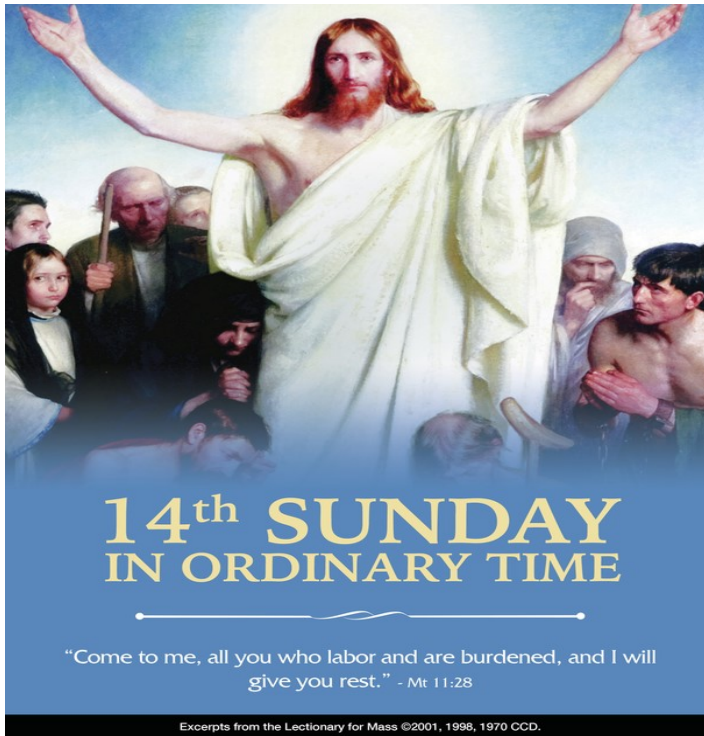

Bruce's Notes:

In today's gospel, Jesus, using some of his most comforting words, tells us to "take my yoke upon you and learn from me...for my yoke is easy, and my burden light." For most of us, we have heard these words read many times. But just what does Jesus mean? What does he want us to hear and to do? One crucial question: what is this "yoke" he talks about? And what is the "burden"?

Sometimes, to understand -- or at least get a new perspective on -- what Jesus means to teach us, we need to know more about what the words he used meant in his time. When, for example, St. Paul warns about an "uneven yoke" (in 2 Corinthians 6:14), he is warning against "joining together" (in this case with nonbelievers). And when in books of the prophets (Isaiah and Nahum among others) the word "burden" is used (massa in Hebrew), it sometimes means a prophetic "message."

So, when Jesus said "take my yoke upon you and learn from me...for my yoke is easy, and my burden light," the common people, those who were really listening to him, might well have heard this as, "Come, let us join together with me and learn from me, for joining together with me is easy, and my message is light." (That "light," of course, could mean not only "not heavy" but also "light" as in "He is the Light of the world.") What a new, fresh perspective this gives to the old, familiar words!
