

Assembly of Leaders Meeting Notes November 12, 2022

The meeting opened with a prayer led by Bishop Joe. The first item on the agenda was the Proposed Department Initiatives for fiscal year 2023-2024. The Department Directors were available to answer questions from the group. The members approved the following initiatives:

- 1) Expand knowledge of our ministries and increase the level of volunteerism to maintain, and possibly expand, vibrant and responsive ministries to meet future needs of our community. This initiative will be accomplished by working with the Department Directors, the Director of Communications and other necessary staff/parishioners with specific knowledge and expertise to advance this initiative.
- 2) Continue our current efforts to support parents and grandparents of non-active adult children, and focus on other non-connected and non-Catholic family members to re-connect/become part of the Church.
- 3) Research and present to the parish at large a new major outreach initiative focusing on a local need in the community (e.g., homelessness).

The next item on the agenda was a report from Deacon Mark Westendorf on our Pastoral Care ministries.

- We have eighty bereavement volunteers and seven lead planners who meet with the family to plan the funeral Mass. We also have volunteers to help with receptions.
- There will be a presentation by parishioner Kathleen Canavan on November 15, 2022, entitled "Does it Ever Get Better? Finding Hope in the Face of Grief." Reservations are not required. All are invited to attend.
- During the All Souls Day Mass on November 2, 2022, anyone who lost a loved one was given a special candle to take with them.
- There will be a special Mass on Wednesday, May 17, 2023, for those who lost a child.
- In calendar year 2021, we had seventy-four funerals at the parish. So far this calendar year, we've had seventy-one funerals.
- A New Day Grief Support session starts in January and runs nine weeks. We have two to three sessions each year for adults who experienced a death of a loved one.
- We have eleven home distributors. We also provide Communion to the Lodge, Meadowbrook Care Center, and Bethesda North.
- The Prayer Blanket Ministry gives out prayer blankets at the Wednesday evening Anointing Mass.
- We maintain the prayer list in the bulletin and on the parish website.

Once the Pastoral Care report concluded, Anne Fialko, our Coordinator of Outreach Ministries, updated the Assembly on the many outreach efforts of the parish. The presentation included an outreach flyer for each member. The following updates were noted:

- We have created and posted five ministry videos for the parish website, and we are hoping to have five more done before Christmas depending upon the availability of the volunteers.
- We will be updating the Outreach Wall in the main gathering space.
- In October, we distributed comfort bags to parishioners to hand out to those in need.
- We will again be serving Bethany House in the new year in their new facility. We have been catering meals since July, 2022.
- Thanks to a last-minute donation, we were able to award the full \$40,000 to the Purcell Marion Lavatus Powell program through our Scholarship Ministry.
- Since the beginning of this fiscal year (July 1, 2022), Psalm 23 has given \$20,000 to those affected by the floods in Kentucky, the hurricane in Florida, and the water shortage in Mississippi.
- We added a fourth school to the School Supply Drive.

Assembly of Leaders Meeting Notes continued

- The Whitley City Toy Drive filled two-thirds of a truck. The St. Vincent de Paul Toy Drive filled an entire truck.
- We donated \$1,350 to each pregnancy center.
- We sent five packed cars to Mary Magdalen House.
- We are having a book drive for those who are incarcerated.
- We will have our SVDP Thanksgiving Dinner Collection to provide food to families. During COVID, we provided gift cards.

Bishop Joe followed the reports by facilitating a table discussion surrounding three topics that generated from the Priests Convocation in September. Bishop Joe stated that we are all called to leadership. In the Beacons of Light project, Good Shepherd is one of the eight Families of Parishes that is a single parish, but we are also asked to do planning and prayer as to what we can do to be disciples of Christ.

He stated that things are different now than when this diocese was founded, and there were many immigrants. People built churches around their common language. Now we do not have the same influx of new immigrants, but the opportunity to proclaim our faith remains.

He asked the members to think about these three teachings of Jesus.

- 1. I will make you fishers of men (Mark 1:16-48).
- 2. The Good Shepherd cares for the sheep and even lays down His life (John 10:1-18).
- 3. The Sower and the Seed (Luke 8:5-15). The seed is God's truth.

The members then engaged in a twenty-minute table discussion on the following questions:

- 1. What can I do to fish, that is, encourage someone to live their Catholic faith?
- 2. What can I do to shepherd someone, that is, to care for that person?
- 3. What can I do to share God's truth with someone?

At the end of the discussion period, one person from each table gave an overview of the discussion. Many good thoughts were generated! The discussion sheets were collected and will be compiled and sent out to the members.

