Dear friends of St. Ann's,

This coming week, our students return to class at Light of Christ Academy. One of the distinctive characteristics of our school is the integral way the Catholic faith is lived and shared here.



Each day begins with Holy Mass and will end by coming together in prayer. These bookends of our school day anchor the day in Christ and help build habits of faith that will last a lifetime.

You may have noticed the phrasing in the announcements at Sunday Masses the last few weeks that the morning Mass on school days will be "part of the instruction day". I'm sure you may have wondered what this means. The idea is that we approach our attendance and participation at Mass with the intentional attitude of a learning community. Our school children don't just go to Mass, but they learn the Mass by the daily habit of participation. The children will sit in classroom groups in designated areas of the main body of the church. This way the students will have a clear view of the action of the Mass and their participation can be encouraged and guided by their teachers. To aid this, I respectfully ask that others attending Mass on school days please sit behind the designated class areas or in the wing of the church. The children (and others) will be provided with the texts of the prayers for each Mass and will participate by singing or reciting the people's parts for the Mass. The upper level children will have the opportunity to participate in the study and practice of leading the singing or recitation of the entrance, psalm, and communion texts, as well as the liturgical readings. This studied preparation will help them to see the cycle of the Church's prayers through the year and how these parts fit together.

We will seat front to back in order to get the most people in the church (no preferential seating). Please be patient. Those medically unable to wear a mask will be seated in the back of the wing.

In addition to the intentional participation of the school community in Mass, the options chosen for Mass will be selected with the purpose of learning in mind and in a focused way that expresses the continuity of our Western Catholic Liturgy with the deep roots of the Western tradition. The scriptural texts for entrance, communion, (and offertory when it is sung) will be used rather than the hymns which often replace these primary texts in parish settings. The children will learn the art of chanting these prayers, beginning with simple settings and growing to the Gregorian chants (English and Latin) as they develop a comfort with them. Other elements will similarly be introduced which may not be familiar to younger generations but are part of the great Catholic treasury of faith. Masses in the newer form will be mostly in English, but will occasionally use some of the principal Latin texts when appropriate. On certain occasions, the Mass will be conducted with most of the prayers in Latin, to help the children be familiar with the common texts of the Mass upon which our English translations are based. In due time, the children will also be introduced in a systematic way to the more ancient form of the Mass, the substance of which dates to the third century or so, and was largely unchanged from the sixth century time of Gregory the Great until the twentieth century.

The project of a Catholic Classical School has its heart in the encounter with the great traditions that have built modern society and bequeathed us the civilization we cherish. The greatest of these is the Mass, and I am excited about these steps forward we will take this year as a learning community of faith.

# Top 10 Things to know

For Returning to Public Mass

## 1 DISPENSATION

The dispensation from the Sunday obligation to attend Mass is extended through September 6, 2020.



## 2 BE PATIENT AND CHARITABLE

The guidelines for returning to Mass may seem extreme to some and too little for others. Please be considerate of how those around you may feel.



## 3 CAPACITY

Parishes are not to exceed 25% capacity.

## 4 STAY INFORMED



Visit your parish website and review all parish communication so you are informed of the specific procedures at your parish.

## 5 WASH YOUR HANDS

Wash your hands for at least 20 seconds (or while praying the Hail Mary) before leaving home.

## 6 SANITIZE

Use hand sanitizer upon entering the church. If able, carry your own sanitizer.

## 7 WEAR A MASK

Masks/face coverings should be worn by those medically able.



## 8 DISTANCE

A distance of six feet should be maintained between persons of different households.

## 9 CONTACT FREE

The Sign of Peace should remain a contact-free gesture.



## 10 HOLY COMMUNION

Keep your mask until after you say "Amen" then adjust to receive the Eucharist.

## RECEIVING HOLY COMMUNION

Holy Communion will be distributed only under the Species of the Sacred Host. You may receive either on the tongue or in the hand. Please remove any masks and gloves as you approach the minister.

Pause at the mark on the floor, the reverence and the verbal exchange should take place 6 feet away: Bow – "The Body of Christ" – "Amen" – then step forward to receive.

If you receive in the hand, please approach the priest (or deacon or EMHC), place your right hand under your left hand creating a sort of throne upon which to receive the Lord. After receiving Jesus in your hand, step to the side, and place the Sacred Host gently in your mouth, making sure to consume the Sacred Host before stepping away. Then, simply replace your mask and return prayerfully to your seat.

If you choose to receive on the tongue please remove your mask before approaching. Bow slightly or kneel as the priest or minister elevates the Sacred Host and says "The Body of Christ." Respond "Amen." Then extend your tongue so that the tip of your tongue is past your bottom lip and hold it steadily there as the Sacred Host is placed on your tongue. If done while not moving one's head or tongue while receiving, the risk of direct contact is minimized. In addition to the reverence given, kneeling also presents a more advantageous angle for the priest or minister to place the Sacred Host on your tongue without contact. After receiving, replace your mask and return prayerfully to your pew.
