#### REFLECT

Readings: Isaiah 42:1–4, 6–7; Psalm 29:1–4, 9–10 Acts 10:34–38; Luke 3:15–16, 21–22

The Liturgy last week revealed the mystery of God's plan—that in Jesus all peoples, symbolized by the Magi, have been made "coheirs" to the blessings promised to Israel. This week, we're shown how we claim our inheritance.

Jesus doesn't submit to John's baptism as a sinner in need of purification. He humbles Himself to pass through Jordan's waters in order to lead a new "exodus"—opening up the promised land of heaven so that all peoples can hear the words pronounced over Jesus today, words once reserved only for Israel and its king: that each of us is a beloved son or daughter of God (see <u>Genesis 22:2</u>; <u>Exodus 4:22</u>; <u>Psalm 2:7</u>).

Jesus is the chosen servant Isaiah prophesies in today's First Reading, anointed with the Spirit to make things right and just on earth. God puts His Spirit upon Jesus to make Him "a covenant of the people," the liberator of the captives, the light to the nations. Jesus, today's Second Reading tells us, is the One long expected in Israel, "anointed . . . with the Holy Spirit and power."

The word messiah means "one anointed" with God's Spirit. King David was "the anointed of the God of Jacob" (see <u>2 Samuel 23:1–17</u>; <u>Psalm 18:51</u>; <u>132:10</u>, <u>17</u>). The prophets taught Israel to await a royal offshoot of David, upon whom the Spirit would rest (see <u>Isaiah 11:1–2</u>; <u>Daniel 9:25</u>).

That's why the crowds are so anxious at the start of today's Gospel. But it isn't John they're looking for. God confirms with His own voice what the angel earlier told Mary: Jesus is the Son of the Most High, come to claim the throne of David forever (see <u>Luke 1:32–33</u>).

In the Baptism that He brings, the voice of God will hover over the waters as a fiery flame, as we sing in today's Psalm. He has sanctified the waters, made them a passageway to healing and freedom—a fountain of new birth and everlasting life.



#### PRAYER FOR THE WEEK

#### Renew your baptismal promises as a family!

As Catholics, we believe there is only one baptism.

However, the Church prescribes that we renew our baptismal promises at our confirmation as well as at the Easter Vigil. You may also make the practice on your own, perhaps on the anniversary of your baptism, or to celebrate a day like today: The Baptism of Christ. It's a great way to recommit our lives to God and to reject Satan and all of his temptations.

Leader: Dear brethren, through the Paschal Mystery we have been buried with Christ in Baptism, that we may walk with him in newness of life.

And so, let us renew the promises of Holy Baptism, which we once renounced Satan and his works and promised to serve God in the holy Catholic Church.

And so I ask you:
Do you reject Satan?

R. I do.

Leader: And all his works?

R. I do.

Leader: And all his empty promises?

R. I do.

Leader: Do you believe in God, the Father Almighty, creator of heaven and earth?

R. I do.

Leader: Do you believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord, who was born of the Virgin Mary was crucified, died, and was buried, rose from the dead, and is now seated at the right hand of the Father?

R. I do.

Leader: Do you believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy Catholic church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and life everlasting?

R. I do.

Leader: God, the all-powerful Father of our Lord Jesus Christ has given us a new birth by water and the Holy Spirit, and forgiven all our sins. May he also keep us faithful to our Lord Jesus Christ for ever and ever.

R. Amen.

When you're done with these prayers, you may bless those gathered and your home with Holy Water.

#### SAINT OF THE WEEK

#### St. Anthony the Abbot

St. Anthony the Abbot is the famous father of monasticism in the Church—he took the Gospel literally and gave everything away to seek God in prayer.

Anthony was born in Egypt in 251, and when his parents died when he was about 20 years old, he assumed responsibility for the family's 300 acres and for the care of his sister.

One day at Mass, he heard the words of Jesus proclaimed from this Gospel passage: "If you wish to be perfect, go, sell what you have and give to the poor, and you will have treasure in heaven. Then come, follow me" (Mt 19:21). The passage moved him to action, and he walked out of the Church at that moment and gave away all of his property except what he and his sister needed for sustenance.

Later, he heard Jesus' words from this passage: "Do not worry about tomorrow; tomorrow will take care of itself. Sufficient for a day is its own evil" (Mt 6:34). He immediately gave away the rest of their property and entrusted his sister to the care of a convent. He began a simple life on the outskirts of town, embracing only prayer, fasting, and manual labor. When he was thirty-five, he moved even further out of town to live alone in an abandoned fort. He received rations of bread only a few times a year and spoke to people through a crack in the wall. By this time, he was becoming well-known for his faithfulness and wisdom and people sought him out for counsel and healing.

Feeling disturbed by the crowds who were seeking him out, he went deep into the desert, where he lived by a small spring of water. His life took on a rhythm of prayer and work, a pattern that continues to sustain monastic communities today. Soon, hundreds of people followed his example by going into the desert to live an ascetical life of prayer, and they began to loosely congregate into communities.

Anthony died at the age of one hundred and five.




