In addition to Mass with Bishop Folda, the conference will feature presentations by Bishop Andrew Cozzens (the national head of the Eucharistic Revival), the internationally renowned Sr. Miriam James Heidland, Msgr. James Shea (president of the University of Mary), and acclaimed scripture scholar Dr. Mary Healy, who will also be leading a Eucharistic healing service. 2. 6:40-7:00: Go to Confession. May be 8

3. 7:00-7:15: Keep Our Lady Company for 15 minutes (New time for Keeping Mary Company)

4. 7:15-7:45: Mass - Receive Holy Communion

7:40 - Not a requirement, but for those that want, we pray the Divine Mercy Chaplet

The five first Saturdays correspond to the five kinds of offenses and blasphemies committed against the Immaculate Heart of Mary. They are:

1. Blasphemies against the Immaculate Conception
2. Blasphemies against her virginity
3. Blasphemies against her divine maternity, at the same time the refusal to accept her as the Mother of all men
4. Instilling indifference, scorn and even hatred towards this Immaculate Mother in the hearts of children
5. Direct insults against Her sacred images

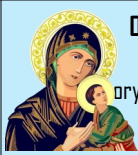
