

Passion/Palm Sunday

Next Sunday we celebrate Palm Sunday of the Lord's Passion. The Liturgy next week has three distinct parts: the commemoration of the Lords' entrance into Jerusalem, the liturgy of the Word, and the liturgy of the Eucharist.

We will gather in the Gallery of Light for the commemoration of the Lord's entrance into Jerusalem. Please plan to arrive a little earlier for this celebration. Palm branches will be distributed before the celebration and blessed in the Gallery of Light.

Everyone is invited to wear RED - the liturgical color of the day.

Holy Thursday Collection

GOSPEL Fifth Sunday of Lent April 7, 2019

John 8:1-11

Jesus went to the Mount of Olives. But early in the morning he arrived again in the temple area, and all the people started coming to him, and he sat down and taught them. Then the scribes and the Pharisees brought a woman who had been caught in adultery and made her stand in the middle. They said to him, "Teacher, this woman was caught in the very act of committing adultery. Now in the law, Moses commanded us to stone such women. So what do you say?" They said this to test him, so that they could have some charge to bring against him. Jesus bent down and began to write on the ground with his finger. But when they continued asking him, he straightened up and said to them, "Let the one among you who is without sin be the first to throw a stone at her.' Again he bent down and wrote on the ground. And in response, they went away one by one, beginning with the elders. So he was left alone with the woman before him. Then Jesus straightened up and said to her, Woman, where are they? Has no one condemned you?" She replied, "No one, sir." Then Jesus said, "Neither do I condemn you. Go, and from now on do not sin any more."

REFLECTION

Today we celebrate the third and final scrutiny for those who will be initiated into the Church at Easter. Baptism liberates us from the bondage of sin and gives us a share in the promise of redemption. Like Lazarus, untied from the bands that held his body in the tomb, we are given new life in the Lord. As we celebrate together today, may we consider the parts of us that need to die to sin so that we may live anew in Christ.



GARDEN REVITALIZATION 2019

You and those you love can be a part of our parish Grandparents' Garden, the Garden of Saint Ann, our patron, and her spouse Saint Joachim—parents of Mary, grandparents of Jesus. The garden is a place where people young and old visit, rest, and pray for themselves, their parents, grandparents, children, or grandchildren. It is a place to remember some important lessons passed on to us by those who have gone before us. The statues that grace the garden are original works of art created by Fr. Leonard Carrieri, M.SS.CC.



We are in the process of revitalizing the Grandparents' Garden by beautifying the plant beds, reconditioning and re-setting the benches, putting a new patina on the statues, and expanding the hardscape.
