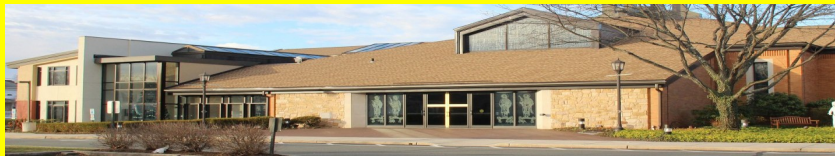

A MESSAGE FROM FR. LEANDRO 'Lines' DELA CRUZ

Dear Parishioners and Friends,

Since long before the Ascension, humans have grappled with explaining and imagining the kingdom of God. It is a mystery at the core of our belief. The New Testament is riddled with figurative language about the kingdom of God, and our gospel writers highlight many parables of Jesus that are meant to help explain this divine mystery with a bit more simplicity. We hear stories about mustard seeds, pearls, and great places that are to be prepared by Jesus himself for each of us. These parables reveal many things but one constant proverbial truth - that God brings about the kingdom through unexpected and unordinary means.

The good news of God's kingdom comes to humanity in the Word who takes on the flesh of a poor Galilean carpenter's son and spends His life scattering the "seeds" of the Good News upon the earth. Despite His message of hope and new life, His words were often rejected and ignored. Yet some seeds did take root and grew in faith to produce something truly wonderful. This is the faith of our ancestors that has been passed down, generation by generation, to you and me.

In the same manner that Jesus was not the kind of Messiah that so many expected, the kingdom of God is not what many would expect. The gospels teach us that in God's kingdom, the last will be first and the first will be last. The kingdom of God is not a reward for being rich and powerful on earth. The Beatitudes testify to who will inherit the kingdom of God, and challenge each of us to reconsider what we think about who is "worthy" to be part of God's kingdom.

Each of us celebrate the Eucharist together because someone sowed the seeds of faith in our life. We had an encounter with someone or something that took hold and began to grow within our hearts. We come together to our church every Sunday to cultivate the message of good news that grows within each of us as well as in our united community of believers in St. Ann's. Whether your journey to our pew took a traditional or untraditional path, let us praise God for the people in our lives that have passed along the seeds of faith.

Now is our time to pass along that faith to others also especially to our beloved children who are just beginning to grow in faith. As we resume the Children's Liturgy of the Word (CLOW) come this July 4th and at every 9AM Mass thereafter, we invite young families to regularly attend and send their children to participate. May I also invite those who may be interested in becoming teacher-catechist for this CLOW. Kindly approach Gary Maccaroni for more information.

Time runs fast. Pretty soon classes for Religious Education (RE) 2021-2022 will be here right after summer. As parents, begin to plan out this summer in passing along our faith by sending your kids to RE school or through Generation of Faith (GOF) that involves the whole family in faith growth and understanding. The RE program definitely needs volunteer-catechists. Would you please consider offering your time and knowledge to our parish children? As good disciples of the Lord, let us help build the kingdom of God by sharing our faith. Kindly contact Gary Maccaroni at 609.882.6491 ext. 116 or the Office of RE at ext. 235. Note: summer training/formation will be given to all catechists.

As we go out into the world and continue our liturgy in our daily lives, let us commit ourselves to being agents of growing God's kingdom, one small interaction, one small seed at a time.

GOSPEL

12th Sunday in Ordinary Time

June 20, 2021 - MARK 4:35-41

On that day, as evening drew on, Jesus said to his disciples: "Let us cross to the other side." Leaving the crowd, they took Jesus with them in the boat just as he was. And other boats were with him. A violent squall came up and waves were breaking over the boat, so that it was already filling up. Jesus was in the stern, asleep on a cushion. They woke him and said to him, "Teacher, do you not care that we are perishing?" He woke up, rebuked the wind, and said to the sea, "Quiet! Be still!" The wind ceased and there was great calm. Then he asked them, "Why are you terrified? Do you not yet have faith?" They were filled with great awe and said to one another, "Who then is this whom even wind and sea obey?"

