

(October 1, 2016 to October 5, 2017)


Their names have been inscribed in our Parish Book of Remembrance.



### **Director of Religious Education**

The Church of Saint Ann in Lawrenceville, NJ is seeking a full-time Director of Religious Education. The primary responsibility of the Director is to plan, direct, implement, oversee, communicate, and evaluate the parish Religious Education Program and Family-Centered Generations of Faith Program (GOF) for the approximately 550 parish children from Grade level K through 8 and approximately 150 parents who participate in the GOF Program.

This individual will be responsible for: establishing the curriculum for parish Religious Education and Generations of Faith: supervising the recruitment, orientation and ongoing formation of catechists: coordinating sacramental preparation programs in the parish—First Penance, First Eucharist, and Confirmation; lead parent programs/meetings for sacramental preparation; act as a liaison between the parish and Diocesan Office of Evangelization & Catechesis; coordinating the initiation process for unbaptized children and/or children baptized in another ecclesial community; participating as the parish representative for the TRED meetings; collaborating and routinely communicating with the pastor and/or delegate to discuss matters relating to catechesis; managing the Religious Education/GOF staff which includes a part-time secretary; working collaboratively with the parish Safe Environment Coordinator to ensure that catechists, aides, and other volunteers who assist in the program are in compliance with the Diocesan Office for Child and Youth Protection; working collaboratively with parish Business Manager to establish and track Religious Education/GOF budget and St. Ann School Principal in matters that pertain to the school and catechesis; Coordinate Children's Liturgy of the Word at Sunday Mass; Coordinate Liturgical Rites for parish sacramental programs during weekend Mass; parish liaison to Saint Ann School in matters related to catechesis and sacramental preparation.

JOB QUALIFICATIONS: This position requires weekend and evening work; a minimum of a Master's degree in Religious Education, Theology, or related field (or enrollment in a program and working toward a degree); administrative experience in the field of catechesis; good organizational skills; the ability to communicate well and work with parents; possess computer proficiency in word processing and electronic communication. This individual must also be a practicing Roman Catholic in good standing.

### CREATION SUNDAY: THE CHURCH AND THE ENVIRONMENT

NEW

Next weekend, October 28/29, Saint Ann Green Team Ministry will sponsor "CREATION SUNDAY" in commemoration of the second anniversary of *Laudato Si*, Pope Francis' encyclical on the environment. Bishop David O'Connell recently wrote, "Pope Francis is simply putting before our minds and hearts the world that God created and our responsibility as part of creation to care for and protect the earth as our 'common home', to be stewards of creation." The Bishops of the United States remind us that Pope Francis has declared the care of our common home is itself to be recognized as a work of mercy toward the poor, the unborn, future generations, and all of creation.

Recent decisions to withdraw from the Paris Climate Agreement and to repeal the Clean Power Plan present strong challenges to the Church's teachings on the environment. "CREATION SUNDAY" will be a day of prayer and reflection on our Christian responsibility to meet these challenges and be good stewards of creation. It will also be a day of action for the earth and for future generations who will inherit the earth from us. After Mass, we invite you to visit the Green Team Ministry table and find out more about the concrete actions we, as individuals and as a parish, can take to meet the problems and challenges of global climate change and ways we can live out the social mission of the Church as flowers of Jesus.



### **Trout in the Classroom at Saint Ann School**

Saint Ann School has begun their first year in the Trout in the Classroom (TiC) environmental education program run by the NJ Division of Fish and Wildlife and its partner, Trout Unlimited. This is a program to educate students about coldwater conservation. This year we are raising Rainbow Trout. Students will raise trout from eggs, monitor tank water quality, engage in stream habitat study, learn to appreciate water resources, begin to foster a conservation ethic, and grow to understand ecosystems.

Egg Day, which was the day that we received the trout eggs, was October 4. To prep for Egg Day, students learned about the importance of having an air pump, water filter, chiller, water pump, and insulation around the tank. There are a number of water quality measures that must be checked on a weekly basis to make sure the water is clean for the fish to grow. They also made posters to publicize that "The Trout Are Coming!" When we received the eggs, eighth graders had to pick out the dead eggs from the living eggs, before putting the eggs into their basket. So far, we can see two black spots which are the developing eyes! Even though we received over a hundred eggs, there are a number of factors and reasons why most of the trout will not survive until they become fingerlings, which are about two inches long. That said, we are hoping to have at least one survive by May.

In May, students at Saint Ann School will have the opportunity to release the lucky few rainbow trout that survive into a Mingamahone Brook at Allaire State Park, which was one of a selected number of places in NJ that the Rainbow Trout may be released.
