MARRIAGE

We are unable to accommodate all of the requests for weddings at Stella Maris. To marry here, at least one party to the marriage should be an active parishioner, regularly attending Mass for one year before asking to schedule a wedding. As Catholics, we believe that God has a plan for marriage. Cohabitation before marriage is not part of God's plan and decreases the chances of success in maintaining a permanent union. Cohabitating couples should separate and live apart before requesting the Sacrament of Matrimony. More information is available from the parish office regarding guidelines for weddings and parishioner status. Diocesan policy requires at least six months' notice before setting a wedding date.

SACRAMENTAL POLICY

In order to receive First Holy Communion or Confirmation, students in Grades 2 and 8 must attend TWO FULL YEARS of religious instructions if they are NOT in our Catholic School system. No more than THREE (3) classes can be missed during the year of sacramental preparation.

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

My dear people,

Please remember our special **Thanksgiving Day Mass** this Thursday at 9:00 A.M. As mentioned earlier, all are invited to bring non-perishable food items or new blankets. Please keep your offerings in the pews with you. At Offertory, you will be invited to bring them forward. The clergy will be happy to receive them in the name of those in need. Also, please remember we do **not** celebrate the regular Thursday evening Mass on Thanksgiving Day.

As mentioned previously, the Angel Tree goes up this weekend and your support is encouraged. If you participate, please note the due date for the gift requested on the angel. It is essential that your gifts be returned by the requested date as the gifts are distributed in schools before the students are released for the Christmas holidays.

This coming Sunday marks the beginning of Advent, a joyful season of anticipation with penitential themes. I encourage everyone to include the spiritual among the other forms of preparation for Christmas. Elsewhere in this bulletin, you can find the link to the Advent meditations offered each year by Mrs. Betsy Cahill. Every year, I emphasize the ideal of preparing for Christmas until it arrives (sundown Dec. 24), then celebrating it at least until the Epiphany. Secular culture tries to prepare for Christmas and celebrate it simultaneously (witness the Christmas trees thrown out on the curb sometimes as early as Christmas night). The Church has a wisdom developed through millennia: the feast is always greater if preceded by a fast. Think about it this coming week: are there ways that Advent can be a mini-Lent; what might I give up until Christmas; what might I do spiritually, e.g. weekday Mass, extra prayer, Confession (extra hours will be scheduled), Scripture reading, the Rosary; some form of fasting? How about some charitable sharing, e.g. the Angel Tree, the St. Vincent de Paul Society?

For the past couple of weeks, people have had the opportunity to wish Fr. Michael well in his new assignment in North Myrtle Beach. Now, we can welcome Fr. Tebalt back to Stella Maris and likewise wish him well here. With Thanksgiving this week, we all have much to be grateful for. I am especially grateful to all of you, for your goodness, your support, and your fidelity to the Faith. With frugality, we have been able to squirrel away some \$4 million towards a new parish center and have not conducted a formal capital campaign. I had hoped to begin one on 2022. but we are past the opportune time in that campaigns between Thanksgiving and New Year's have too much competition. Besides, I want to share conceptual drawings to show you what we hope to accomplish; the drawings should be available soon. Thanks, too, for your charitable giving. I don't like to tout it, but you have earned Stella Maris a good reputation as a sharing people what with ECCO grocery bags, twinning by our St. Vincent de Paul with other area chapters, the Angel Tree, and other periodic collection such as the approximate \$50,000 you donated for Ukrainian refugees. More recently, your donations to the mobile prenatal unit came to nearly \$10,000. Thank you. May your Thanksgiving include a long list of blessings.
