MARRIAGE

We are unable to accommodate all of the requests for weddings at Stella Maris. To marry here, at least one party to the marriage should be an active parishioner, regularly attending Mass for one year before asking to schedule a wedding. As Catholics, we believe that God has a plan for marriage. Cohabitation before marriage is not part of God’s plan and decreases the chances of success in maintaining a permanent union. Cohabiting couples should separate and live apart before requesting the Sacrament of Matrimony. More information is available from the parish office regarding guidelines for weddings and parishioner status. Diocesan policy requires at least six months’ notice before setting a wedding date.

SACRAMENTAL POLICY

In order to receive First Holy Communion or Confirmation, students in Grades 2 and 8 must attend TWO FULL YEARS of religious instructions if they are NOT in our Catholic School system. No more than THREE (3) classes can be missed during the year of sacramental preparation.

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

My dear people,

As a child, it seems the season of Lent had a certain dread associated with it. I think I picked up that attitude from adults. Perhaps they were trying to convey the serious nature of a season of mortification. While various forms of fasting and self-deprivation are unpleasant on one level, God often gives many consolations with the actual grace to persevere. While our corporate observances have been much reduced, there is a power in group activities. Some years ago, a sociologist researched the effects of lifting the mandatory abstinence from meat on all Fridays of the year. Specifically, the research studied Irish laborers in England who had little education. The conclusion was that the mitigation of the weekly communal abstinence from meat had a more serious and deleterious effect on Catholic identity than might have been expected. It makes sense to me. Remember when we were called “mackerel snappers” or simply “fisheaters”? In the old rivalry between Bishop England and the High School of Charleston, I well remember the dead fish that would appear in the hand of the statute of John England just before a big game. As Catholics, we are comfortable in the world of ritual and symbol. St. Thomas says that everything that enters the soul comes through the senses. I'm sure I'm not the only older Catholic that has fond memories of the creative and comforting dishes our parents provided on Fridays. Think: tuna noodle casserole; shrimp pilau; fried oysters; salmon patties; that wonderful combination of a grilled cheese sandwich and tomato soup; and even “fishsticks” or better yet fresh fried fish. Unless the dish contained a starch, buttered grits was a necessary side dish. What we ate was part of our identity. That's something to consider as we recall: **Friday** of this week, like all Fridays of Lent, is a day of **abstinence** from meat.

This **Wednesday** at 6:15 P.M. we will pray the Stations of the Cross followed by Benediction of the Most Blessed Sacrament. Unfortunately, due to the pandemic, this year we will not be able to offer the light suppers of soups and sandwiches.

Lent and a pandemic are not incompatible. Hopefully, we can find consolation in quiet, prayer and reflection as we continue the austerities of distancing and isolation. This might require “media time conversion”. Why not convert the time spent with network media (e.g. news outlets) and social media into time with Catholic media? EWTN is a good start. There are many Catholic outlets on the internet. I suggest you avoid those with a lot of angry, shouting people or conspiracy theories. FORMED is another good source to which our parish has a subscription. As I often encourage you: ask for the grace to accept the graces of Lent.
