# **MARRIAGE**

We are unable to accommodate all of the requests for weddings at Stella Maris. To marry here, at least one party to the marriage should be an active parishioner, regularly attending Mass for one year before asking to schedule a wedding. As Catholics, we believe that God has a plan for marriage. Cohabitation before marriage is not part of God's plan and decreases the chances of success in maintaining a permanent union. Cohabitating couples should separate and live apart before requesting the Sacrament of Matrimony. More information is available from the parish office regarding guidelines for weddings and parishioner status. Diocesan policy requires at least six months' notice before setting a wedding date.

# **SACRAMENTAL POLICY**

In order to receive First Holy Communion or Confirmation, students in Grades 2 and 8 must attend TWO FULL YEARS of religious instructions if they are NOT in our Catholic School system. No more than THREE (3) classes can be missed during the year of sacramental preparation.

N.B. If you are attending Stella Maris but **not** receiving envelopes, then you are **not** registered. Please call the Parish Office for registration information.





#### FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

My dear people,

Thursday of this week is the traditional date of the Feast of the Ascension. Scripture tells us it took place 40 days after the Resurrection. In recent years, the feast has been transferred to Sunday so that the faithful may more easily celebrate it. For those who would also like to observe the Ascension this Thursday, we will celebrate a Solemn High Latin Mass at 6:30 P.M. In Catholic piety, the days between Ascension Thursday and Pentecost Sunday comprise the Church's oldest Novena, nine days of prayer for the outpouring of the Holy Spirit and the ongoing renewal of the Church when we celebrate the descent of the Holy Spirit.

Blessed with the opportunity to travel this week, I got to catch up on the news. The appalling killings in Buffalo burdens our hearts. What dark and evil forces move the Dylan Roof and Buffalo shooter types? What sort of manhood mows down innocent and defenseless women and elderly? Inflation, of course, is in the news. Hearing about it, I keep recalling a line from a Catholic novel I read some 50 years ago. One character was a priest and several times he quoted a papal exhortation: "The rich have their own defenses." (Probably from Leo XIII's Rerum Novarum.) It remains true: I can handle gasoline at \$4.50 a gallon temporarily and my pantry is stocked. The poor suffer the most from inflation especially around the cost of food, housing and fuel. Russia's invasion of Ukraine draws on. Pro-abortion forces have moved from asserting that abortion should be "safe, legal and rare" to placards saying "Abortion is a gift from God," sheer insanity. Some comic relief was provided by Congressional hearings on UAF (Unidentified Aerial Phenomena), today's version of UFO's. I really enjoyed the reported goal of "de-stigmatizing reporters" as I recall the years when most UFO reporters were said to be night fisherman who were drinking or sort of crazy old ladies, which leads me to the next paragraph:

It's been a while since I have mentioned our dear and beloved parishioner Sandra Tawes. About three weeks ago, I pointed her out at the 9:30 Mass because some choir members had told me they weren't sure who she is. Sandra asked me not to do that at Mass again which is why I am writing this update here. A good while back, Fr. R. West at Sacred Heart shared a conversation with a relative newcomer who told him that I have this imaginary character named Sandra Tawes and make up all sorts of stories about her. Fr. West explained to him: "That character is not imaginary and all those stories are true." Recently, Sandra shared her theory on Alzheimer's, explaining that really smart people seem to be affected the most. She told me, "Like you, you are brilliant". (Consider the source.) "But me," she said, "If I get dementia, my children said they would not be able to recognize it." Well, I am prompted to write now because last Sunday, Sandra had a coughing fit in church as she did the previous time I had the 9:30 in the church. In accord with her request, I did not mention it then, but now, I would ask all who know her to encourage her to give up those cigars which I suspect she smokes on Saturday nights. We love Sandra and want her to be well.
