#### A MESSAGE FROM FR. LEANDRO 'Lines' DELA CRUZ

Dear Parishioners and Friends,

In human life, triumph and tragedy, success and failure, the sublime and the ridiculous are often separated only by a hair's breadth. We taste the heady wine of success only to discover that at the bottom of the cup there is the bitter taste of some disappointments. One moment we feel we are creating something masterful before the world and the next we suspect we may be making a fool of ourselves.

This Sunday's Gospel shows us that this intertwining of triumph and failures happened even among the disciples, with Peter. On the one hand Peter declares with confidence a breakthrough in understanding Jesus: "You are the Messiah the Son of God". Jesus tells Peter: "It is not flesh and blood which have revealed this to you but my Father." Yet, flushed with the excitement of this discovery, Peter must also learn the limitations of his understanding. In almost the same breath, Jesus rebuked Peter: "Get away from me Satan!"

The harshness of Jesus' reaction is almost stunning. Peter, bearing the new and mysterious dignity that his name confers on him, now hears himself addressed as "Satan" and be dismissed as brusquely as if he were in fact the prince of darkness.

Jesus did not hold back. Truth has to be said. Honesty prevails, even if it hurts. The intent was not to hurt but to straighten and correct a loved one. Peter must have been hurt. But he has learned the truth and through that same truth, Peter became a better person. Let us allow the truth to transform us into better people.

I am very thankful to all of you for your continued support to our parish. Due to suspension of Masses for almost three months and currently with reduced number of Masses, it is the diocesan wide expectation that parishes would only recover about 20% - 40% of the Sunday Collections. However, our parish is doing about roughly 60% - 70% of our Sunday collection. Your generosity to your parish is greatly felt during these trying times.

Also, I would like to acknowledge the help we receive from those who responded positively to the Finance Council's appeal to defray the unexpected cost of a new chiller/air conditioning (HVAC) in the FDC that cost us \$150K. I appeal to those who are financially able, kindly help your parish in this unexpected project. I am ever grateful to you my dear parishioners.

Please know that our annual pastoral and financial report will be available by the second week of September if not earlier. The report will be published on our parish website where it will be posted as we are not yet allowed to distribute paper materials.

School enrollment is ongoing till the first week of September. In-person classes, virtual and hybrid are offered. We are experiencing a good number of enrollment this year. We also have a waitlist of students from Pre-K to 8<sup>th</sup>. Enrollment is still open for those who are interested. Please see at the bottom the Principal's video on how in-person classes will be handled. Health and safety of our students is highly prioritized.

John and Lihn, two fellows from the Center for Faith and Justice Fellowship program, will be running our Rider University Campus Ministry and our Parish Youth Ministry. We look forward to a good kick-off for this fiscal year especially with the youth program. We thank these two wonderful and very capable individuals for taking over these ministries.

Prayer is our stronghold. Our adoration on Tuesdays and Thursdays is ongoing. May I encourage you to come and commit yourself to prayer. Kindly call the parish office to be on regular schedule.

Please remember in your prayers our brothers and sisters in the path of hurricanes Pablo and Laura. Also, we pray for those affected by the wildfire. Lives and property are lost due to these catastrophes. Please pray for their safety, security, health in mind and body.

#### A few basic reasons to join RCIA...

- 1) You're interested in becoming Catholic.

- 1) you're not Catholic; or,
- 2) after your Catholic baptism your family never enrolled you in preparation to complete your Sacraments of Initiation.

Someone who loves you has encouraged you to consider becoming Catholic or complete your sacraments of Initiation.

You have nothing to lose and everything to gain.

We minister to adults, forming them in the Catholic faith. All participants seeking to receive sacraments agree to meet various requirements on this walk of faith toward becoming full members of the Catholic Church, which is customarily celebrated at an Easter Vigil

#### UPDATE FROM THE FINANCE COUNCIL

Dear Parishioners of the Church of Saint Ann.

Greetings of Peace!

As public celebration of Mass and the sacraments resumed, the Finance Council and I wish to share with you that during the closure of our church, it was necessary to contract for major work on our HVAC system in the Church.

On February 24, 2020 the original HVAC unit installed at the time of the FDC construction broke down beyond repair. The old unit lasted 16 years and more than exceeded its working life. With summer time approaching and a lead time to contend with, we ordered a new high efficiency HVAC unit which was installed on June 25, 2020. The cost of replacement was nearly \$150,000.

Our HVAC has continually caused us significant annual repairs. This new unit will continue to offer a comfortable place of worship and prayer throughout the year. While no official capital campaign is presently planned, I am most grateful to anyone able to help in defraying these unexpected expenses.

