

### MARRIAGE ARRANGEMENTS

The policy of the Archdiocese requires a minimum six-month preparation period for marriage, during which the couple meets with the priest or deacon and participates in the Archdiocesan marriage preparation program. Engaged couples should telephone the Parish Center no less than six months prior to the anticipated date of marriage for an appointment with the priest or deacon.

### FUNERAL ARRANGEMENTS

The parish priest is to be contacted before the family makes any arrangements with the funeral director. Family members are also asked to meet with the priest to prepare for the Funeral liturgy.

## Uptown Canticle by Father Michael

Every three years Archbishop Aymond consults the clergy of each deanery in appointing a dean who represents him within the deanery. The Archbishop appoints the dean to this part-time position for a three-year term renewable for a second term at the discretion of the Archbishop. In June 2020, Archbishop Aymond called to offer me the position of Dean for the Uptown Deanery. He informed me that I received the most votes from the priests of the deanery. I was hoping to reach retirement in time to avoid ever having to serve in this position. This additional responsibility does not include an increase in salary. My letter of appointment is printed in this bulletin. Fortunately, in May 2020 I offered my resignation as chaplain of De La Salle High School after completing seven years of service.

The role of the dean includes a variety of functions. Those functions include but not limited to the following: promoting and coordinating common pastoral activity within the deanery including the areas of liturgy, administration and the priests personal spiritual renewal and continuation formation in ministry; seeing to it that the priests of the deanery diligently perform their duties and lead lives in harmony with ordained ministry; visiting the parishes of the deanery in accord with archdiocesan guidelines; installing new pastors in the parishes of the deanery and convening and presiding and encouraging attendance at regularly scheduled Deanery meetings.

The clergy of the Uptown Deanery usually meet on the third Wednesday of every other month beginning in September. St. Francis of Assisi will be the host parish for these meetings. We gather for a fellowship luncheon followed by a discussion of issues and concerns of our deanery and the archdiocese. The Council of Deans meet with Archbishop Aymond four times a year. My first meeting will be September 8, 2020. As I begin this new aspect of my priestly life and ministry, please remember me in prayer that I may serve the Archbishop and the priests and laity of the Uptown Deanery to the best of my ability.

I also want to inform you of another appointment by Archbishop Aymond. He has appointed Deacon Tom Kratochvil to serve in St. Angela Merici Parish in Metairie. Two of the deacons in that parish are beyond retirement age. Deacon Tom will be able to share pastoral ministry with his wife Diane in their home parish. We pray that God will bless him abundantly as he begins his diaconal ministry there on August 1, 2020. No news about a deacon to be assigned at our parish. The Permanent Diaconate Office assures me we are at the top of the list.

After three weeks of hearing Jesus preach and teach in parables, we now move into the next chapter of Matthew's gospel. This weekend we encounter Jesus as he performs the miracle of the multiplication of the loaves and fishes.

Bread is such a simple but profound sign for the Eucharist. It does not occur naturally, but requires human effort. Grain must be crushed to form flour. The baker mixes flour with water or some other liquid to form dough and adding yeast to the dough to make it rise. Then the baking begins and we finally have a loaf of bread, sustenance that will fill us up and last. The human effort required to make bread is significant, and it involves time, all of which perhaps explains why so many of us simply buy bread today. Even so, there are not many things that taste better than a good loaf of homemade bread.

When we consider that Jesus multiplied the loaves so that all could eat, we recall that he acted as the prophet Elisha of old. He also foreshadowed his own Last Supper and the Eucharistic gift he would leave his followers. As a result, even today we take bread, bless it, break it, and give it. In so doing we celebrate and consume Jesus himself, who was broken for us and given to us. As the Eucharist sustains us on our earthly journey, we live the paschal mystery.

We are not to hoard the bread of life or the word of God, but instead we are to invite all we meet to some to the feast. We should not be concerned with scarcity. At the table of the Lord, we find abundance and more than enough to satisfy the hunger of all.

We invite you to join us for the celebration of the Eucharist this weekend by making a reservation for the feast.

For those parishioners we cannot accommodate in the church or who are fearful to gather with us, Archbishop Aymond has given permission to distribute Holy Communion after mass outdoors. He strongly suggested that we not give Holy Communion to people in vehicles. He recommends that we do so outside where people can form a communion line and observe social distancing. Therefore, this weekend after each mass, weather permitting, I will be available to distribute Holy Communion in the front lawn of the rectory. I suggest that as you approach me to receive the Body of Christ you pray the Lord's Prayer, the Our Father.

Please remember that Archbishop Aymond has dispensed the people of the Archdiocese from the obligation to attend Sunday Mass. If someone is vulnerable and not feeling well, that should not celebrate Mass in church with other people. Baptisms, Weddings and funerals is limited to 100 worshipers. This number will increase gradually.

