Baptism - Please contact Dcn. Mike for information and to schedule, which for first-time parents includes an orientation to the Sacrament.

Confirmation - The normative time for Confirmation in the Diocese of Toledo is eighth grade. Please contact Patti Wasserman for more information.

Reconciliation - A priest is available after Tuesday Mass at Saint Michael and after Friday Mass at Saint Mary. Saturdays at 4:00pm at Saint Michael, and Sundays at 8:00am at Saint Mary.

Anointing of the Sick - Please contact Fr. Tad if you or a family member are critically ill, preparing for surgery, or are of advanced age and in need of this Sacrament. In case of an emergency outside of office hours, please press '8' when prompted by the automated phone system. This sacrament can be received many times throughout one's life, and is not reserved for end of life only.

Matrimony - Please contact either parish office at least six months before you hope to marry, and know that a wedding date cannot be set until a couple's freedom to marry has been determined in consultation with Fr. Tad or Dcn. Mike. Annulments, when necessary, may require 18-36 months to resolve.

Holy Orders - Please contact Fr. Tad, or Dcn. Mike if you feel the Lord may be inviting you to a vocation to the priesthood, the diaconate, or religious life.

Holy Communion for the Homebound - Please contact either parish office if you are unable to come to Mass and would like to receive Holy Communion in your home or care facility.

Meet Mother Olga of the Sacred Heart



Those of us at the National Eucharistic Congress Revival were blessed to meet Mother Olga and hear her share stories.

One of her stories pertains to a mother and her small daughter. In her outreach to people in hospitals, Mother Olga met a woman who was in the last stages of her battle with cancer. As they talked, the woman shared that she was a mother of two. She also told Mother Olga that she had always dreamed of

watching her daughter, who was then 6, walk down the aisle of a church on her wedding day and that she knew she wouldn't live to see that dream become a reality.

After listening to the woman, Mother Olga set into motion a plan to give her a different version of her dream. She approached the Archdiocese of Boston for permission to allow the woman's 6-year-old daughter to receive her first Communion early. When the archdiocese approved the plan, Mother Olga asked the mother for her wedding veil, part of which Mother Olga turned into a veil that fit the girl. Then she asked hospital officials for a leave for the mother, so she could attend Mass on Easter morning. On that morning, the mother walked her daughter down the aisle toward her first Communion, toward the embrace of Jesus. It was a moment touched by tears, pure joy, peace and love. Several days later, the mother died.

Mother Olga told us, "In your own journey, in the journeys of your loved ones, whatever emptiness you have, go to the foot of the cross, go to Jesus, for he alone can fill every emptiness, every void in our lives. Our Lord is truly present, and he's here in our midst, wherever you go."

In researching the order of sisters that Mother Olga started, The Daughters of Mary of Nazareth, founded in 2011. I found they focus on the corporal works of mercy, serving in hospitals, nursing homes, and parishes. The community is guided by Blessed Charles de Foucauld's "spirituality of Nazareth." As the community's website explains: He lived his life imitating the example of Mary and Joseph in Nazareth, so are we called to live in a daily intimacy with Jesus. Starting our daily life with Jesus in prayer and adoration will transform us so that we may become little vessels of His presence wherever we serve. Our prayer life is nourished by daily Communion, Eucharistic Adoration, Sacred Scripture, and Marian Devotions.

Their motto is: Passion for God – Compassion for Humanity

"May our only treasure be God, may our heart belong totally to God, everything in God, everything for God... for Him alone." (Saint Charles de Foucauld)

Our Vocation is to be the leaven in the dough. It is a call to be the leaven in society, in the Church and in the world. Like Jesus during His life on earth, we make ourselves all things to all people: universal sisters among our brothers and sisters wherever we live and serve by immersing ourselves deeply among people and sharing their life. As Daughters of Mary, our ministry is focused on loving God and our neighbors through the corporal and spiritual works of mercy.
