

Engaged couples should telephone the Parish Center no less than six months prior to the anticipated date of marriage for an appointment with the priest or deacon.

Uptown Canticle

Come by the Rectory after 9:30 & 11:30 Masses for Donuts & Refreshments

As we enter the season of Lent, we recognize a shift in the way we are called to live – more intentionally. We focus on the particulars of our lives. What we do well? Where do we fall short? This is the season the Church provides to focus on such questions as we continue to perfect ourselves on the journey to our heavenly home. How can we do this?

Liturgically: During Lent, the Church asks us to show restraint in liturgy. The *Gloria* is omitted during this penitential season & use of the organ is limited. For this reason, we will be chanting more as the organ is not necessary for this style of music. We have chosen the traditional *Agnus Dei* and *Sanctus* which many church parishes use during this season and has been done here at St. Francis in the past. The tune and words for these chants can be found in the front of the green hymnal.

For the First Sunday in Lent, the Church asks us to enter the season with the Litany of the Saints imploring the saints to assist us as we journey together toward the Cross & Resurrection of Christ. We will be singing this as our Opening Hymn throughout next weekend.

Personally: Lent is a time of purification & growth. It is a time of taking on penances to discipline ourselves and help us to focus on our faith and God's calling in our lives. I hope all of you are choosing penances which will assist your spiritual growth.

Sometimes you may have heard it said to 'do something' for Lent and not 'give something up.' The Church has always asked that we give something up, but why not do both? We can do something for others while also sacrificing something as a way of linking our sacrifice to that of Christ. Jesus himself gives perfect examples of penitential practices which we can take on:

Prayer: Add some prayer or Scripture reading to your day. It does not have to be long prayers. Do what you can to open yourself to the will of God and giving Him the opportunity to speak to you.

Fasting: The Church requires some fasting and abstinence during the Lenten season, but perhaps we can add more – not because we want to lose

weight, but because we want to discipline ourselves and develop virtue. Perhaps we can give up unhealthy habits which we want to quit. This is the perfect time. God's grace will be with you (but the temptations are also greater during Lent, so be careful!).

Almsgiving: By almsgiving here, I do not necessarily mean that one should give more money. If you feel so moved, great! But almsgiving also involves service, giving of yourself in service to others. Perhaps volunteer more in a charity you respect and have always wanted to support. Pick up the phone and call loved ones or friends who may be having difficult times. These are other ways of living out almsgiving in our lives.

Next weekend, our Respect Life Committee will hand

out baby bottles from Woman's New Life Clinic. Please return bottles during Lent with donations to help women in unplanned pregnancies. Your gift funds professional counseling for mothers & fathers in unplanned pregnancies, post-abortion care for the most wounded & hope for those considering abortion. You can also scan the QR code to make a donation.





Whatever you choose to do, keep to it. If you fail, do not beat yourselves up. Don't let the perfect be the enemy of the good. Start all over again! Try! God sees and rewards the effort. You have not failed ... you are merely imperfect in your penances just as all of us are.

Also, note that Sunday is never a day of penance, but is a celebration of Easter. Allow Sundays to be a nice reprieve from the penances if you wish. This may make fulfilling your penances a little easier.

Through it all, know that I, as your pastor, and the St. Francis community are with you in prayer. Let me know if I can be of any help or provide any guidance during this holy season. My prayers continue to be with you.




