Dear Friends.

This weekend we celebrate Easter for the 4th time! The Church wants to emphasize the great importance of Our Lord Jesus rising from the dead on the first day of the week - which is Sunday!!!! For the early Christians in the first centuries of the Church, that is before the Emperor Constantine made Christianity legal in 313 AD, Christians risked their lives by going to Sunday Mass, many were martyred for it.

Sunday was the day of the week that our Father God created the world, and Sunday was the day that he restored order to a new creation by raising his Son Jesus from the dead! The victory had been won! We are now part of that new creation. Everything we have that is good, all of our talents and abilities, are a gift from God- and so our fidelity to Sunday Mass manifests to God that we believe everything good in our lives comes from Him.


I love baseball, but I am a terrible baseball player. I really do not have the natural talent to hit a double and get on base in hardball - even if I spent two days a week in a batting cage. Some do have the capacity for baseball, some have this natural gift, they work on it to improve, but the gift and talent comes from God alone!!!

How sad it would be if a talented young Catholic baseball player skipped Sunday Mass for baseball practice. By doing so the young person would be saying with their action that their talent is not a gift from God, but they simply acquire it on their own. Any superior athlete will tell you their talent comes from outside of them.

One person asked me, not from our parishes, if they could go to Mass on a weekday instead of Sunday. This person obviously does not understand the importance of Jesus rising from the dead on Sunday, and how important it was for early Christians to gather and celebrate Eucharist on a Sunday, distinguishing them significantly from the Jewish Sabbath of Saturday.

While our anticipation of Sunday begins after 4 pm on Saturday for Catholics - this anticipation should not detract in any manner from the primacy of Sunday as a day of worship and of rest!

SACRAMENTAL INFORMATION

Baptism - Please contact Dcn. Mike for information and to schedule, which for first-time parents includes an orientation to the Sacrament.

Confirmation - The normative time for Confirmation in the Diocese of Toledo is eighth grade. Please contact Patti Wasserman for more information.

Reconciliation - A priest is available after Tuesday Mass @ GB and after Friday Mass @ MV. Saturdays at 4:00pm in GB, and Sundays at 8:00am in MV.

Anointing of the Sick - Please contact Fr. Tad if you or a family member are critically ill, preparing for surgery, or are of advanced age and in need of this Sacrament. In case of an emergency outside of office hours, please press '8' when prompted by the automated phone system. This sacrament can be received many times throughout one's life, and is not reserved for end of life only.

Matrimony - Please contact either parish office at least six months before you hope to marry, and know that a wedding date cannot be set until a couple's freedom to marry has been determined in consultation with Fr. Tad or Dcn. Mike. Annulments, when necessary, may require 18-36 months to resolve.

Holy Orders - Please contact Fr. Tad, or Dcn. Mike if you feel the Lord may be inviting you to a vocation to the priesthood, the diaconate, or religious life.

Holy Communion for the Homebound - Please contact either parish office if you are unable to come to Mass and would like to receive Holy Communion in your home or care facility.