Bishop Joe followed the table discussion with updates on the following items:

- Synod on Synodality—Pope Francis asked for input from Catholics throughout the world about the Church. He has received reports from one hundred dioceses, plus letters, etc. More meetings will be held in 2023 to gather additional information.
- A common concern among many religious denominations is younger people who do not come to formal worship. Some of them say they are spiritual, but not religious. Bishop Joe read a book by Allen Hunt called *Dreams for Your Grandchild*. It's about how we can encourage our children and grandchildren to practice the Catholic faith. The book is terrific, and is filled with practical ideas. A content summary was provided to the members, and extra books were made available to them. Bishop Joe is looking into another book *What Would Monica Do?* The book is in the spirit of St. Monica. She had a wayward son, she prayed for him, and he became St. Augustine, a Doctor of the Church. He will share more information about the book at an upcoming meeting.
- A member of the Assembly asked if there is anything with the Cursillo movement in the archdiocese? Bishop Joe stated that Cursillo is a short course in Christianity, that takes place over the course of a weekend, and has proved to be impactful to the participants. He will check into it a bit more to see what's happening in the archdiocese.

The meeting ended with a closing prayer. The next meeting of the AOL is Saturday, February 18, 2023, at 9:00 a.m. in the Community Room.

Earth Shepherds: Feeling Overwhelmed by **Shopping for Seasonal Gifts?**

Why not scale back a bit, focus on the real meaning of Christ's birthday celebration—while at the same time—help rescue our overheating Earth for our kids and grandkids?

The following suggestions are provided by the parish Earth Shepherds with a thank you nod to The Green Book: The Everyday Guide to Saving the Planet One Simple Step at a Time (Elizabeth Rogers and Thomas M. Kostigen).

- Consider giving meaningful experiential presents to be shared by family and friends. Gift cards, concert tickets, restaurant certificates, and movie vouchers can be great alternatives to heavily packaged and wrapped presents. If 40 percent of American households replaced just two packaged gifts with its wrapping paper in favor of presents that could slide inside an envelope, upwards of two billion pounds of garbage per seasonal week could be diverted from landfills and recycling sites.
- Instead of tying ribbons on the holiday gifts you do choose to wrap, garnish them with recyclable paper bows (natural-fiber raffia), dried flowers, or a reusable scarf. If two out of three households conserved an arm's length of ribbon, the amount saved could tie a bow several times around the earth.
- Purchase rechargeable batteries for your child's batteryoperated toys. Four rechargeable AA batteries can reduce the need to buy and dispose of roughly 100 conventional batteries-an eventual savings of at least \$40 and eight pounds of hazardous waste.

Individually and collectively, we CAN make a sustainable difference and save money too. For more ideas, stop by the next Earth Shepherds gathering on Monday,

The Nativity of the Lord (Christmas) December 25, 2022 by Deacon Max Schellman

First Reading—Isaiah 52:7-10: The book of the prophet Isaiah was written over hundreds of years by at least three writers. This passage is from second Isaiah written while the Israelites were in exile in Babylon. Good news is proclaimed as freedom and the return of the people to Jerusalem is anticipated. The people are told to break out in song as it is a time to rejoice.

Second Reading—Hebrews 1:1-6: The letter to the Hebrews speaks of the greatness of Christ as priest, prophet and king. Hebrews describes Christ as superior in every way. This passage traces God speaking to us through the prophets and then through Christ. We are told that, after attaining our salvation, Christ returns to His seat in heaven at God's right hand.

Gospel—John 1:1-18: This opening passage of John's Gospel reaches back to the very beginning of time and in a lyrical way tells us that Jesus "was" before all of creation, and all creation exists through Him. As the Word "incarnate," Jesus is light to the world sharing both God's divinity and our humanity. We also share in this connection of God the Father and Jesus. On this Christmas day as we reflect on Jesus as the greatest of all gifts, we pray that our daily words and actions bring the light of Christ to those around us and make our world glow.

Weekend Maintenance Help

The Community of the Good Shepherd is looking to hire a part-time weekend maintenance person. The selected candidate will work a total of 16 hours between Saturday and Sunday. The person in this position should have basic knowledge of plumbing and janitorial needs. The duties of this person include room set up, being visible to the front office staff during Masses to address any needs that may arise, and to provide janitorial services for the parish. Entry level maintenance experience is required. Employees are subject to the Archdiocese Child Protection guidelines. The Anointing of the Sick can be offered when someone is seriously ill, requires surgery, or if the same illness or condition becomes more serious. For those wishing to be anointed, please call the parish office at 513-489-8815 to schedule a time to be anointed.

Ministry to the Dying: Anointing and/or Viaticum

If a person is near death, he or she may be anointed. However, if the dying person is able to swallow, it is recommended that they receive the Eucharist as Viaticum. The Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick ought to be celebrated at the beginning of an illness. Viaticum is to be celebrated when death is close. The Eucharist, given as Viaticum, is food for the passage through death to eternal life. A priest or a deacon may give Viaticum to the dying person. When a priest is unavailable, it is important that the deacon visit the dying to pray with that person and the family and offer Viaticum. Please call the parish office (513-489-8815). After hours, please leave a message about the location of the dying person and your contact phone number. That message will be relayed to a priest or deacon.

Reconciliation (Confessions)

Tuesdays from 5:30-6:15 p.m. in the Reconciliation Room in the church. Those attending the Sacrament can enter through the doors to the church, prepare in the church and enter the Reconciliation Room when they see the priest is not occupied with another penitent.