REFLECTION

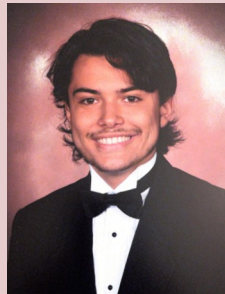
In today's Gospel, we hear Jesus calm the raging sea as his disciples cling to the storm-tossed boat. The disciples were terrified that they would die, but Jesus suggests that their faith should have reassured them. Many of us can probably recall a time when our father came to our rescue, protecting or supporting us, making everything all right. Today, we honor our dads, our grandfathers, godfathers, uncles, and all who have acted as fathers in our lives. May their protection and constancy be a model of God's care for us.

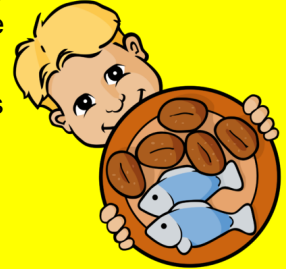

We NEED you! You can make a difference!

We are in need of catechists for our Religious Education program. No prior experience is needed. None of our catechists have advanced degrees in teaching. Perhaps you don't feel that your faith is strong, or deep enough. That's OK. Time and time again, new catechists marvel at how much teaching the faith to the children or teens has strengthened their own faith. Perhaps you are intimidated about what to say or how to teach to a group of children or teens you don't know at all. Not

to worry, we will orient you and you will have a wonderful, user-friendly guidebook with many suggestions and helps for leading each session. As a catechist, you tell a Story, the Story of our Faith, in the name of the Church. Our Religious Education program meets once a week (on a Sunday morning or Monday evening), September through April. Each session is approximately one hour.

Some new catechists sign up to teach with a friend. We actually encourage team teaching, because two sets of hands are always better than one, particularly with a group of children working on a craft or teens breaking out in small discussion groups. And when one of you can't make it to class, there is always the other who can be there.

What should I expect if I sign up?

A meeting to answer your questions, and acquaint you with the role. In addition, all catechists will attend an orientation/formation session in July. You will receive a teacher's guide for the textbook of the particular grade that you signed up for, and a schedule. Sometimes the catechists of a particular grade will get together and plan their classes together. Like anything else, once you get started you will get the hang of it, and learn what works for you.

CHILDREN'S LITURGY OF THE WORD RETURNS JULY 4

Children's Liturgy of the Word (CLOW) will return on Sunday, July 4 during the 9:00 AM Mass!

We look forward to watching all our precious children receive God's blessing and go off to hear the Good News in a way they can understand. It is a beautiful scene to experience each Sunday. If you feel called by God to help in this ministry, **please contact the Religious Education Office at religionseducation@churchofsaintann.net**, or call **Gary Maccaroni at 609-882-6491, ext. 116**. It is easy! The materials are provided. The session is approximately 15-20 minutes in length. You can rejoin your family during the collection time at mass. We need both catechists to lead the sessions and parents at each session to assist the lead catechist.

What is Children's Liturgy of the Word (CLOW)? It is a program that the parish offers to all children in Pre-School through fourth grade most Sundays. Children are dismissed from the 9:00 AM mass after the opening prayer. The leader gathers the children in front of the sanctuary and the priest says a prayer over the children and dismisses them. Then the children follow the leader carrying the lectionary to the John Paul Community Room or an appropriate place. Once all are settled, the children will participate in song, the Sunday Gospel and a learning/faith formation activity geared for their age level. The children return to the main church during the collection time of the Mass.

What should we do when we come to church? Just find a place to sit in church as normal. The children will be called forward and dismissed after the opening prayer. The lead catechist will walk up the main aisle holding the children's lectionary to escort the children to the designated room.

Catholic Principles of Migration

Immigration remains a critical issue in the United States. Aware of the high polarization around the immigration debate, it is good for us as Catholics to stay educated and in focus on this issue. As a reminder, we list below, the Catholic Principles of Migration, rooted in the Gospel, and found scripted in the pastoral letter concerning migration from the Catholic Bishops of Mexico and the United States: *Strangers No Longer; Together on the Journey of Hope*.

- **Persons have the right to find opportunities in their homeland.**
- **Persons have the right to migrate to support themselves in their families.**
- **Sovereign nations have the right to control their borders.**
- **Refugees and asylum seekers should be afforded protection.**
- **The human dignity and human right of undocumented migrants should be respected.**

Below also is listed an article of interest reminding us that we are called to live in communion. There is no Us and Them, but one family of God.
