FROM THE PASTORS DESK

The Precious Gift of Faith

Dear Brothers and Sisters of St. Anthony's,

Each morning as I begin my day I go through a bit of a routine like most people. As I awake, and my feet hit the floor, I thank God for a new day. After going through the daily routine of washing my face and brushing my teeth I head downstairs to hit the on button to the coffee pot. I watch the sun as it crests over Tilghman Island which is across the bay from my house. Then I head to the room in the rectory which belongs to Jesus. Having the Blessed Sacrament in my rectory house is one of the benefits of being the pastor. I spend hours each day adoring and being in the presence of our Lord. Here is where my day begins. I acknowledge the presence of the Lord Jesus with the simple genuflection and then sit in the presence of Him who created me and begin my prayers. During this time which is most precious I always pray for at least three things. First, I pray thanking God for a new day which always leads to asking Jesus for the gift of faith. Then I pray for the people in the parish and finally I end with praying for those who I know are soon to die and will be taking the final journey to the Heavenly Kingdom.

I am reminded of the great importance of faith, especially during this time in the Church which has been racked with the latest scandal of sexual abuse. Quite frankly, I wasn't a bit surprised when the news hit the wire that the Church was encountering another, and perhaps worse, scandal than the one that was reported back in 2002. Now, believe me when I say that I am not happy about the whole thing. Just walking across Chesapeake avenue that same morning I couldn't help but think what the people driving by in their cars were thinking of me, the local priest, in his roman collar, going to say morning Mass. The phrase; "Guilty by association" sort of stuck to my clerical garb. I hurried across the street thinking these motorists have a good chance of taking one of "those guys" out. I know this might seem a bit outlandish, but it's funny what goes through your mind when you're profession is being dragged through the media mud. Thank you, North Beach motorists, for being kind to this priest who is only trying to be faithful to his calling. And what a beautiful calling it is to be a priest of Jesus Christ. I am and will always be a priest. But to stay clear of Satan's wiles you must pray for faith. And I mean pray hard and often for the gift of faith.

I remember the priest mentor, Monsignor Tom Wells, always saying to me: "Stackman, it's all about faith." These words coming from my friend have never rang truer than today. Many people have asked me how something like this could happen to the hierarchy of the Church. While I know there are many reasons why such scandalous behavior has occurred, but at the end of the day I have to come back to the fact that these people who perpetrated such sick crimes lost their faith.

Faith is a precious gift, and when it falls, it falls fast and hard and much carnage is left in its wake. Jesus said. "When the Son of Man comes, will he find faith on earth?" (Lk. 18:8) My dear people of St. Anthony's, hold on, and I mean hold on tight! It's probably going to get worse before it gets better. But remember this, and I believe this with every ounce of faith I have, it's still a great time to be in the Church. I said that very phrase the day I was ordained, but I didn't at the time realize how true it would be.

TWENTY-SIXTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME: SEPTEMBER 30TH 2018

First Reading: Numbers 11:25-29

Two men not considered prophets by the people began to prophesize, and this offended those who did not feel they were true prophets. But Moses explained that prophets are chosen by God, not by the people.

Second Reading: James 5:1-6

James speaks out strongly against people who become rich by cheating their workers. He claims the wealth they have dishonestly collected will be a testimony against them on judgement day.

Gospel: 9:38-43, 47-48

Jesus explains to his disciples that it is acceptable for a person who is not part of their group to speak in his name, but he does warn them that anyone who tries to lead his followers astray will be severely punished. Jesus also discusses personal failing and the importance of taking whatever steps are necessary to avoid them.
