Diocesan Parish Counseling Services:

Parishioners have access to short term counseling (up to 6 sessions) at locations throughout the Diocese. The program was developed by **Catholic Charities** and the Diocese of Trenton. 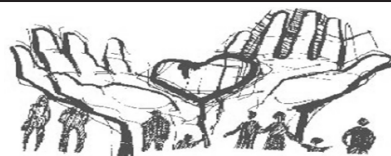

Knights of Columbus Sponsor **MERCER HIGH SCHOOL** **Spring/Easter Food Drive**

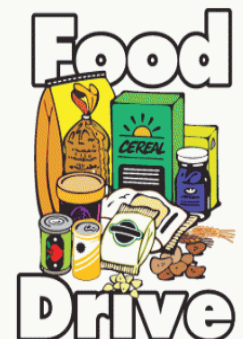

Lenten Spirituality for the Care of the Earth

In the weeks of Lent the Green Team Ministry will offer a series of reflections. These reflections were developed by the Passionist Center for Spirit and Earth, and they focus on how to use the traditional Lenten spiritual disciplines of prayer, fasting and almsgiving to protect God's creation, embrace Gospel justice, and nurture spiritual fulfillment.

Week Two -- FOOD: Eating is a moral act

The daily bread provided by God comes directly from the Earth. The act of eating unites us to the soil, water and animals like nothing else. All these gifts of God's creation are included in our food. Every purchase of food and every act of eating becomes a moral decision. When making food choices, we need to consider the manner in which crops are planted and fertilized, the method used to raise animals, and the distance food has to be shipped.

While our agricultural system produces an abundance of food, it also has a downside. Chemical fertilizers and pesticides contaminate the soil. Animal waste from factory-farmed meat pollutes the water. Transporting food over long distances pollutes the air.

Food is not only central to survival. It is a sacramental gift of God's grace and providence. Our Lenten fast this week will aim to develop a greater sensitivity to how our food choices can honor, rather than harm, God's creation.

ACTION SUGGESTION: Abstain from meat this week. Pound for pound, livestock requires more water, land and energy than grains and vegetables. It takes 145 gallons of water to produce one loaf of bread, but up to 1500 gallons to produce one pound of hamburger. Eating lower on the food chain by eating less meat and more grains and vegetables is a significant way to lessen our impact on God's creation.

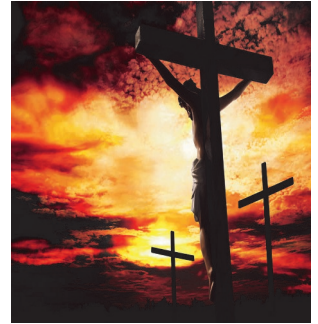

The *Scrutinies* are rites of conversion and repentance. These very special rites are celebrated on the middle three Sundays of Lent (third, fourth and fifth Sundays of Lent), at liturgies where the Elect are present. The Elect are those in our midst who are preparing for Baptism. Part of their journey to the font is that they have been received among us, at the Rite of Acceptance, and they have been enrolled in the Book of the Elect in the Rite of Election.

Even if these rites are not celebrated at the liturgy we attend, it can be wonderful to reflect upon the journey these Elect are making during Lent, as an inspiration and source of renewal for us in our own journey. These are ancient rites and they may, at first, seem strange to us. But they are profoundly rooted in our human experience. We need to examine (scrutinize) how we are, the areas of our lives where we are tempted, or seriously sin - in what we do and what we fail to do. We need healing and the strength that can come from the support of our sisters and brothers.