I acknowledge your generosity during this most difficult time, but if possible asking those you can to consider making a one-time donation to offset this unforeseen replacement cost.

## **Catholic Principles of Migration**

Immigration remains a critical issue in the United States. Aware of the high polarization around the immigration debate, it is good for us as Catholics to stay educated and in focus on this issue. As a reminder, we list below, the Catholic Principles of Migration, rooted in the Gospel, and found scripted in the pastoral letter concerning migration from the Catholic Bishops of Mexico and the United States: Strangers No Longer; Together on the Journey of Hope.

- Persons have the right to find opportunities in their homeland.
- Persons have the right to migrate to support themselves in their families.
- Sovereign nations have the right to control their borders.
- Refugees and asylum seekers should be afforded protection.
- The human dignity and human right of undocumented migrants should be respected.

Below also is listed an article of interest reminding us that we are called to live in communion. There is no Us and Them, but one family of God.

Here at St. Ann's, we shall observe the following Guidelines for safe resumption of limited "in church" Sacramental Celebrations:

#### THE SACRAMENT OF THE EUCHARIST

- 1. As of July 30, 2020, the dispensation from Sunday/Holy Day Mass obligation remains in effect "UNTIL FURTHER NOTICE".
- **2.** The celebration of limited "in church" public weekend Masses, with no more than 25% occupancy following social distancing guidelines, began on Sunday, June 14, the Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ.
- 3. Weekday "in church" public Masses --- with no more than 25 persons attending --- began on Monday, June 8, 2020.
- **4.** Those who are hesitant or fearful because of COVID 19 concerns as well as those with a COVID 19 diagnosis or symptoms, those who may be asymptomatic carriers, those not feeling well, those with underlying health conditions or those in a high-risk category should stay home and avoid any public gathering.
- 5. Temporary Mass schedules at this time: **Sundays: 9:00 am & 11:00 am**. Masses will be added as needed and will be announced.
- **6.** For everyone's safety: Mask is a must and it should be worn at all times. Please use hand sanitizers when coming in and going out of the church. Hand sanitizers are located at entrances.
- **7.** A single entrance to the church should be utilized to monitor the number of people attending. All doors can be used for exiting church. For an orderly exit, dismissal will be directed by our ushers, pew by pew.
- **8.** Live-streaming of 9:00 am Mass (not the 11:00 am) shall continue. Thanks to Michael Diao for his time, talent and lending us his gadget.
- **9.** Group devotional observances, including Children's Liturgy of the Word and parish social gatherings are suspended until further notice.
- **10.** No public gatherings or greetings before or after Masses, at church entrances/exits or on parish property are permitted.
- 11. All missals, hymnals, printed materials, pamphlets, etc., will not be used. They have all been removed.
- **12.** Sanitation of church before and after each Mass, using approved methods is mandatory. If you are using your own wipes, please dispose of them properly (not in the Missalette pockets, please).
- 13. Holy Water fonts or receptacles are to remain empty.
- **14.** Restrooms are provided; they are sanitized regularly.
- **15.** A cantor may sing behind a clear screen when in front of the assembly. Choirs are not to be used. Congregational singing is discouraged to prevent any possible spread of COVID 19.
- **16.** The usual presentation of offertory gifts and physical contact of any kind at the sign of peace is suspended.
- 17. Communion is restricted to the Sacred Host only and no chalice may be offered or shared. Communion in the hand is strongly preferred. Communion ministers must wear mask. Sanitizing spray must be available next to the minister.
- 18. There will be no communion line. Ministers will bring communion to you, passing in between pews.
- 19. Priests will not receive or gather the faithful after the Mass.
- 20. Those uncomfortable attending the Mass indoors may follow the live-streamed Mass in their cars at the parking lot.
- **21.** In case of overflow and not everyone may be seated, the community room and the chapel will be available for streaming.

#### THE SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM

- 1. The celebration of Baptism within Mass is suspended.
- 2. Baptisms outside of Mass are to be celebrated one family at a time.
- 3. Baptisms will be scheduled any day except Sunday.
- 4. The number attending should adhere to social distance guidelines with a maximum of 50 persons.
- 5. Masks are to be worn by all present.
- **6.** Only parents or godparents may hold the infant during the ceremonies.
- 7. Sanitizer should be used when there is any physical contact before, during or after Baptism.
- **8.** Fresh baptismal water is to be blessed, used and disposed of after each celebration. An implement should be utilized to pour the water in the act of baptizing. Pouring the water by hands alone is prohibited.
- 9. The signing of the cross and anointings should be done with a cotton ball or "Q-tip which should be burned or buried afterward.
- 10. Group photographs in church after the Baptism is limited.
- **11.** The celebrant will not receive or make physical contact with the faithful after the baptism; families should exit church immediately after Baptism in an orderly manner.

