# **OUR ACCOMPLISHMENTS THIS YEAR!**

It is our constant mission to keep our parish facilities and school up to date and looking pristine. In those efforts we have made some improvements, some you can see and some that are behind the scenes.

**SCHOOL:** ~ refinished the gym floor ~ replaced some classroom white-boards, fire extinguishers and exit signs ~ painted classrooms, curbs, crosswalks, the foyer, front stair to the school and the Blue Ribbon sign ~ refinished all outside benches and removal of old trees ~ new electric line in the nurses room and air conditioning units in the café classrooms ~

**CHURCH/FDC:** ~ improved all exit signs with battery backup ~ replaced and updated all fire extinguishers ~ HVAC maintenance ~ numerous other projects are being considered and underway ~

**ST.MICHAEL:** ~ the front doors to the church are being refinished ~ a concrete retaining wall was replaced ~

**YOUTH CHOIR:** ~ grew from 23 to 28 members in September 2016 then from 28 to 35 members in July 2016 ~ perform at Sunday masses and nine (9) special masses through the year with the accompaniment of violin and clarinet players ~ twelve (12) soloists have been training for the Christmas Concert ~

**CONVENT:** ~ landscaping upgrades ~ there are several maintenance jobs that have been identified and are currently underway to be fixed ~

**TECHNOLOGY:** ~ new phone system has been installed in the FDC and School ~ each teacher and student in grades 6, 7 and 8 at the school now have a Google Chromebook ~ all teachers received a new Windows 10 Flip, touch screen Tablet ~ installation of six (6) new Smart TVs in some school classrooms to update presentation equipment ~ new outside security cameras ~

**MERCYWORX:** ~ Saint Ann and individual parishioners provided funding for several full scholarships to our pilot MercyworX Summer Institute, which was a collaborative credit-bearing program between the Center for FaithJustice and Georgian Court University. As a result, 12 students attended the program in June 2017. They studied Catholic social teaching, lived on campus, and performed community service with several nearby agencies. ~

### A LOOK AHEAD:

We are currently working through obtaining permitting for a solar project between the Church and the School. This project has the potential to help decrease our electric footprint at both facilities.

The School will be undergoing an energy program assessment, HVAC and boiler review. Information is being collected for upgrading the science lab and a new security entrance, along with numerous other projects.

At St. Michael Church we are starting to collect RFP's for the cleaning and refinishing of all the pews. In addition, we have a proactive plan in place to monitor and identify all maintenance needs/concerns.

As we did last year, we will carefully monitor our income, so we can continue our preventive maintenance without straining our ordinary operating budget.

# **FISCAL REVIEW**

# **OUTLOOK**

Our regular Sunday offering continues to be our primary source of income. It provides the fuel with which we run the parish. This year, our collections remained steady. Our Finance Committee continues to work hard to manage our financial resources, and keep us within our budget. Identified givers (those who use envelopes or the automatic withdrawal program) are the largest contributors—they are 50% of our registered parishioners and they contribute approximately 87% of our weekly income. Becoming an identified giver provides a way for you to publically express your support of our parish. Through FAITH DIRECT you can make all of your contributions to Saint Ann via automatic payment from your checking account or credit card just as you do your mortgage and other household bills. FAITH DIRECT takes the worry out of Sunday mornings! If you have not become an identifiable giver, consider joining this growing number of supporters.

# **OUR SAINT ANN SCHOOL**

Saint Ann School is one of our primary parish ministries. The Saint Ann School Financial Report can be found on page 5. Enrollment was 264. Saint Ann School is a Nationally Recognized Blue Ribbon School. The School Marketing Committee does a great job in presenting the good news of our school to the public, but word of mouth will always be the greatest encouragement for families to enroll their children. Visit our school; tell your family and friends and neighbors about this great treasure right in our own back yard. We are grateful to all who contribute to our school in many different ways: through volunteer service, gifts, PTA events, and especially those who have stepped forward to contribute to our CEL (Children's Education Lifeline - emergency assistance) PROGRAM. This program has allowed families who have met unexpected emergencies continue to keep their children in our school. Our parish Catholic Education Endowment Fund has enabled us to contribute \$44,797 in tuition assistance to students in need this past year.

# CHURCH OPERATION

We continue to maintain and improve our six properties here in Lawrenceville, and the two properties at our Saint Michael Campus. Preventive maintenance is certainly the most cost effective way of keeping these properties in good working order.

# PARISH MINISTRIES

This area of mission creates a sense of belonging and a deep feeling of engagement and community for all members of the parish. Through the work of committees and programs, the various ministries serve to foster Catholic identity, increase bonds of intergenerational connection, and support the parish as a Community of Faith.

# **FAITH DEVELOPMENT CENTER**

We continue to grow in our understanding of how to best use this great gift to better serve the community. The building requires continual care, maintenance, and updating. It is a source of great pride for our parish, and we need to continue to be good caretakers of this gift. Your financial support allows us to do this well.

# **GOOD STEWARDSHIP**

Stewardship is a great responsibility for all. It involves serious commitment to use well the gifts of time, talent, and treasure that are given so freely to our community. Each parishioner has a responsibility to be a good steward, and to examine their personal use of time, treasure, and talent carefully. Regular examination is an important spiritual exercise in the life of a believer. Generosity in a time of financial challenge is countercultural, but it helps us move from our self-interest to focus on the common good. We rely heavily on the support that is given by all of our members. We ask those who are not financially contributing to the parish to prayerfully consider supporting the parish with their treasure.

# **VOLUNTEER CONTRIBUTIONS**

The strength of our parish is dependent on the many disciples who give of their time and talents to help us accomplish our mission. They make the Church of Saint Ann the great community that it is, and all should be grateful for their generous service. This represents a tremendous savings to our parish. Not to mention this contribution in any financial report is to ignore a very significant aspect of our parish treasure. We are a volunteer-dependant parish and are most grateful for our many volunteer disciples who serve in the parish.
