Join Parish Action On Climate Change

On Creation Sunday many in the parish signed a petition asking our State legislators to work closely with the new Governor in passing legislation that protects the environment. When the Trump Administration recently moved to withdraw from the Paris Climate Agreement and to repeal the Clean Power Plan, the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops issued a statement that these decisions are a "troubling approach in addressing climate change and place at risk many people, including the poor who can least bear the consequences of our inaction."

If you did not have the chance to sign the Creation Sunday petition, the Green Team Ministry encourages you to contact our State representatives and ask them to support the following:

- 1) New Jersey's reentry into the Regional Greenhouse Gas Initiative, as a way to cap carbon emissions and reduce global warming.
- **2)** New Jersey joining other states in the U.S. Climate Alliance, a bipartisan group committed to meeting goals of the Paris Climate Agreement. A recent study has shown that the United States can keep on track to meet its climate targets if enough states adopt ambitious climate and clean energy policies.

Look for gifts made locally - visit craft fairs and boutiques.

Choose gifts made from recycled sources.

Go battery free in gift selection.

For each gift of clothing plan to recycle one.

Hand design wrapping paper using brown grocery bags or fabric. Avoid using foil wrapping which is difficult to recycle.

Give back to nature:

Plant a tree to replace the one taken for decoration or use a living tree to replant.