#### THE SACRAMENT OF MATRIMONY

- 1. Only the marriage ceremony (not Mass) may be celebrated in church until further notice.
- 2. Number of persons in church should be limited to 50; live-streamed ceremonies may also be offered.
- 3. All present must wear masks (except bride and groom).
- **4.** Social distancing is to be observed throughout the celebration.
- 5. Worship aids or other booklets, hymnals, papers and programs are not to be distributed/used in church.
- **6.** Greeting at the doors is prohibited.
- 7. Celebrant will stand at least six feet from the couple, e.g. on the other side of altar.
- 8. Wedding rings should be held by the groom only.
- 9. The sign of peace and any physical contact between participants, except the bride and groom, is prohibited.
- **10.** The inclusion of particular or ethnic customs that might jeopardize social distancing should be discouraged but may be determined by the celebrant.
- 11. Any receiving line is prohibited; participants should exit the church immediately after the ceremony.
- 12. Group photographs in church after the ceremony are limited.

#### CATHOLIC FUNERALS IN CHURCH

- **1.** All directives for the celebration of the public "in Church" Masses are to be observed. Social distancing is to be maintained at all times and masks are to be worn.
- 2. Number of persons present should follow directives for public "in Church" Masses, preferably 50.
- **3.** The use of the pall is suspended.
- 4. Live-streaming of the Mass is permitted.
- **5.** Eulogy is omitted.
- **6.** For the committal, the number of persons in attendance should follow NJ State regulations for cemeteries and physical contact with those in attendance is prohibited.
- 7. Memorial Masses may now be scheduled for those who lost family members during the quarantine.

#### **SACRAMENT OF RECONCILIATION**

- 1. Confession/Reconciliation is from 4pm-5pm at the exit door of the chapel along Lawrence Avenue every Saturday.
- 2. There are seats provided outside for those in line.

There is so much to remember in these new guidelines. So, let us all be patient and practice kindness and charity.

## **Directives for Sunday 9:00 AM Outdoor/In Car Mass**

# PLEASE TAKE NOTE . . .

\*Car gatherings will be subject to the restrictions in the Order (NJ Executive Order 142). PLEASE DO NOT FORGET to bring your own device (phone/tablet, etc.) when you come as Mass will ONLY be live- streamed. To access the mass from your personal device, go to YOUTUBE, place the words "Church of Saint Ann" in the search bar. You will see our logo which is the red cross in a window with our name, "Church of Saint Ann" underneath the red cross. Click on it. Or, simply go to our parish Website and click on "Mass Livestream".

#### Please follow these guidelines:

- Only the front of FDC (right side of Solar Panel facing FDC) will be reserved for the In Car Mass.
- Parking attendants will be available to assist cars and direct traffic flow when coming in and going out of the parking area. Please DO NOT park in spaces with red cones.
- Attendees must remain in their same car throughout the gathering, unless 1) an occupant needs to get out of the vehicle for their health or safety:
- The vehicle must remain closed at all times unless 1) people are wearing masks and there is one parking space between your vehicle and the next; 2) an officer, or public official requires the vehicle to open. There is a further exception allowing the opening of the vehicle if necessary for health or safety;
- At the end of the Mass, as cars are exiting, EMHC's (Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion) will distribute communion at parking lot exit by Rossa Avenue. Health and safety guidelines are being followed. We have four designated areas, Parking attendants will assist the flow of traffic. <u>Communicants are to remove their masks</u> <u>immediately before receiving and replace afterwards</u>.
- A collection basket will be offered for those who would like to make a sacrificial offering with stewardships envelopes to the church.
- Masks should be worn; IF YOU ARE NOT WELL, PLEASE DO NOT attend the Mass.
   Dispensation from the Sunday obligation is extended by the Bishop "UNTIL FURTHER NOTICE".

# **Religious Education Update**

We hope you and your loved ones are doing well during these challenging times.

Registration for the 2020-2021 RE (Religious Education), GOF (Generations of Faith) year is ongoing through September 20 (Catechetical Sunday). If you were enrolled last year, we are sending you (via your email address) registration materials. You can also find a parish religious education registration form and a registration cover letter on the parish website.

# What will our Religious Education/Generations of Faith Programs look like this year?

In light of the restrictions placed on schools and parishes (and for the safety of all), we are beginning with 100% virtual faith formation/instruction for all grades and all faith formation programs — beginning September 20 (Catechetical Sunday) through December and will re-evaluate at the end of Thanksgiving.

