



# ARCHBISHOP'S LETTER

**Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,**

Every day, we make many choices. Some are small, some are more important. Today, I invite you to pause and reflect on one question: **What is God calling you to do?**

It can feel like a lofty question. Buried under uncertainty or muffled by the noise of life, the answer can be hard to hear. Yet when we quiet our hearts and listen for the Holy Spirit, the answer becomes clear. God is calling us to partner with him—to make his love present in the world, to walk together as witnesses of faith and to be messengers of hope.
