Fourteenth Sunday of Ordinary Time

Connected as the Body of Christ, we reverence the presence of God in each person and nurture disciples at every age, to live the Gospel with Christian charity and zeal.

Dear Friends,

One of the blessings that I found when I arrived at the parishes is that we pray the Holy Rosary before the Mass at almost all of our weekday and Sunday Masses at both parishes! I am grateful to those who lead the Rosary, notably Kathy Otermat, who leads the Rosary daily and to Hank Reineck, as it is one of the many ministries that he does for Saint Michael's. The Rosary is a sure way for us to become closer to Jesus through the Immaculate Heart of Mary. Pope Saint John Paul II added mysteries to the Holy Rosary- which he called the Luminous Mysteries, and he added them to bring an emphasis to the life of Jesus. Don't worry about praying the Rosary correctly, as Pope Saint John Paul II gave us the freedom to pray it in different ways. The key element is to meditate on the mystery from Holy Scripture, and then pray one Our Father and Ten Hail Mary's and one Glory Be for each mystery (one decade) that keep in mind while you are meditating! You may pray one decade a day -or five decades a day, or fifteen decades a day. Mary is eager for you to pray at least a little of the Rosary. Many of you pray the Rosary regularly.

The Luminous Mysteries are the following: 1. The Baptism of Jesus by John the Baptist in the Jordan River; 2. The First Miracle of Jesus at Cana in Galilee when he changes water into wine and Mary tells the people to "Do whatever he tells you!" 3. Jesus Preaching the Coming of the Kingdom of God in his public ministry; 4. The Transfiguration of Jesus on Mount Tabor in the presence of Peter James and John; 5. The Institution of the Holy Eucharist at the Last Supper. These mysteries are traditionally prayed on Thursday.

The Joyful Mysteries are the following: 1. The Annunciation of the Angel Gabriel to Mary at Nazareth; 2. The Visitation of Mary to Elizabeth when the former was pregnant with Jesus and the latter was pregnant with John the Baptist; 3. The Birth of Our Lord Jesus in Bethlehem; 4. The Presentation of the Lord Jesus in the

Temple of Jerusalem; 5. The Finding of the Lord Jesus by Mary and Joseph when he was preaching in the Temple of Jerusalem at twelve years of age. These mysteries are traditionally prayed on Monday and Saturday.

The Sorrowful Mysteries: 1. The Agony of Our Lord Jesus in the Garden; 2. The Scourging of Our Lord Jesus at the Pillar; 3. The Crowing of the Lord Jesus with Thorns; 4. Our Lord Jesus Carrying the Cross; 5. Our Jesus Death on the Cross

The Glorious Mysteries: 1. Our Jesus's Resurrection from the Dead; 2. The Ascension of Our Lord Jesus into Heaven; 3. The Descent of the Holy Spirit upon Mary and the Apostles; 4. The Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary into Heaven; 5. The Coronation of the Blessed Mother Mary as Queen of Heaven and Earth

It is so wonderful to see so many of you wearing the Miraculous Medals from Our Lady the Blessed Virgin that we have now given as a gift on Mother's Day and Father's Day to the men and women of the parish. Please let me know if you would like to wear one and have not yet received one.

Baptism - Please contact Dcn. Mike for information and to schedule, which for first-time parents includes an orientation to the Sacrament.

Confirmation - The normative time for Confirmation in the Diocese of Toledo is eighth grade. Please contact Patti Wasserman for more information.

Reconciliation - A priest is available after Tuesday Mass @ GB and after Friday Mass @ MV. Saturdays at 4:00pm in GB, and Sundays at 8:00am in MV.

Anointing of the Sick - Please contact Fr. Tad if you or a family member are critically ill, preparing for surgery, or are of advanced age and in need of this Sacrament. In case of an emergency outside of office hours, please press '8' when prompted by the automated phone system. This sacrament can be received many times throughout one's life, and is not reserved for end of life only.

Matrimony - Please contact either parish office at least six months before you hope to marry, and know that a wedding date cannot be set until a couple's freedom to marry has been determined in consultation with Fr. Tad or Dcn. Mike. Annulments, when necessary, may require 18-36 months to resolve.



Without the priest, there is no Eucharist, and without the Eucharist, there is no Church. As the Eucharistic Congress approaches, we want to share a piece of an insightful article about the connection between vocations and the Eucharist. Father

Roger Landry who is in Ohio now leading the Elizabeth Ann Seton Route from the East Coast to Indianapolis, IN, stresses that dedication to the Eucharist is essential for fostering vocations and fortifying the spiritual bedrock of our communities. Father Landry says, "For the Eucharistic revival to spur the renewal of the Church, there is a need to strengthen the Eucharistic dimension of the priests we have and to pray to the Harvest Master for many more priestly laborers in his vineyard. Most Catholics are aware that there is a crisis in priestly vocations. There are attempts at quick fixes in various places, like importing priests from religious orders or vocation-rich dioceses in Mexico, Colombia, Nigeria, Kenya, Uganda, India or Poland. In some circles, rather than look to such temporary solutions, people are trying to exploit the need in order to push for the ordination of married men or even to propose the dogmatically impossible solution of the ordination of women. But many places are not yet committed in a practical way balanced with the importance and urgency of the need for new priestly vocations. It's not enough for a diocese to appoint a vocations director and then to expect him to be able to remedy the crisis single-handedly or with an assistant or small team. The reality is that many parishes — just like many Catholic schools and high schools — have not produced a single seminarian in decades and a visit from a vocations director will almost never be sufficient to change what seems to be, sadly, vocationally infertile soil. Fewer than 20% percent of Catholic parishes nationwide have anything in the parish intentionally working to stimulate and normalize vocational awareness and response. Many parishes don't do anything even during the occasions when the Church explicitly focuses on vocations, like the World Day of Prayer for Vocations (May 8), the World Day of Prayer for the Sanctification of Priests (June 24), Priesthood Sunday (Sept. 25) or National Vocations Awareness Week (Nov. 6-12). Since 80% of seminarians come from the 20% of parishes with a vocation ministry or committee, there's a reason why so many parishes seem to be sterile. A profound culture change is needed, in which vocational promotion is considered not the duty of a few specialists but the common responsibility of priests and parishioners, moms and dads, catechists and coaches, siblings and friends, Catholic school teachers, cooks and custodians, everyone. There's a need for a long-term, whole-Church solution But a culture change is not enough. There's also a need for prayer and effective action as if the Church's life depended on it — which, in fact it does."
