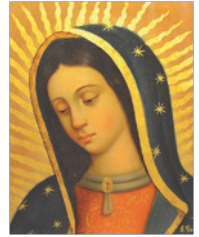

Our Lady of Guadalupe Traveling Torch Arrives at the Church of Saint Ann on November 16, 2019



At the 5:00 PM Vigil Mass

The traveling torch is a tradition that began more than a half century ago to honor Our Lady of Guadalupe, the Patroness of all the Americas. Torches were lit and sent forth from St. Robert Bellarmine Co-Cathedral in Freehold on October 26, 2019. They will travel to the many parishes of the Diocese of Trenton throughout the whole month of November. **The Church of Saint Ann will receive the Torch on Saturday evening, November 16 at the 5:00 p.m. Vigil Mass.**

November 16, 2019/ 5:00 p.m. / Church / Guadalupe Torch arrives at Saint Ann.

Celebrate the Torch arrival with a festive entrance/procession, including special prayers and music. The Torch and image of Our Lady of Guadalupe will remain in the Church for the week.

November 18/ 8:30 a.m. and 1:30 p.m. Miraculous Medal Novena

Miraculous Medal Novena (8:30 a.m. and 1:30 p.m.) will include prayers to Our Lady of Guadalupe.

November 19 / 12:00 p.m. Adoration / 6:00 p.m.

Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament and special prayers at the 3:00 to 4:00 p.m. hour to honor our Lady of Guadalupe.

November 21 / 7:30 p.m. An Evening of Prayer and Reflection in the Presence of the Guadalupe Torch

The Torch will be here at Saint Ann Parish (in our Sanctuary) from November 16 through November 23. On Thursday, November 21 at 7:00 p.m., in the Church, in honor of Our Lady of Guadalupe, we will take some time (about 45 minutes) to reflect and pray with the story of Guadalupe, Juan Diego, and the Tilma. All are welcome! Bring your prayers of petition as we lift them up to Our Lady. We ask, "What message does the story of Guadalupe carry for you today?" All participants will receive a Novena to Our Lady of Guadalupe Tri-Fold.

In honor of Our Lady of Guadalupe, we will reflect on the story of Juan Diego, the Tilma, and bring our prayers of petition before God in the presence of the Guadalupe Torch.

December 7 / Cathedral of St. Mary. Procession and Pilgrimage and with Mass with Bishop O'Connell in Honor of Our Lady of Guadalupe.

At the end of the parish visitations, on the first Saturday in December, the Guadalupe Torches will all come together again in the "Walk With Us" Guadalupe Procession where the whole Diocesan community will gather and escort them home to St. Mary's Cathedral in Trenton.

33rd Sunday in Ordinary Time

November 17, 2019

Luke 21:5-19

While some people were speaking about how the temple was adorned with costly stones and votive offerings, Jesus said, "All that you see here--the days will come when there will not be left a stone upon another stone that will not be thrown down."

Then they asked him, "Teacher, when will this happen? And what sign will there be when all these things are about to happen?" He answered "See that you not be deceived, for many will come in my name, saying, 'I am he,' and 'The time has come.' Do not follow them! When you hear of wars and insurrections, do not be terrified for such things must happen first, but it will not immediately be the end." Then he said to them, "Nation will rise against nation, and kingdom against kingdom. There will be powerful earthquakes, famines, and plagues from place to place; and awesome sights and mighty signs will come from the sky.

"Before all this happens, however, they will seize and persecute you, they will hand you over to the synagogues and to prisons, and they will have you led before kings and Governors because of my name. It will lead to your giving testimony.

Remember, you are not to prepare your defense beforehand, for I myself shall give you a wisdom in speaking that all your adversaries will be powerless to resist or refute. You will even be handed over by parents, brothers, relatives, and friends, and they will put some of you to death. You will be hated by all because of my name, but not a hair on your head will be destroyed. By your perseverance you will secure your lives."

REFLECTION

Today we will hear of horrifying signs that may portend the end of the world: earthquakes and famines, wars and persecutions. Even though these warnings were given two thousand years ago or more and the world has not yet ended, they can still spur us to action now. As we celebrate Mass today, let us look at our lives and consider what we should change and then resolve to do so now.

Annual Thanksgiving Meals on Wheels Service Project

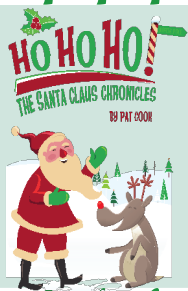

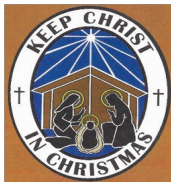
