John states that he must diminish as Christ, the Light of the World, must increase, just like the phenomena of the solstices.

## SACRAMENTS

**JUNE – Month of the Sacred Heart**

The boat is a frequent symbol used by the Church. Through the centuries, and even to this day, the Church is tossed about in the turbulent seas of life. Yet, it is Jesus who calms our fears with the simple gesture of his hand. Saint Augustine, who commented on today's Scriptures in the fourth century, said, "Jesus Christ dwells in you through faith. Faith present in your heart is Jesus Christ present. Watchful faith is Jesus Christ watching. Sleeping faith is Jesus Christ asleep. Therefore, wake him up, arouse yourself and make this prayer, 'Teacher...we are perishing'" (Sermon 81:8)

Today's Scriptures set us in the midst of a raging sea, a mighty force of nature that only the Word of God can restrain. Anyone who has witnessed the violent winds and lashing waves of a storm at sea understands the terror of the disciples and the fearful hearts of the sailors described in today's Responsorial Psalm.

In Biblical tradition, the sea—particularly its stormy side—symbolizes chaos, all that threatens peace and well-being. Such was the experience of both Job and the disciples. Job's whole life had become an uncontrollable storm, having suddenly lost both family and possessions. And the disciples, while attracted enough to Jesus to leave all and follow him, were still perplexed by his power and perhaps troubles by the negative reactions he sometimes received.

In today's Scriptures, God's power over the storm is revealed in the midst: "The Lord addressed Job out of the storm". Jesus was in the boat with his disciples, during the storm. Like the sailors of Psalm 107, "they cried to the Lord in their distress; from their straits he rescued them." The Word of God hushes the storm and stills the sea. In the midst of the storm, Job, the sailors, and the disciples all receive at least a glimpse of who God is and experience God's "kindness and wondrous deeds."


What wisdom for us as we encounter the storms of our own lives! What seems to be chaos, to threaten our very lives, is but the setting in which the power of the Divine can be revealed. Let us not forget that the Teacher will not let us perish. The power of his Word can still our storms as well.

**FIRST READING** (Job 38:1, 8-11) Job challenged God about that most disturbing question: Why do the just suffer? God did not respond directly, but rather pointed out the vast difference between humanity and divinity. If we cannot control the sea, how can we question or comprehend the designs of God?

**RESPONSORIAL PSALM** (Psalm 107:23-24, 25-26, 28-29, 30-31) This psalm of thanksgiving for rescue does not answer the question about the why of a near-fatal storm. Rather, it gives thanks for God's presence in the time of danger as well as in times of contentment.

**SECOND READING** (2 Corinthians 5:14-17) Paul says "The love of Christ impels us ..." This reading invites us to ask how our experience and love of God compel us to live, no longer for ourselves, but for Christ.

**GOSPEL** (Mark 4:35-41) Job wondered where God was in his suffering. The disciples were shocked that Jesus slept during the storm. In both cases, the ones in danger were disappointed that God didn't act as they wished. Put in very blunt terms the readings ask us to consider whether we look to God to be our servant and rescuer or our teacher and Lord.
