Bruce's Notes:

One way to understand the conversations and teachings in this week's gospel reading is to see them as an internal dialogue between parts of ourselves.

So often our "conscience" (the Jesus part of us) tells us that we really must do something, something which feels unpleasant or downright scary. And then another part of ourselves -- the practical, cautious part -- says, "God forbid! Let's definitely not do that." And that's when the Jeconscience part responds, "Get behind me, Satan! You are an obstacle to my listening to and following the right path, God's will."

Then our Jesus part tells us that if we want to feel no longer alone and afraid but joyful, united with Jesus and with God and God's love, we must put aside our lower self, take courage, and follow our higher self. To try to save the lower means to lose the higher, and what profit would there be in gaining outward success and immediate gratification and so-called "safety" while forfeiting the deep joy and love and satisfaction that comes with listening to and following the Holy Spirit and dwelling in that kingdom of God that lives within us?

For God does give us free will, does offer us a choice, and our inner lives, our souls, reap the results of what we choose to do. And that's how much God loves us: to lead us and guide us, to beckon us, without forcing us. How wonderful!
