RESPECT LIFE SUNDAY

This weekend (October 1, 2017), the Church throughout the United States celebrates Respect Life
Sunday. This year's theme, "Be Not Afraid" which reminds us that we are never alone in the work we do to foster a culture of life, that all things are caught up with God.
Respect Life Sunday was created in 1972 through the National Conference of Catholic Bishops who instituted a "week of prayer and study" focusing on contemporary threats to human life. The goals of the program are to:

- Proclaim the sanctity and value of human life as a gift from God and the foundation of human dignity.
- Oppose and ultimately do away with all that destroys or endangers human life.
- Correct those situations that diminish human life itself or limit the appropriate enjoyment of life.
- Support or encourage the development of whatever sustains, nourishes or provides for the proper enjoyment of life.
- Place emphasis on and create advocacy for whatever meets particular needs of families and individuals.

The Church strives to promote life in four main areas:

- (1) **Education** on issues that threaten human life;
- (2) **Outreach** to assist pregnant woman in all situations, assist families through adoption/foster care, and care for the elderly and dying;
- (3) **Public Policy** to coordinate and encourage advocacy on national, state and local levels to promote laws that defend and protect human life; and
- (4) **Prayer** among individuals and communities to foster a culture of life.

What can I do?

- Pray for life and give thanks for the gift of life
- Learn more about respect life issues and what the Church teaches
- Support the Annual March for Life in Washington, D.C. on January 19, 2018
- Donate blood
- Bring items for babies and new mothers to be donated to Choice One (on Rt. 1)—items can be placed off the front lobby of the church next to the food items.

Director of Religious Education

The Church of Saint Ann in Lawrenceville, NJ is seeking a full-time Director of Religious Education. The primary responsibility of the Director is to plan, direct, implement, oversee, communicate, and evaluate the parish Religious Education Program and Family-Centered Generations of Faith Program (GOF) for the approximately 550 parish children from Grade level K through 8 and approximately 150 parents who participate in the GOF Program.

This individual will be responsible for: establishing the curriculum for parish Religious Education and Generations of Faith: supervising the recruitment, orientation and ongoing formation of catechists; coordinating sacramental preparation programs in the parish—First Penance, First Eucharist, and Confirmation; lead parent programs/meetings for sacramental preparation; act as a liaison between the parish and Diocesan Office of Evangelization &Catechesis; coordinating the initiation process for unbaptized children and/or children baptized in another ecclesial community; participating as the parish representative for the TRED meetings; collaborating and routinely communicating with the pastor and/or delegate to discuss matters relating to catechesis; managing the Religious Education/GOF staff which includes a part-time secretary; working collaboratively with the parish Safe Environment Coordinator to ensure that catechists, aides, and other volunteers who assist in the program are in compliance with the Diocesan Office for Child and Youth Protection; working collaboratively with parish Business Manager to establish and track Religious Education/GOF budget and St. Ann School Principal in matters that pertain to the school and catechesis; Coordinate Children's Liturgy of the Word at Sunday Mass; Coordinate Liturgical Rites for parish sacramental programs during weekend Mass; parish liaison to Saint Ann School in matters related to catechesis and sacramental preparation.

JOB QUALIFICATIONS: This position requires weekend and evening work; a minimum of a Master's degree in Religious Education, Theology, or related field (or enrollment in a program and working toward a degree); administrative experience in the field of catechesis; good organizational skills; the ability to communicate well and work with parents; possess computer proficiency in word processing and electronic communication. This individual must also be a practicing Roman Catholic in good standing.


