Baptism of John the Baptist

Every year the Pope canonizes new saints - EVERY year. The life of each one of these saints is a testimony to this truth.

Just like St John the Baptist, they discovered God's call in their life, responded to it generously, and became channels of God's saving action. One of the saints Pope Benedict canonized was Father George Preca [PRAY-kuh]. St. George Preca was born and lived on the Island of Malta. He died in 1962.

While he was still a seminarian, his confessor passed away. A few days later, the confessor appeared to him and told him, "God has chosen you to teach his people." Fr George took this as a sign to begin something he had long wanted to do: gather a group of lay men and women dedicated to teaching catechesis and living a simple Christian lifestyle. Thus began a new foundation in the Church, the Society of Christian Doctrine.

After he was ordained, he had another extraordinary experience of God's action. One morning, St. George was walking on the outskirts of a farming village towards the parish. He passed by a boy, about 12 years old, who was pushing a cart full of manure into the fields for fertilizer. The boy turned to the priest and said in a commanding tone, "Lend me a hand!" As soon as Father George touched the cart, he was filled with an indescribable spiritual joy. Afterwards, he could never remember where they went or what happened to the boy. He later understood that it had been a vision: the boy was Jesus, asking him and his followers to help cultivate the Lord's field, the Church, by teaching sound doctrine. Jesus took action in this priest's life, by asking him to help spread some manure - I think it proves that God has a well—developed sense of humor. But this is the way of the Lord.

He continues to work in the world, in extraordinary and ordinary ways, in us and through us, because he Lord is trying to say. loves us too much not to.

THE MUTE BUTTON AND ZACHARIAH, THE FATHER OF JOHN THE BAPTIST

The mute button is ubiquitous in our means of receiving information today digitally, but unlike pause, we know something is still being transmitted: we're just not listening to it. We usually mute something because something more important is happening that requires our attention. Zachariah had not put the world or his rationalism on "mute" enough, so when the angel came and told him something incredible would happen, he balked. The angel put him on mute for his own good, so he could focus on what was going on: God's plan of salvation. Sometimes we have to "mute" ourselves and listen more to what the
