

“...and Learn from me...” (Mt. 11:29)

The Lord gave us a wonderful gift, at the very beginning of embracing the way of Christ, when we have clothed ourselves with Christ in baptism, became His disciples or followed His example, listened to His words and treaded in His footsteps. Then the thoughts and actions of Christ were in us. This identification with Christ places us on His way, He who is "the Way, the Truth and the Life" (Jn. 14, 6). This identification leads us to Him and brings us closer to Him through a vital relationship when He sits down and teaches us; and we, like Mary and the disciples, listen and act. This identification leads us to gaze at Jesus on the cross without thinking of failure or defeat; on the contrary, it tells us a love story in which the gaze of the crucified penetrates deep within us, submerges us, renews us, heals us, and creates us with His love, as if He were telling us: "Come to me, all you who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest." (Mt. 11, 28).

"Learn from me; for I am meek and lowly in heart" (Mt 11, 29). Prayer and submission to the will of God can transform our heart. And the expression of our love for God is manifested in humility, for love does not parade itself, nor is puffed up. The arrogant people wear masks to hide their truth, deceive others and deceive themselves; this attitude is that of weakness and lack of self-confidence, which results in hiding weakness by appearances. Kindness is not a weakness, but rather a new logic when we put ourselves at the service of others. Was it not our Master and Lord who washed the feet of His disciples, setting a good example and teaching us to wash each other's feet?

"Learn from me" the way to perfection and the rejection of sin, "Be perfect, therefore, as your heavenly Father is perfect" (Mt. 5, 48). Jesus came and lived without sin, He is the only one without sin, because He said to the scribes and Pharisees who wanted to stone the adulterous woman, "Let the one among you who is without sin be the first to throw a stone at her" (Jn. 8,7). He asks us to be like him, to stand before him free of shame and sin.

"Learn from me" to learn obedience, that is how he starts talking in the gospel of Luke: "I must be about my Father's business" (Lk. 2, 49) . His last words in the same gospel are, "Father, into your hands I commend my spirit" (Lk 23, 46) , having lived the grace of obedience between these two words, as He had said, "My food is to do the will of the one who sent me and to finish his work," (Jn. 4, 34) and as He had done: "He went down with them and came to Nazareth, and was obedient to them" (Lk 2, 51).

"Learn from me" to learn love, because you said to us: "Love one another as I loved you" (Jn. 15, 12) , and you gave us the biggest love when you died for those you love. You taught us to love our enemies and all people without discrimination. You also taught us to forgive: "Father, forgive them, they know not what they do" (Lk 23, 43). The burdens of life exhaust people, Oh Lord: their poverty, their needs, their pain and the suffering of our times, life's responsibilities and dependencies weigh heavily on our shoulders. When we follow in your footsteps and come to you, we are sure to find peace for our souls.

By consuming Our Lord, you are publicly saying that you agree with everything that the Catholic Church teaches. If you do not agree with all of the Church's teachings, even if you disagree with only one teaching, you should not receive Holy Communion.
