MARRIAGE

We are unable to accommodate all of the requests for weddings at Stella Maris. To marry here, at least one party to the marriage should be an active parishioner, regularly attending Mass for one year before asking to schedule a wedding. As Catholics, we believe that God has a plan for marriage. Cohabitation before marriage is not part of God's plan and decreases the chances of success in maintaining a permanent union. Cohabiting couples should separate and live apart before requesting the Sacrament of Matrimony. More information is available from the parish office regarding guidelines for weddings and parishioner status. Diocesan policy requires at least six months' notice before setting a wedding date.

SACRAMENTAL POLICY

In order to receive First Holy Communion or Confirmation, students in Grades 2 and 8 must attend TWO FULL YEARS of religious instructions if they are NOT in our Catholic School system. No more than THREE (3) classes can be missed during the year of sacramental preparation.

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

My dear people,

Ironically, last week's scheduled procession for protection from storms and flooding was postponed as the remnants of Tropical Storm Claudette were coming through our area. Given the probability of random showers, I reasoned that even if it were not raining, the grounds would be wet. As it turned out, the dark clouds and gusty winds might have provided a memorable backdrop for this devotion. However, a few raindrops did, indeed, begin to fall just at the time for the procession. We are now scheduled for tonight (Sunday, June 27) at 6:30 P.M. (weather permitting!).

This Thursday night, we will offer **Nocturnal Adoration of the Most Blessed Sacrament** for the first time since March of 2020. This devotion is directly related to the First Friday devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus. On the night before the First Friday of the month, the Blessed Sacrament is taken from the tabernacle and exposed in the monstrance (at the close of our 6:30 P.M. Thursday evening Mass). Exposition continues throughout the night until just before our 8:00 A.M. Mass on Friday. We are reminded that it was on a Thursday night that the Lord gave us the Sacrament of His Body and Blood, a real, abiding sacramental presence, and that on a Friday, He manifested His love for us by His sacrificial death. As we reintroduce Eucharistic devotion, please remember the Blessed Sacrament cannot be left exposed and unattended. People are asked to sign up for a specific hour in advance. If someone, fails to show or is late, please remain or call our Answering Service (843.720.4044) so that they can call me to come cover the hour. If you are confident, you can attend, please sign the list in the vestibule of the church. Usually, I check the list for an hour that appears weak in coverage (usually the wee hours) and make that my hour. In the past, I have often entered the church to find that three or four people were present in addition to that one person who may have been signed up. Further, please remember this is a time for quiet meditation, reflection, spiritual reading and personal prayer. As much as you may prefer praying with others, e.g. the Rosary or the Stations of the Cross, please refrain from group prayer as other people rest in the Lord or enter into meditation, perhaps even contemplation (*Cor ad cor loquitur* / "Heart speaks to heart.") By all means, pray the Rosary or make the Stations alone if you want.

Unlike pre-pandemic summers, our **Men's Reading Group** is going to meet this year in July and August. After the long hiatus during the shutdown, many seem eager to get together. Typically, we meet at 6:30 A.M. on Fridays (except on First Friday) for Mass in the church. We adjourn to the Hall for breakfast and discussion and try to wrap it up by 8:00 A.M. for those who have to get to work. We are taking up the newest Jordan Peterson book *Beyond Order, 12 More Rules for Life*. Whenever I mention Peterson, I feel the need to point out he is not a specifically Christian writer. Indeed, his own religious beliefs remain opaque. This week, thanks to coverage by Fr. Michael,

I have been working in and from the mountains of North Carolina. During my travels, I got to listen to Jordan Peterson podcasts. He and his recent guests have been reflecting on the role of technology, especially podcasts, at a time when people are weary of traditional media outlets. Television news and newspapers increasingly embrace the extremes of the ideological spectrum, pump up emotion (one person called it "heroin hits"), and increase their ratings along with their income. The podcast can be (but is not always) an insightful investigation and reflection on the complexity of societal movements and politics, a welcome relief from the simplicity of the "sound bite" so important in traditional media. Men who are interested in joining the reading group should contact Deacon Vaughan.

Monday of this week, June 28, is Carolina Day, the 245th anniversary of the 'victory of native palmetto over foreign oak' right here on Sullivan's Island. The bells of Stella Maris will ring at 11:30 A.M. in celebration.

Regular weekend donations are deposited in the parish operational checking account, along with donations to diocesan second collections, which are then passed on to the Diocese. All methods below are applicable.

“Grateful to Give” building fund donations are deposited in another bank, in an interest bearing account. Therefore, we really do need separate checks for those donations. Please do not include these donations in our online giving.

St. Vincent de Paul now has a Venmo account, which requires a sign up similar to Facebook. Donations made there will be recorded as made to St. Vincent, and included in the separate year-end tax statement sent by St. Vincent. The ID is @StellaMarisChurchSVDP.

Bicentennial Campaign payments on pledges need to be sent to the address in you pledge information.

If you are not comfortable coming to Mass yet, you can always put your envelope in a regular envelope and mail it to parish post office box (and not the street address): Stella Maris Church, P.O. Box 280, Sullivan’s Island, SC 29482. Other options for donations to the parish are:

Personal bank account via “online banking” by setting up a payment in “bill pay.” There is no fee for this service, either for you or for us. You will have options for: a one-time payment, or a recurring payment on either a weekly or monthly basis, including a specific period of time, i.e. how many weeks or months. If you use this option, please include your 4-digit envelope account number (next to the date, above your address on your envelope) and specify what the contribution is for. If you are not sure of your envelope number, please call the parish office.

The parish webpage now has a [GIVING](#) button to the far right on the top. You will have the option of using a card or an electronic check, as well as the above recurring payment options. There is a box provided for your envelope number, and also a comment box where you can specify what the donation is for, but please do not include St. Vincent de Paul or Grateful to Give building fund.

If you using a smart phone, you can use the VENMO app for online giving. Once you have downloaded and installed the app, please make your payment to “@StellaMarisChurch”. Please, include your envelope number and what the contribution is for.