We will continue to live stream the 9:30 am Mass on Sunday from church. Daily mass in church. Monday, Wednesday through Friday 8:30 am and Tuesday at 6:00 pm. No reservation is necessary for daily mass. We will no longer live stream daily mass.

***As we enter the hurricane season, let us implore the Intercession of Our Lady of Prompt Succor to hasten to help us and our patron St. Francis of Assisi to make us instruments of the Lord's peace.***

## New Sanctuary Furniture

In preparation for the one hundredth anniversary of the dedication of St. Francis of Assisi Church on April 24, 2021 the Pastoral and Finance Councils approved in 2019 the purchase of sanctuary furnishings to complement the altar and pulpit. The new presider's chair, two deacon chairs and a credence table are pictured here.

We selected Thomas Bruno as the designer and craftsman. Thomas is a native of New Orleans and a third generation artist. He began his training in his father's workshop on Calhoun St. at ten years old. He learned to fabricate and appreciate English and American 18th and 19th century furniture. He expanded his sense of design and technical skill by making fresh interpretations of Art Nouveau, 18th century French and Art Deco furniture. To fuel his growing fascination with sculpture, he established the fine arts foundry where he continues to cast sculptures in bronze. In 1997 he was selected by the National Sculpture Society for the national exhibit Sculptures and Architects on Furniture in NYC. He has since been engaged for numerous commissions, including many prominent public works. Since 2000, he has been involved almost exclusively in sculpture.



He chose the wood Sapele as the material for this furniture. Sapele is an economically-important wood to the continent of Africa, and one that continues to grow in popularity in other industries beyond veneer mills, here in the US. Its color can range from a light golden brown to a darker reddish - or pinkish-brown. The color will darken as the wood ages. Sapele is renowned for its sometimes quite dramatic figuring. It also possesses a beautiful natural luster.

### Money Can't Buy Happiness

Most people say they could live comfortably if they had just a little more income. That would allow them to buy the pleasures they seek. Surrounded by ads that urge us to buy, we learn over and over again the message that what we have is inadequate, and that money will buy happiness.

Isaiah begs to differ. The joyful passage from the prophet that talks about income says money has nothing to do with happiness. Heeding God's Word will produce all the bliss in the world. Through the prophet, God questions those who spend their wages on what fails to satisfy. It takes no money to hear and heed God's Word.

Throughout the Scriptures, God asks people to care for the needy, to think less of themselves and more for their neighbor.

The money we would spend on many of the things we think will make us happy could be given to the poor for the things they need simply to live.

Think about the purchases you made this week. What do they say about your values? How do they express what you think will make you happy? Have you used your time to find satisfaction in God's Word?

### Love Unfailing

Love is supposed to last forever, so it is horrifying when it does not. When we love someone, we offer all we have and are. We give our free time, because love enjoys leisure. We share our money, because love is priceless. We reveal our inmost thoughts, because love grows in intimacy. We take great risks when we love. We risk sharing our goodness and shortcomings. True love accepts what is imperfect because the heart is always good.

Sometimes love fails. We stop loving the person we loved, or the one we loved stops loving us. Imperfections come to light. Differences of opinion cannot be resolved. People who confused the warmth of love with love itself discover deceit in the other person or in the cravings of their own heart. The loss of love is a painful lesson in betrayal, misjudgment, and sorrow.

The question St. Paul asks the Romans, then, is fraught with risk. "What will separate us from the love of Christ?" Oh, my. Is this possible? We know from experience that love may depart. In human love, many things may cause separation: political opinions, selfish actions, lost opportunities for mutual sharing, or the attraction of another person. Love is strong, but other forces can be stronger.

Not so with Christ. Nothing can separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord. God's love remains perfect and lasts forever, no matter where our heart bends. We sometimes love God less, but God never loves us less. God's love lasts forever.

## General Guidelines for Mass Attendance:

### To sign up to attend Mass:

**Entering & Leaving:** All entrances are open. Church pews are marked and roped off. When Mass has ended, please do not gather in groups outside of church or in the parking lot. Continue to maintain social distancing.

**During Mass:** **Wear a mask during Mass aside from receiving Communion.** Be mindful of social distancing and maintain 6 feet of distance from others at all times. For our weekend Masses, a worship aid will be available at the entrances. After Mass, leave it in your pew. You may place your regular offering for support and other collections in the baskets in the center aisle and side doors. The Offertory procession is omitted. We can express the sign of peace by means of a smile and/or nod of the head.

**Reception of Holy Communion:** Bring hand sanitizer to use before receiving Communion. During the distribution of Holy Communion, form a single line and observe the social distancing blue lines on the floor of the aisles. We ask everyone to receive Holy Communion in the hand rather than on the tongue. You will receive the Body of Christ in the form of bread only. When approaching the priest or Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion, place your hand flatly atop the other and fully extend your arm toward the priest or minister who will place the Host on your hand in a manner to avoid any contact with your hand.
