SACRAMENTS

<u>Baptism</u> - A preparation class is required of parents requesting Baptism for their first child. Parents and godparents are encouraged to attend the class before the baby's birth.

<u>First Communion</u> – is celebrated with students who have received the sacrament of the Rite of Reconciliation, are at least in the 2nd grade and have completed the 2 years required preparation process in our PRE program.

<u>Confirmation</u> - is celebrated with students who are at least in the 8th grade and have completed the 2 years required preparation process in our PRE program.

<u>Matrimony</u> - Couples planning to marry should contact the Pastor at least 6 months prior to the proposed date so all parish and diocesan requirements may be completed.

Holy Orders - If you feel called to a vocation to the priesthood or religious life, please contact the Pastor.

Anointing of the Sick - If you wish to receive this sacrament, contact the Pastor. In an emergency situation, an immediate family member

Funerals

When planning a funeral for a loved one, please call the pastor before making any arrangements with the funeral home regarding the date and time of visitation, the funeral Mass or service at the funeral home. Holy Angels will provide a funeral luncheon if the family of the deceased requests one.

VANCO Some parishioners are under the impression that when they sign up for Online Giving they are required to contribute to all of the second collections. This is not the case. When you establish an account, you specify how much to give and how frequently (weekly, bi-weekly, monthly, etc.), but it only pertains to the regular collection. To contribute to a second collection, you need to open your account and specify the second collection and the amount you wish to contribute. The advantages of Online Giving are that you don't have to remember to write a check and submit it in the collection and it helps you budget your contributions. When you're away from the parish on vacation you don't have to worry about making up your contributions. It's a win-win situation for you and for the parish. Dear grandparents, dear elderly persons, we are called to be artisans of the *revolution of tenderness* in our world!
