# **Business Manager/Financial Review:**

- Proposed budget for the 2024-2025 school year introduced. A thorough line by line review was conducted
  by finance committee. Committee recommends additional review of some areas and will begin that work
  now.
  - Finance committee approved a transfer up to \$300k from unrestricted fund/savings to cover budget deficit. Current deficit is estimated to be \$215k. Staffing will need to be addressed to focus on growing enrollment, with the possibility of utilizing some of the additional approved funds.
  - O Robust conversation regarding a more concerted effort towards growing enrollment. Greater communication between our Catholic schools and parish communities, priests encouraging families to look at the schools, more outreach from Admission/Enrollment, new website, stronger media presence to showcase what we offer, etc. Tell our story.
  - L. Buck motioned to approve the budget for 2024-2025 as proposed. Fr. Creagan Second. Motion Passes.

#### Faith:

- This month our students are praying for the clergy, parishioners and ministries of St. Monica Parish.
- We had a beautiful celebration of All Saints Day. Coffee with the principal had about 12-15 guests. Many parents and grandparents joined us for Mass. 4<sup>th</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup> grade made a trip to St. Mary Church for exposition and veneration of relics. And 8<sup>th</sup> grade hosted their first School Families Activity. The students research, planned and led an activity focused on a saint. Students and teachers were impressed by the activity and pleased with 8<sup>th</sup> grades leadership.
- We celebrated Mission Week from Nov 4 through Nov 8. Students reviewed the school's mission and talked about
  their own personal mission. Each morning began with a recitation of the mission statement, followed by
  discussion, reflection and/or journaling. The culmination was Friday, when students explored their own life's
  mission, including the possibility of a religious vocation. Sr. Tammy was guest speaker in Kindergarten, and Fr.
  Andrew spoke with all three middle school grades.

### Knowledge:

- The leadership team met October 15 to make a few decisions for the school year:
  - We are planning a staff retreat in February and we are looking for support with English Language Learners for our PD day in May.
  - Staff will be engaging in catechesis with Tommy Schultz, through Ruah Wood Institute on 5 Mondays during Lent.
  - We are making some changes to our walking field trips in order to keep our students safe going to and from venues.
- Brayden Keelan, WMU student, has joined us as cafeteria supervisor for the year.
- First quarter report cards were emailed home to parents Oct 29.
- Teachers had a 2<sup>nd</sup> session of professional development with a trainer from NWEA MAP. The teachers looked at
  instructional strategies to support learners, based on the data we receive from MAP and other classroom
  assessments.

#### Stewardship:

- Andra met with Fr. Paul and Fr. Creagan on ways to partner, school and parish. We have a couple of
  events/initiatives planned and Andra will be engaging families from both parishes to participate.
- Melissa Anderegg joined staff on Oct 21 for staff meeting to talk about changes to our health and dental benefits.
- The soccer field has been aerated and re-seeded so we are staying off the field for a few weeks. The same process will be repeated in the spring.
- Boy Scouts and Cub Scouts hosted a Flag Retirement ceremony on Veterans Day. In addition to the annual celebration, Middle School collected snacks and toiletries for a St. A graduate, currently serving at Fort Bragg.

# Mission and Catholic Identity:

- 1. Our next school Mass will be November 24<sup>th</sup>, at the 9:30 Mass. 5<sup>th</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup> Grade will be taking the roles for the Mass. Donuts and drinks to follow in the community building.
- 2. The Dominican Sisters of Mary, Mother of the Eucharist visited on November 7<sup>th</sup> to discuss vocations with our middle school girls. This was part of Vocations Awareness week. Father Tom McNally meet with the boys for a similar conversation.
- 3. Fr. Homic, Dcn. Lucas, and I have started working out details to launch the Rescue Project with our Middle Schoolers during Lent.
- 4. Based on our Bible study and vertical alignment in Theology, our staff is working on standardizing Mass expectations to make sure that students are more focused on proper decorum.
- 5. Next week, we will host our All School Mass on Tuesday, November 26th to accommodate Thanksgiving break.
- 6. We will also have a Mass on December 9th in celebration of the Feast of the Immaculate Conception.

# Academic Excellence:

- 7. Teachers are continuing their work on vertical alignments in all subjects to highlight areas of instruction that need to be addressed more thoroughly.
- 8. Earlier this year, teachers were trained to proctor MAP tests. In January, hopefully, they should be able to take this task off of my hands and manage their own tests.
- 9. Teachers were tasked with goal settings with their students for one test subject. After this next round of testing, we will look to see how successful the goal setting process was with students.

### School Governance:

- 10. Teachers have completed goal setting so that we can begin the observation process. The first formal observations will be in late January.
- 11. Our LAC went through its training yesterday. We also hosted our monthly meeting.
- 12. Based on finance committee meetings and the Diocesan principals meeting, I have been doing a deep dive on analysis for enrollment next year. I am committing SMCS to EC-8 enrollment goal of 250. If we recruit a solid Kindergarten class and increase enrollment in most grades by 2 students, we could easily reach this. The focus here will be Kindergarten and active retention of current students.

# School Funding:

- 13. We continue to work actively on security upgrades for our school. My next security goal is to add a second layer of in-school doors so that visitors do not have direct access to our hallways without a secondary check (think HCP main lobby). Based on preliminary research, we are looking at least \$10K for a pair on in-school doors with access control readers. A couple of parents have expressed interest in helping fund this project.
- 14. We are getting quotes for playground improvements in order to use our Shamrock Shuffle funds from the past year. We have met with four companies so far. The playground committee aims to allocate funds from last year's shuffle and this year's to replace the current main structure. On the current structure, the metal is rusting, the plastic for the slides has cracked, the coating on the chains has worn through. This is becoming a safety concern. We are taking all elements into consideration to reduce labor costs.
- 15. Seeking sponsors for a new scoreboard in the gym. Ours has begun to fail sporadically. A small backup scoreboard was purchased but a new scoreboard is needed. Total cost will be around \$5,000.
- 16. I am in discussions with the parish about upgrading the sound system in the gymnasium. This is in the beginning stages of discussion.

School Funding:

- Financial review:
  - The committee reviewed the Sep. 30, 2024, and Oct. 31, 2024 financial statements. As of 10/31/24, expenses were at 33% of the total budget, which is on track. A narrative review was provided with the financials.

#### Enrollment:

- o The committee discussed the enrollment goal for 2024-2025. On Friday of last week, the schools were asked by the Diocese of Kalamazoo to evaluate their individual enrollment goal for 2024-2025.
