

**August – Month of the Immaculate Heart of Mary**

In our Christian witness, it is important to exemplify integrity of life. Thus, our external practice is an expression of our interior disposition. In today's Gospel, Jesus criticizes religious practice that merely honors God with the lips, while the heart is far from the Lord. For all their concern about observance of the law, the scribes and Pharisees often missed the point about its deeper meaning. As Jesus demonstrates through his citation of the prophet Isaiah, they give lip service but not heart service. It is what is in the heart—and comes out of the heart—that counts. Our beliefs must overflow in good word and deed, rather than the hypocrisy the Lord warns us to avoid.

**FIRST READING** (Deuteronomy 4:1-2, 6-8) Throughout the book of Deuteronomy, Moses exhorts the people to obedience to the commands of the Lord, for this will indicate their fidelity to the covenant that God made with Israel on Mount Sinai (or Horeb as it is sometimes called, particularly in Deuteronomy). The law of God is a source of wisdom and guidance for life and a means through which God is close to his people.

As Moses presents God's law, he insists that obedience will make the people famous and assure a good life. Most of all, he underlines the fact that they are uniquely privileged in the way God is present to them and has taught them. This reading, coming at the end of the summer season, invites us to look at our religious experience and tradition and appreciate our faith heritage in the same way that Moses encouraged his people to do.

**RESPONSORIAL PSALM** (Psalm 15:2-3, 3-4, 4-5) The verses acclaim God's nearness to the person who abides by the law. Psalm 15 echoes many of the precepts of the law and thus serves to teach the people.

When we pray "those who do justice will live in the presence of God," we are not saying that God is absent from the unjust. Rather, doing justice is our way of choosing to be conscious of and responsive to his presence. That includes an attitude of heartfelt truth expressed that comes to light in service of others.

**SECOND READING** (James 1:17-18, 21b-22, 27) Although the Second Reading is not chosen because of its relationship to the other two readings, today's text complements them well with its emphasis on the importance of hearing and doing the word. In the Old Testament, the needs of orphans and widows are a special concern in God's Law.

In today's language we might say that the Epistle of James is the epistle of transparency. James insists that our faith must be expressed in action for the good of others. If we are saved, then we will act like people who have nothing to worry about and who therefore can share with abandon. He goes so far as to equate work for justice with worship. In the light of that, he would ask us how we live and worship outside of the church building.

**GOSPEL** (Mark 7:1-8, 14-15, 21-23) For all their concern about observance of the law, the scribes and Pharisees often missed the point about its deeper meaning. As Jesus demonstrates through his citation of the prophet Isaiah, they give lip service but not heart service. It is what is in the heart—and comes out of the heart—that counts.

If we want to summarize today's Gospel with a key question, it would be "Where is your heart?" The "law" that the religious leaders were quoting to Jesus was actually scholarly commentary on God's law developed over centuries. Certainly, it was a good and healthful practice to eat with clean hands, but scrupulous attention to detail was not part of Jesus's vision of God's reign. According to Jesus, those whose religiosity focuses more on legal detail than on the needs of others block the way to God for themselves as well as for others.

**REFLECTION** St. James tells us, "humbly welcome the word that has been planted in you and is able to save your souls." This is an important message for everyone, but especially to those students who may be heading off to college this week. St. Mark gives us a whole list of things that can happen when one's heart is not in the right place, and many of them are the things that young people become enslaved to under the guise of "freedom" as they enter college or the work world. Freedom is not simultaneous with irresponsibility. It goes back to last week. Again we must choose Christ.

Dear Supporter of the Autumn March and Cookie Scholarship,

Thank you so much for making these efforts so fruitful for our little community of Dyer county. This will be the 6th year for our race and we have helped so many people: scholarships, donations to the ALS chapter of West Tennessee, and whatever's left goes to somewhere local like Matthew 25:40 to help others. One December we were able to give them \$1,600 for Christmas to help with providing things for our local families.

First and foremost we on this committee want to empower the children of our area. We give them \$1,000 to begin the chapter of college. This money goes directly to them so they can start a checking account and buy things needed for the transition. Each student that we have helped has continued a path toward becoming a productive citizen. Some of those have chosen to go to college, some go to a trade school, and others will go locally to Dyersburg State for 2 years. It is people like you that keep this going. I thank you from the bottom of my heart.

The next big thing that we do with our race is we give money each year to the ALS chapter of West Tennessee. Wesley Neurological Clinic does a free clinic each month for people with motor neuron diseases. Anyone who is in West Tennessee and has any type of problem is allowed to go for free. People like me need a one-stop shop for health. This is it. I could see all of my doctors in one day. This is a blessing for people that have motor neuron diseases and mobility issues. Over the past five races we have given \$20,000 toward helping others in West Tennessee at this clinic. I want to thank you again! You helped me to live, not die with ALS.

The world is crazy. Times are hard. These are the times that we pull together to help others. This year in order to honor my good friend Bart Williams I am helping with the Depot Days as well as the Autumn March for ALS. Half of the proceeds from the Depot Days race will be donated toward our scholarship fund.

Each year when we get to this point and the race planning gets to a fever pitch I think of the parable about the widow's mite. This is how we make so many wonderful things happen through our races. Please consider if you are an individual donating \$50. If you are a corporation or a mom and pop business, could you consider donating \$100. If you are looking for something to do to help a little more, a \$1000 donation would pay for the chip timer for the races. The more things that we get paid for by wonderful patrons the more money we can put into the children of our community, a donation for a cure for ALS, and spread love to those in our little corner of the world.