Electronic resources will be made available to all those who register and a monthly thematic guide/detailed grade level program will be posted on the parish website—for all programs, that is RE/GOF/Confirmation Prep/Sacramental Prep (Reconciliation). We know that families will be extra busy and concerned with school work and family life at this time so we will keep things simple and flexible. Please know the parish is ready to help in any way we possibly can.

#### When will we celebrate First Eucharist and Confirmation?

**First Communion:** We have scheduled three Masses so that we can safely accommodate those who were in the program last spring, and did not yet receive this sacrament. First Communion celebrations are scheduled for Saturday, October 3 at 9:30 am and 11:30 am, and Sunday, October 4 at 3:00 pm. Please mark your calendars. More information will be provided for you to sign up for one of these celebrations.

**Confirmation:** We have scheduled four services so that we can safely accommodate those who were in the program last spring, and did not yet receive this sacrament. Confirmation celebrations are scheduled for Saturday, October 17 at 9:30 am and 11:30 am, Sunday, October 18 at 3:00 pm and Sunday, October 25 at 3:00 pm. Please mark your calendars. More information will be provided for you to sign up for one of these celebrations.

# "New Stimulus Package Approved by Congress"

**Section 2204.** Allowance of partial above the line deduction for charitable contributions. The provision encourages Americans to contribute to churches and charitable organizations in 2020 by permitting them to deduct up to \$300 of cash contributions, whether they itemize their deductions or not.

**Section 2205.** Modification of limitations on charitable contributions during 2020. The provision increases the limitations on deductions for charitable contributions by individuals who itemize, as well as corporations. For individuals, the 50 percent of adjusted gross income limitation is suspended for 2020. For corporations, the 10 percent limitation is increased to 25 percent of taxable income. This provision also increases the limitation on deductions for contributions of food inventory from 15 percent to 25 percent.

On September 11, 2001, 19 militants associated with the Islamic extremist group al Qaeda hijacked four airplanes and carried out suicide attacks against targets in the United States. Two of the planes were flown into the twin towers of the World Trade Center in New York City, a third plane hit the Pentagon just outside Washington, D.C., and the fourth plane crashed in a field in Shanksville, Pennsylvania. # CATECHISTS AND CO-CATECHISTS (WORK AS A TEAM) NEEDED

A catechist is one who hands on faith and the teachings of the Church. We are looking for women, men, and young adults who are willing to share their faith, engage in discussion with our young parishioners in a friendly setting using the resources provided by the parish. It's not about how much you know, but about how you live your faith in daily life and desire to accompany others on their faith journey. Catechists are provided with initial and ongoing formation.

We have three programs in need, (1) a weekly model for grades 1-6, (2) a bi-monthly confirmation prep model for grades 7 & 8, and (3) a once a month family-centered model which includes all grades 1-8. ## St. Ann's Living Word Scripture Study Group

#### Going Deeper into the Meaning of the Scriptures

#### DID YOU KNOW?

The Letters of Paul the Apostle predate all the gospels by about 30 to 90 years. The gospel concepts regarding the Resurrection, the Eucharist, Baptism, the Holy Spirit, and the very meaning of our faith come to us were taken directly from the writings of St. Paul, the architect of the Christian faith.

There several specific words in the gospels that seem to come directly from Jesus Nazareth. Scripture scholars have concluded that the Aramaic words that appear in the gospels which were all written in Greek are most likely from the historical Jesus who spoke Aramaic. 1) It seems that Jesus' own word for God was the Aramaic word *Abba*, which means father, and more appropriately, Pop or Daddy. 2) The very word that we use today to conclude our prayers, *Amen*, is an Aramaic word and emphatic word used for emphatic acclamation, like contemporary affirmations like "Right On!", or "Word Up!" When we read about Jesus saying, "Amen, Amen, I say to you to you", we may be coming close to the way that Jesus addressed the people of his time.

In the Gospel According the John (Chapter 21, verses 15-17) the gospel writer uses two separate Greek verbs to describe Jesus' three-fold question to Peter: Peter, Do you love me more than these (the other disciples)? When Jesus asks the question, the Greek verb used *agapo* is "Do you love me in a selfless, virtuous kind of way?" When Peter responds, the Greek verb used is *phileo* "I love you like family." Reading this gospel dialog in English we rely on the interpreter of the gospel to capture the nuance connected to Jesus' original question.

St. Ann's Living Word Scripture Study Group meets weekly *on-line* on Wednesdays from 4:30 – 6 PM. We gather to learn more about the language and messages that the scripture writers used to communicate their messages of faith to the ancient people to whom they wrote. Our primary goal is to enhance the quality of our discipleship to Jesus by going deeper in our understand of the Word of God. All who are seeking to learn more about the buried treasure lying beneath the surface of our scripture readings are welcome to come and grow in our faith




