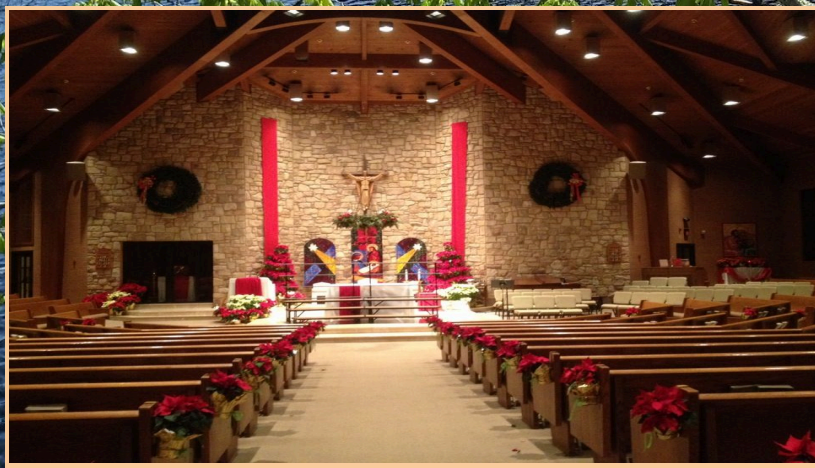

Ministers of the Eucharist

For any baptized Catholic and a member of the parish who is interested in distributing the Eucharist at any of the Sunday Liturgies, and for parishioners who are homebound.

Training is a requirement, approximately one hour.

Time commitment: about twice per month, depending on the total number of Eucharistic Ministers serving this ministry.

Linens Caretakers

Open to any member of the parish who is interested in laundering the altar linens used for Mass and the albs worn during the Liturgy. **Done in the volunteer's home**

Requirement: to be able to pick up and drop off linens at the Church.

Time commitment is about one hour per week, depending on how many volunteers we have.

Liturgical Environment (Art and environment)

It is for any member of the parish interested in enhancing the Liturgical services by creating an environment that inspires and induces a genuine spirit of worship.

Requirement: a willingness to learn about what a Liturgical Environment is and to be able to work as a team participant in conjunction with members of the Liturgy Committee.

Time Commitment: Depending on the Liturgical Calendar and feast days. It could be once every other week to two or three times per week.

Liturgy Committee (suspended at this time)

It is for any member of the parish who is interested in assisting the parish in planning and developing good worship services throughout the liturgical seasons of the Church. The committee reviews the upcoming liturgical season, evaluates the one just past, and communicates good liturgical information to the parish.

Commitment: Depending on the Liturgical Calendar of feast days, typically there is one 90-minute meeting per month

Liturgy, Worship, and Prayer Ministries

Lector

A lector is a member of the parish who is entrusted with the important task of **proclaiming the Word of God** during liturgical celebrations. This commitment holds great significance as it enables the Lector to share the sacred scriptures with the congregation.

Training: A required training that lasts approximately one (1) hour

Time commitment: about twice per month, depending on the total number of Lectors serving this ministry.

Sacristans (including daily mass)

Responsibilities: It is open to members of the parish. They are responsible for seeing that all is in place for the proper celebration of the Sacraments. Responsibilities include setting up for Mass, taking proper care of vestments, vessels, and books by keeping the sacristy neat and orderly.

Training: Approximately 45 minutes

Time Commitment: One hour per week

Ministers of Hospitality (Ushers)

Members of the parish, both men and women, are encouraged to join this ministry and be the first ones to welcome the community during liturgical celebrations.

Responsibilities: Ushers are responsible for greeting, seating, and seeing to the needs of the gathered community during the celebration of the Eucharist. Ushers are also responsible for passing the collection baskets and accepting our contributions to the parish treasury.

Centering Prayer (Suspended at this time)

It is a practice that opens us to contemplative prayer, the pure presence of God. It is a prayer of consent and surrender that moves beyond conversation with God to communion. It invites us to complete silence, allowing us to experience the spirit of God filling us with his presence within us.

Requirement: If called to lead a Centering Prayer, the individual must have some experience leading a group.

Time commitment: about 45 minutes per meeting.

Divine Mercy

What is it? It is a Catholic devotion that implores the Father's mercy by invoking the merits Jesus has won for us through his redemptive Sacrifice of Calvary.

Time Commitment: On Tuesday afternoons, from 3:00 to 4:00 PM. It includes the recitation of the Divine Mercy Chaplet within the context of Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament.

Eucharistic Adoration

Commitment: It takes place every Tuesday from 1:00 to 4:00 PM and Thursday from 2:00 to 4:00 PM in the chapel. This rich and contemplative form of prayer is supported by individuals who sign up to be present in the chapel.

Responsibilities: A coordinator sets up for adoration, coordinates sign-ups of individuals, advertises to the parish, and ensures all goes well and every hour is covered.

