*I give you a new commandment, says the LORD;
Love one another as I have loved you.*

Around the year 1223 a follower of Francis of Assisi wrote to him with a problem. This brother was a leader of other brothers and was getting worn down by the job—in particular, by the difficulty of dealing with brothers who sin. This letter writer considered resigning his position and going to a hermitage. Much as Francis treasured prayer and solitude, he rejected this letter writer's hermitage solution. The man needed to stay where he was and serve the others. Francis wrote: "There should not be any brother in the world who has sinned, however much he may have possibly sinned, who, after he has looked into your eyes, would go away without having received your mercy, if he is looking for mercy. And if he were not to seek mercy, you should ask him if he wants mercy."



Forgiveness (seeking it or offering it) begins in the heart long before it is expressed in word or deed. In this story, Francis was trying to plant the seeds of forgiveness in someone who apparently felt his only alternatives were a messy (and possibly unsuccessful) confrontation with the sinning brother or withdrawing to a hermitage.

In today's Gospel, forgiveness was already deep down in the king's heart and that's why he could cancel an enormous debt—a debt that the first servant had no realistic hope of ever repaying. The

first servant, however, was clearly an opportunist—begging forgiveness for a huge debt he owed but hard-hearted about delaying repayment for a very minor debt owed to him. Jesus uses this situation to teach us about the need to offer forgiveness to others as well as to seek it for ourselves. Seeking forgiveness should prepare us to offer it to others. If

we have a sense of our own sinfulness, then we know how generous God has already been toward us

Over the years probably all of us have sought and received forgiveness from our parents, spouse, children, friends and coworkers. Shouldn't we pass on that


