## **OUR PARISH ROOTS**

The first Mass at Cherokee was held in 1899 at the home of Jacob and Anna Brown. In 1904, a former schoolhouse was purchased and situated on land already owned by the congregation. Bishop Meerschaert blessed St. Cornelius Church on February 2, 1906. At the time, the parish had just twelve members. The present brick church was built in 1930 with a capacity of 300. Father Richard Dolan became the first resident pastor in 1954, and subsequently built the rectory and parish hall.
