SACRAMENTS

Baptism - A preparation class is required of parents requesting Baptism for their first child. Parents and godparents are encouraged to attend the class before the baby's birth.

First Communion – is celebrated with students who are at least in the 2nd grade and have completed the 2 year required preparation process in our PRE program.

Confirmation - is celebrated with students who are at least in the 8th grade and have completed the 2 year required preparation process in our PRE program.

Matrimony - Couples planning to marry should contact the Pastor at least 6 months prior to the proposed date so all parish and diocesan requirements may be completed.

Holy Orders - If you feel called to a vocation to the priesthood or religious life, please contact the Pastor.

FEBRUARY-Month of the Passion of Our Lord

Simon Peter's humble exclamation illustrates what is often referred to as the fear of God, one of the gifts of the Holy Spirit. The word "fear" gives us the impression of something dark, negative and harmful, but the fear of God is better defined as a moment of clarity and light. When we experience the fear of God, the Holy Spirit illuminates for us God's holy presence in our lives. In the face of God's holiness, we can often recognize, like Peter, the long way we have to go in our own holiness. The moment of the fear of God is a moment of awe and humility, when we recognize God's amazing power, love, and grace and become aware of our human weakness and limitations. It is an honest and inspiring moment of conversion, inviting us into God's holy presence, no matter the distance we find ourselves from it.

FIRST READING (Isaiah 6:1-2a, 3-8) The call of Isaiah follows a familiar pattern. Isaiah has an encounter with the Lord, seeing a vision of the Lord's magnificence in his dwelling in the Temple. Transformed and inspired by that encounter, Isaiah offers himself enthusiastically in service of the Lord. Though Isaiah understands his own limitations, he trusts God and is purified for his mission of preaching God's steadfast love and mercy to a people in great need.

We hear of the call of the prophet Isaiah during a vision he had in the Temple in Jerusalem. Isaiah sees the splendor and grandeur of God enthroned in heaven, surrounded by choirs of angels singing his praise (the words we sing at the beginning of the Eucharistic prayer at every Mass). Isaiah's experience of the holiness of God makes him aware of his own sinfulness as well as that of his people. He—and we—are purified as a result of our encounter with God.

RESPONSORIAL PSALM (Psalm 138:1-2, 2-3, 4-5, 7-8) Today's psalm praises the Lord for rescuing his people. Even though the people have sinned and turned away from God, God's love and mercy never fade. God's saving love inspires a hymn of praise in the people. In the same way, God's actions in our lives are not a private matter, but a public act. Our response must be public as well, praising the Lord in the liturgical assembly of his people.

The Israelites believed that their hymns of praise were joined with those of the angels, as is expressed in the first verse of today's Psalm (also the antiphon). Verse 3 (second stanza) evokes Isaiah's cry for help in the experience of his own unworthiness and God's cleansing of his lips. The "hear" of verse 4 evokes Isaiah's mission to speak the words of the Lord.

SECOND READING (1 Corinthians 15:1-11 or 15:3-8, 11) Like Paul, all disciples are called to share the Gospel. The Gospel we are called to proclaim is quite simple: Jesus died for our sins and was raised from the dead so that we might share in eternal life. If we do not believe in this truth and live our lives formed by this belief, our preaching will be empty and useless. If the preacher is not formed by faith, the preaching will not be able to inspire, convert and transform.

Paul "handed on" what he had first "received" (1 Corinthians 15:3) from the proclamation of the Apostles and teachers who preceded him. Some of the appearances mentioned are recounted only here. Note that Paul considered his own experience of the Risen Christ on the road to Damascus in the same category as these earlier appearances. Like Isaiah before him, Paul realizes his own unworthiness as a result of his encounter with the Lord.

GOSPEL (Luke 5:1-11) Paralleling the First Reading's call of the prophet Isaiah, the Gospel recounts the call of Jesus' first disciples. This call follows the familiar pattern. Jesus extends the invitation. Having encountered Jesus and his preaching and having seen his glory (in the miraculous catch of fish), Simon Peter, James, and John are transformed. They abandon the life they have known and begin to follow Jesus, strengthened by the mission with which Jesus entrusts them.

This text might be entitled "The Call of Peter." Like Isaiah before him, Peter was willing to set aside his own objections to obey the Lord. Like Isaiah and Paul, Peter also became conscious of his own sinfulness through his encounter with the Lord and the miraculous catch of fish. The Lord has his ways of readying those he will send.