Saint Ann Novena Committee

A core team of parishioners comes together in late May to plan and execute the Parish Novena of Saint Ann; nine days of prayer, including a festive celebration on the Feast of Saint Ann and Saint Joachim on July 26th.

Time Commitment: There are approximately seven planning meetings with the core team before the Novena, which takes place from July 18 to 26. The team has several responsibilities before the novena services, in the mornings and in the evenings at 7:00 PM.

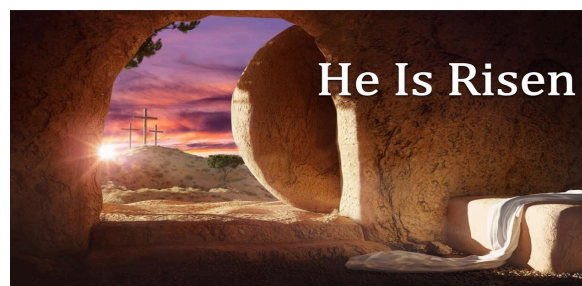
Requirements: the ability to work with a team and have experienced a Taize service before. Have the ability to sing and/or play an instrument.

Faith Formation and Life-Long Ministries

Adult Faith Formation

Is responsible for the ongoing lifelong faith formation of adults at the Church of Saint Ann. It is an ongoing process by which our community grows in the life of Christ through experience, reflection, prayer, and study.

Requirements: be an active member of the parish.

Order of Christian Initiation of Adults (OCIA) (previously known as RCIA)

Provides an atmosphere of prayer, support, faith formation, and sharing on the journey towards the Sacraments of Initiation for those seeking membership in or full communion with the Catholic Church. It is a journey of faith culminating in the reception of the Sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist.

This process is also adapted for children and teens.

Baptism Preparation

Led by parishioners, baptism preparation sessions are required and are held monthly in order to help new parents prepare for the gift of responsibility of raising children in the Roman Catholic Faith. Check the Parish Website

Adult Confirmation

Not to be confused with the O.C.I.A., adult confirmation is a sacrament for individuals who are baptized Catholics, have received their First Communion, and are seeking to complete their initiation into the Church by being confirmed.

Requirements: Must have been baptized

Time Commitment: The program's requirements vary from year to year.

Anointing of the Sick and Homebound

Please notify the parish office when a serious illness occurs or when the sick, aged, or incapacitated are confined to home for an extended period. Communion to the homebound and Anointing of the Sacrament of the Sick requires calling the parish at (609)882-6491



Faith Formation and Life-Long Ministries

Religious Education and Adult Faith Formation (Catechists)

A catechist witnesses to the Catholic Faith commitment through word, experience, prayer, and liturgy. The Catechist is responsible for planning and leading weekly catechetical sessions.

Training: Catechist orientation takes place in September.

Requirements: To have completed the Sacraments of Initiation. A willingness to learn and a desire to pass on his/her commitment to the Catholic faith and be dedicated to their ongoing faith formation and spiritual growth.

Time Commitment: The traditional Model meets from September through May. Class time takes one hour and 15 minutes per week, and some time preparing teaching lessons. The Family Model is from September through May, requiring two hours per month.

Generations of Faith (GOF)

An alternative to traditional classroom-based religious education is a family-centered model that moves the rhythm of parish life. It encourages and empowers families to learn and grow in faith by observing, questioning, and praying together. It provides resources and support so participants can develop and deepen their Baptismal call to faith and service.

Time Commitment: One to two hours of monthly sessions from September through May.

Adult Bible Study

Provides an opportunity throughout the year for adults to grow in their understanding of the intended meaning of biblical passages and to apply God's Word to personal prayer life and foster spiritual growth and faith development.

Children's Liturgy of the Word

Children are dismissed from the 9:00 AM Mass during the Liturgy of the Word to hear the readings and participate in activities geared towards their understanding.

Training: Approximately 30 minutes.

Lenten Small Group

Small groups that meet regularly during the six weeks of Lent to share faith, study scripture, and pray together the readings of the Lenten weeks.

Time Commitment: Meeting once a week during the six weeks of Lent for about one hour.

Youth Ministry Group (suspended at this time)

A Youth Group focuses on engaging young people to come together to socialize, build a faith community by sharing their faith, witness the Gospels on various levels, and participate in the life of the parish mission. Parent volunteers are always needed to support the program activities.

Requirements: 7th through 12th grade.

Charity, Service, and Social Justice Ministries

Loaves and Fishes (an annual event)

Organizes and provides a meal for the poor of the City of Trenton at St. Mary's Cathedral once a year. It takes place on the Saturday before the celebration of our parish Feast on July 26, as we celebrate a Day of Service during the Saint Ann Novena.

Training and requirements: None, but to attend an orientation meeting on the morning of the service.

Time Commitment: Helping the organizing team set up the tables and distribute the meals to the guests.
