Letter from the Finance Council

Dear parishioners of The Church of Saint Ann,

On the page following this letter please find the financial statement for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2019 comparing actual results to prior year amounts for the church. This past year the church faced many challenges and changes.

For the 2019 fiscal year 2018-2019 fiscal year-end the attached information reflects receipts, both ordinary and non-ordinary, as well as disbursements that are essentially categorized by ministry or areas of responsibility. The statement intended for the internal use of the parish, has been prepared by the parish administration, reviewed by the parish finance council and all relative reports submitted to the Diocese of Trenton as required.

We want to thank all whose generosity made it possible for us to continue to serve the church and community. Unfortunately, our fiscal year ended with offertory collections being below prior year and budget by 11% and 2%, respectively. There were some variations in other budgeted income and with the help of some capital campaign restricted use donations, total church income was better than budget for the year. After enacting changes to lower expenses, the church was able to meet most of our commitments to charity, while continuing to support the ministries, Saint Ann School and addressing critical maintenance needs on our campus. It was however necessary to draw from Church investment savings to cover an operating deficit that resulted from unexpected operating costs. This is not the outcome we envisioned for the church and we will need further effort from all to provide for the church's future needs in order to reverse this troubling trend.

Our current fiscal year budget assumes 0% growth in collections over the actual for last year. This is then matched with an expenditure plan that will result in an operating deficit. The church has essential facility and equipment needs that will need to be addressed in the near future. Plans are being discussed at the finance council level and with Diocese of Trenton support. Future pastoral communication with the parish community will be provided in this regard as plans are developed.

Our church faces another challenging year, and we are all invited and encouraged to consider our support to the parish and its ministries, operation and facilities. It is critical that all of our 2,934 families strive to practice stewardship of our time, our talent and our treasure to help achieve our mission.








2018-2019 income

Letter from the Principal

Dear parishioners of The Church of Saint Ann,

Being a parish school is a wonderful blessing for Saint Ann School. I have had the chance to meet many parishioners, school and non-school families, over my first year and a half as principal. It is wonderful to hear your stories about the school and your support for a strong, growing parish school.

Academically we have made revisions to our mathematics program and STEAM push. Students will begin completing either pre-algebra or algebra by the end of the 2020- 2021 school year. Our 3-D printing club is a great success and a wonderful way for students to be creative and show off their innovations. We are in the process of beginning a television studio for weekly broadcasts as well as laying the groundwork for LEGO robotics teams, programming and web design.

This summer many facilities improvements were completed. The long awaited SAS sports field renovation was completed. This created a safer play area for the students while also allowing us to comply with wetlands and other environmental regulations.

The SAS kitchen refurbishment has been completed. As completed we are now in compliance with all current health codes. The finished project is providing our students with food services from an industrial kitchen. This kitchen will be, as in prior years, available for use by parish organizations.

Being a parish school of course means having a focus on our faith. Students and staff are reminded of the teachings of our faith not just during religion class but throughout the day. As a school we have begun planning community activities in order for our students to get to live out their faith through hands-on activities.

Our Accomplishments This Year & Planning Ahead

There are always ongoing projects for the church. The end in mind for all these initiatives is to provide for the safety, comfort and efficiency in the church operations.

The task of planning and providing for the physical plant needs of the church and the school is a never-ending task. It is essential to the future of The Church of Saint Ann and St. Michael's community and the environment that this work be done. The support and patience of all is much appreciated as we go about these tasks. Many thanks go to all the many people involved in these efforts. The following are some highlights on key accomplishments over the past year.

- The project to revitalize the grandparents' garden is complete. We completed this work with its entire cost covered by parishioner donor recognition bricks.
- NJ Clean Energy projects for HVAC and lighting in all campus buildings. These projects will save costs and protect the environment. We completed these projects with 70% of the costs covered by program grant funding.
- The solar electric production system was completed at the school and is operational. The church system construction was also completed and is now completely operational. These clean renewable energy programs help meet the church's goal of protecting the environment and reducing operating costs. The solar production systems were 100% funded by the solar company with an agreement to buy energy from them at a below-market rate.
- Major critical repairs have been made to the convent to provide a safe and healthy living facility.
- Numerous maintenance and repair projects for HVAC & plumbing in all the church facilities including a boiler replacement at the St. Michaels rectory.
- We launched a five-year capital campaign for the maintenance and preservation of St. Michael's Church which the parishioner communities are actively supporting.

Planning ahead

There are several critical maintenance projects for the church heating, ventilation and air conditioning, building water run-off and parking lot care for The Church of Saint Ann and St. Michael's that are also in the planning stages. There are also plans being developed for flooring maintenance throughout the church. Information will be provided as plans are developed. The church leadership will also be working with Diocese of Trenton officers on future property management options to ensure that we are providing for the future needs of the parish in a practical and cost-effective manner.
