FROM THE PASTORS DESK

Communion of the Saints

Dear Brothers and Sisters of St. Anthony's,

Today as I write my article, the Church is celebrating the feast of the recently canonized Saint; Brother Andre Bessette. Brother Andre was a lay brother of the Congregation of the Holy Cross. He is associated with many miraculous healings which he, himself, took no credit for, attributing them to St. Joseph. He died in 1937 and was canonized a saint of the Church by Pope Benedict XVI in October of 2010. His ministry in the congregation was that of "Porter", or door keeper. While at first inspection, you might not think this was very important, but this marvelous and simple brother turned it into a thriving ministry. In the saint's own words, he said: "When I joined this community, the superiors showed me the door, and I remained 40 years."

In our creed that we pray every Sunday, we profess; "The communion of the saints." But does this concept become real for us? One of the blessings of our Catholic faith is to be in union with those who have gone before us. But the mystical reality that they have gone before, and that they can continually be called upon to help us, is truly a blessing that we should take full advantage of. And today I did just that.

All of us know how important our friends are. To have friends is an important aspect of human life. We want and need people in our lives to share thoughts and ideas as well as love and aspirations. God gives these people we call "Saints" to us and our Church to help and inspire us to greater heights. When we see a person like Saint Andre, who was a relatively simple person attracted literally thousands of people we know that God is reaching his people.

It was said that our saint had a great devotion to Saint Joseph. I have always thought of Saint Joseph as the unsung hero of the New Testament. He is featured in the Gospel of Matthew prominently as the person who the angel is in constant contact with. Saint Andre must have known how special Saint Joseph was in the early life of Jesus. Saint Joseph never gets the main spotlight, but he is that constant presence that the young boy Jesus would lean on in hard times and difficult moments.

As we finish out the Christmas season with the Baptism of the Lord and begin living in the "Ordinary Time" of the Church year, maybe a person like Saint Andre may inspire us to strive to new heights by doing the simple things in life well. Who would have ever thought that answering a door or a phone or an email would be a cause of holiness, but in the case of Saint Andre, it was the means of great sanctity.
