

Connected as the Body of Christ, we reverence the presence of God in each person and nurture disciples at every age, to live the Gospel with Christian charity and zeal.

Dear Friends,

What a gift is the beauty of our Catholic Faith. I have been reflecting on that a lot in recent days with great gratitude. There is a consistent ethic of life in all of our teachings. Beginning with the child in the womb and ending with sparing our condemned prisoners the death penalty. There is also a lot in between in Catholic teaching about ethics and morality.

Bishop Thomas recently issued a Pastoral letter about gender and human sexuality entitled "The Body Reveals the Person." It speaks about our inherent dignity as sexual beings, created male and female. The teachings of the Catholic Faith give us a worldview that is biblical, that is formed by God and Divine Revelation, and is not secular or worldly, but Godly.

New statistics are showing that young people are attracted to the Catholic Faith because of its truth, beauty and Tradition. Young people today who join our OCIA programs are grateful that the Catholic Church exercises a unified teaching authority known as the Magisterium. The younger people do not see the teachings of the Catholic Faith, including in areas of human sexuality as negative, but actually positive because they are true, and so the Holy Spirit is working in their hearts and drawing them towards truth.

This gives me hope for the future of our Catholic Faith as we continue to go forward together. The more the world moves away from the Gospel, the more people will be drawn to hear what the Gospel actually teaches, because it is the only light in a world of increasing self-referentiality - with the absence of God. Jesus we trust in you and thank you for the gift of our Catholic Faith.

Baptism - Please contact Dcn. Mike for information and to schedule. First-time parents includes an orientation to the Sacrament.

Confirmation - The normative time for Confirmation in the Diocese of Toledo is eighth grade. Please contact Patti Wasserman for more information.

Reconciliation - A priest is available after Tuesday Mass Saint Michael and after Friday Mass at Saint Mary. Saturdays at 4:00pm at Saint Michael, and Sundays at 8:00am at Saint Mary.

Anointing of the Sick - Please contact Fr. Tad if you or a family member are critically ill, preparing for surgery, or are of advanced age and in need of this Sacrament. In case of an emergency outside of office hours, please press '8' when prompted by the automated phone system. This sacrament can be received many times throughout one's life, and is not reserved for end of life only.

Matrimony - Please contact either parish office at least six months before you hope to marry, and know that a wedding date cannot be set until a couple's freedom to marry has been determined in consultation with Fr. Tad or Dcn. Mike. Annulments, when necessary, may require 18-36 months to resolve.

Holy Orders - Please contact Fr. Tad, or Dcn. Mike if you feel the Lord may be inviting you to a vocation to the priesthood, the diaconate, or religious life.

Holy Communion for the Homebound - Please contact either parish office if you are unable to come to Mass and would like to receive Holy Communion in your home or care facility.
