

Nov 21st — Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe Today is the 34th or Last Sunday in Ordinary Time and the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe. This solemnity was established by Pope Pius XI in 1925, an observance celebrating an aspect of Jesus' identity rather than of his life. Conventional understandings of kingship and power are transformed. Rather than calling up images of Jesus Christ dressed in kingly robes, the Gospel proclaims him as king by the sign over his head on the throne of a wooden cross (I.N.R.I. — *Iesus Nazarenus Rex Iudaeorum* — Jesus of Nazareth, King of the Jews). Paradoxically, it is the thief who recognized in Christ the Lord and Messiah.

Today marks the last Sunday of Ordinary Time, the last Sunday of the liturgical year. With Thanksgiving a few days away and the beginning of Advent next Sunday there is much to occupy our reflection today. This might be a good opportunity to review this past year of our spiritual journey. How was my relationship with the Lord? What might I change in the new year (Advent) that begins next week? Does my answer include being more charitable and more grateful? If so, then Thanksgiving offers an excellent opportunity to do that.

Nov 21st — Catholic Campaign for Human Development Please be generous in this week's second collection which supports the CCHD. In the U.S., one in six people lives in poverty. With this collection you support programs that address the causes of poverty and provide a sustainable future for those who are struggling across the country. CCHD was founded to end the cycle of poverty in the United States by funding organizations that help individuals help themselves. In addition, 25% of funds collected remains in our diocese to fund local anti-poverty projects. Please prayerfully consider how you can support this collection. Your contribution will defend human dignity and reach out to those living on the margins. By supporting this collection you give people a hand up, not a hand out.

SACRAMENTS

Baptism - A preparation class is required of parents requesting Baptism for their first child. Parents and godparents are encouraged to attend the class before the baby's birth.

First Communion — is celebrated with students who are at least in the 2nd grade and have completed the 2 year required preparation process in our PRE program.

Confirmation - is celebrated with students who are at least in the 8th grade and have completed the 2 year required preparation process in our PRE program.

NOVEMBER – Month of All Souls

On this day, we celebrate the universal kingship of Jesus Christ. He is the fulfillment of the vision of the Son of Man coming in the First Reading from Daniel. Dominion and glory are his as he reigns over all peoples and nations. He is the beginning and the end, as we hear in the Second Reading, from Revelation. His Kingdom does not belong to this world, he tells Pilate in the Gospel reading from John. Pilate names him a king, though Jesus did not identify himself as such. Truth is the basis of Jesus’ Kingdom—a far different basis than that of earthly kings and rulers. As his followers, we belong to the truth. The truth of Jesus is the basis on which we can build to transform the world so it more closely mirrors God’s Kingdom of love and justice here and now.

FIRST READING (Daniel 7:13-14) The phrase “son of man” (Daniel 7:13), in its most generic sense, refers to a human being. In later Jewish literature, it came to refer to an individual associated with the end time who, faithful to God in life, wins victory and is exalted to heaven. Both senses are evident in today’s reading. We see Daniel’s words ultimately fulfilled in Jesus, who spoke of himself as the Son of Man. Daniel’s vision is of the end time when the Son of Man will receive glory and eternal kingship from God, the “Ancient of Days.”

RESPONSORIAL PSALM (Psalm 93:1, 1-2, 5) The Psalm celebrates God’s kingship. The references to an “everlasting throne” echo today’s First Reading.


The Lord, the Creator, the one who entered into a covenant with Moses -- that Lord in king. He wears majestic robes. He is armed. He established the firmament. His throne has been around from time immemorial, and it will continue to last for ages to come. Furthermore, the decrees of this Lord are trustworthy. They are a sign of the eternity of God’s power. This psalm links the images of God the Father and God the Son. God the Father created the world and established the covenant; God the Son is Lord of all, the one whose kingdom shall last forever.

SECOND READING (Revelation 1:5-8) John’s words look to the anticipated coming of Jesus amid the clouds at the end of time. Note the titles given to Jesus in the first and last lines of today’s text.

To Jesus Christ belongs all glory and power forever and ever. The Book of Revelations assigns the vision of clouds (see First Reading) to Jesus as well. In this one passage we meet prophecy and fulfillment as we are reminded of the words Jesus used to speak of himself.

GOSPEL (John 18:33b-37) Today’s text is part of a longer exchange between Jesus and Pilate when Jesus was brought before him at the time of his arrest. “King of the Jews” is a title with messianic overtones and, in fact, is the title that Pilate had placed over the crucified Jesus (John 18:33). The dialogue in today’s text focuses on the nature of Jesus’ kingship and kingdom. It is this truth that is not of this world. In Johannine literature, the world is anything that stands in opposition to God. It is the truth of God and his ways that Jesus was sent to proclaim.

This passage helps us understand what we mean by the title “king” as applied to Jesus. To a contemporary society in which kings are held in low esteem, the word carries a sense of entitlement and caste. But the kingship of Jesus is not of this world. We all yearn for a ruler who will take responsibility for society, whose own goodness will influence the goodness of others, who will contain evildoers and rescue the poor. Jesus Christ is the ideal ruler and we have given to him the throne of our hearts.
