The following is from Fr. Dela Cruz's flock notes dated September 11, 2021:



A MESSAGE FROM FR. LEANDRO 'Lines' DELA CRUZ

Dear Parishioners and Friends,

Every Gospel story has four layers of interpretation and historical meaning. First there is the **historical time and place** in which a certain action took place or the setting in which Jesus taught a certain parable or gave a teaching to the Apostles. Then there is this **historical personal acceptance**, when their eyes were opened, and they could see clearly the meaning of Christ's actions and words. The third layer is the **situation of the individual community** where the Gospel was written and edited. Thus, Mark's community had different problems from Matthew's. And Luke's audience was different from John's. Finally, we have **our contemporary situation** and the questions we ask about how the Gospel is to be interpreted in our daily life.

Therefore, when in today's Gospel Jesus asks Peter, "Who do you say that I am," there are really four answers to that very important question. On an historical level, as the story relates to the historical ministry of Jesus, we see that Peter has perceived Jesus is the Messiah of Judaism. But at the same time, Peter does not realize that the Messiah would not be a glorious military and / or political hero. The Chosen One would have to suffer and die. Peter is rebuked for rejecting the cross. The disciples would not understand the meaning of Jesus' mission until after the resurrection, when they would realize that Jesus would have to die in order to rise.

MARK'S CHURCH AND OUR COMMUNITY: The third layer of Gospel interpretation is the meaning of this story in the context of Mark's Christian community in Rome, where the Gospel was written thirty years after the crucifixion and resurrection. Mark's church was under persecution by the Roman authorities. Its leaders were being executed or imprisoned. Mark addresses this problem through Peter, i.e., Mark is telling his fellow Christians that faith means suffering, that just as Jesus had to accept the cross they also would have to suffer for the faith. In the Gospel Jesus tells the disciples, "If a man wishes to come after me, he must deny his very self, take up his cross, and follow in my steps. Whoever would preserve his life will lose it, but whoever loses his life for my sake and the Gospel's will preserve it."

This passage is the very center and core of Mark's Gospel. These words remain true today for the contemporary Christian and the Church. Followers of Jesus must accept the cross if they are to be like the Master. Only one who is willing to carry the cross as a disciple and truly answers that call really understands Jesus. The way of discipleship is not easy, and one may be tempted to shrink from what it entails. However, this is not what Jesus asked Peter and it is not what Mark asked his troubled flock. A life lived by the Gospel can only result in a confrontation with the values of "the world" and lead to persecution.

Let us continue to pray for peace in our country and the rest of the world. We pray for all the victims of terrorism, especially those whose lives perish on the September 11 attack twenty years ago. We ask the good Lord to enlighten the minds and hearts of those who sow fear and violence that it is only through love and charity that peace is achieved.

The Religious Education staff is out in the Gallery of Light to help our families register their children in the program. Please be reminded that as parents, it is our obligation to pass on and educate our children in our faith and especially prepare them for the reception of the Sacraments, like, 1st Penance, 1st Eucharist and Confirmation. Kindly approach the table of Gary and/or Teresa for any help or question/s you may have. Those who are interested to become catechists or volunteers are most welcome to see these wonderful guys.

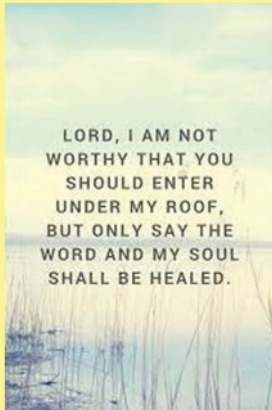

FIRST SESSION

September 29, 2021

GOSPEL

25th Sunday in Ordinary Time

September 19, 2021 - Mark 9:30-37

Jesus and his disciples left from there and began a journey through Galilee, but he did not wish anyone to know about it. He was teaching his disciples and telling them, "The Son of Man is to be handed over to men and they will kill him, and three days after his death the Son of Man will rise." But they did not understand the saying, and they were afraid to question him. They came to Capernaum and, once inside the house, he began to ask them, "What were you arguing about on the way?" But they remained silent. They had been discussing among themselves on the way who was the greatest. Then he sat down, called the Twelve, and said to them, "If anyone wishes to be first, he shall be the last of all and the servant of all." Taking a child, he placed it in the their midst, and putting his arms around it, he said to them, "Whoever receives one child such as this in my name, receives me; and whoever receives me, receives not me but the One who sent me."

REFLECTION

This time of year is one of transition. The casual rhythms of the summer, often marked by leisure and vacation activities, give way to a new school year and a more rigorous schedule. The Gospel passages from last week and this week hint at a transition for Jesus and his disciples as well. Jesus tells them that soon he will be handed over to authorities who will kill him but that after three days he would rise. The days of traveling around Galilee - far from Jerusalem - are ending. As we anticipate the coming of fall, let us each resolve to carry our own cross through all life's rhythms, reassured by the promise of resurrection.

About that Wonderful Story of Creation in the Bible

There are two creation stories in the Bible. The first story (Genesis 1:1-2:4) is the one that is more familiar to most people. We read this story during the East Vigil each year. It features a seven-day process by which God creates the world with God resting on the seventh day. Ironically, the second story of creation in the Bible (Genesis 2:5-25) was written by scribes in the courts of King David and Solomon 500 years prior to the first creation story in our Bible. In that second creation story (Genesis 2:5-25) we read about an abbreviated process of the creation of universe, the creation of man, and the process by which the first woman was created from Adam's rib. Amazingly, four separate schools of biblical writers wrote and edited the original Hebrew Bible, the Yahwists, the Elohist, the Deuteronomists, and the Priestly writing schools.

The first Jewish creation story in the Bible was composed by the Priestly biblical writers during their imprisonment in Babylon. It was there that the Jews learned about the ancient Assyrian-Babylonian story of creation. They discovered that their captors attributed creation of a battle between two ancient gods, Marduk and Tiamat. The Jews in exile in Babylon actually liked the seven-day format of their captors' story of creation. The one thing they could never accept, however, was attributing creation to a battle between two pagan gods.

Consequently, the Jewish priestly scribes tossed out the battle between two gods creation story motif, but retained the seven-day creation story format. More important, those ancient Jewish priestly editors decided to credit the seven-day creation format to their God, Yahweh, the great I Am—the One who causes all things to happen.

As a final touch to their new creation story the ancient Jewish composers established the seventh day of the week as their Sabbath in honor of Yahweh's day of rest on the seventh day. From that point on to the present day, the Jewish people determined that the seventh day of week would be dedicated to their Sabbath in honor of their God rested from the work of creation on the seventh day.

As far back as 2010 The Living Word Scripture Study Group (LWSSG) of St. Ann's Parish, under the guidance of St. Ann's parishioner, Fred Vasapolli, MA, MTH, has assisted many people from our parish and from Mercer County in learning how to read the scriptures intelligently—within the context in which they were written.

Come join a great group of people who seek to understand the scriptures. The 2021-22 LWSSG sessions will reconvene starting **Wednesday, September 29, 7-8:30 PM**, in St. Ann's Pope John Community Room.
