One woman who regularly eats lunch at the nearby Senior Center was so opposed to the prayers being offered, she sent a letter to the person at the Center responsible for this activity, who in turn took the letter to her supervisors. The final decision was no prayers would be offered at any of the three Senior Centers in Washington County.

How sad it is that one person's voice has denied all the right to prayer.

Brothers and Sisters, we are called to be like Jesus, loving, kind and forgiving, even in the face of hatred. We must also be vigilant of those alienated from God, who attempt to alienate others as well.

Our voices, too, must be heard, loud and strong! Jesus is the *Way*, the *Truth* and the *Life*, now and forever!

Pastor's Message by Father Oscar Martin Picos

The 19th Sunday in Ordinary Time / 19º Domingo del Tiempo Ordinario



John the Evangelist continually reiterates expressions and images of great strength to illustrate for Christian communities how they will discover in Jesus a source of new life, vital principles not comparable with anything known before.

Jesus is "bread come down from heaven". It is not to be confused with any other source of life. In Jesus Christ, we can nourish ourselves with a force, a light, a hope, a vital breath ... that comes from the very mystery of God, the Creator of life. Jesus is "the bread of life".

As it is not possible to physically meet Him, we must go into the depths of ourselves, open ourselves to God and "listen to what the Father tells us". No one can feel the true magnetism of Jesus "if he is not attracted by the Father who sent Him."

The most powerful blessing of Jesus is His ability to give life. We who believe in Jesus Christ and know how to reach Him know a different life, a new life that already belongs to the world of God. John dares to say, "He who eats this bread will live forever".

If, in our Christian communities, we do not nourish our faith, Jesus cannot feed us with His Spirit, and we will continue to ignore the most essential and decisive aspects of Christianity. Therefore, there is nothing more urgent pastorally than taking good care of our relationship with Jesus the Christ.

El evangelista Juan repite una y otra vez expresiones e imágenes de gran fuerza para grabar bien en las comunidades cristianas que han de acercarse a Jesús para descubrir en él una fuente de vida nueva. Un principio vital que no es comparable con nada que hayan podido conocer con anterioridad.

Jesús es "*pan bajado del cielo*". No ha de ser confundido con cualquier fuente de vida. En Jesucristo podemos alimentarnos de una fuerza, una luz, una esperanza, un aliento vital... que vienen del misterio mismo de Dios, el Creador de la vida. Jesús es "*el pan de la vida*".

Por eso, precisamente, no es posible encontrarse con él de cualquier manera. Hemos de ir a lo más hondo de nosotros mismos, abrirlnos a Dios y "*escuchar lo que nos dice el Padre*". Nadie puede sentir verdadera atracción por Jesús, "*si no lo atrae el Padre que lo ha enviado*".

Lo más atractivo de Jesús es su capacidad de dar vida. El que cree en Jesucristo y sabe entrar en contacto con él, conoce una vida diferente, de calidad nueva, una vida que, de alguna manera, pertenece ya al mundo de Dios. Juan se atreve a decir que, "*El que coma de este pan, vivirá para siempre*".

Si, en nuestras comunidades cristianas, no nos alimentamos del contacto con Jesús, seguiremos ignorando lo más esencial y decisivo del cristianismo. Por eso, nada hay pastoralmente más urgente que cuidar bien nuestra relación con Jesús el Cristo.

Si Jesús no nos alimenta con su Espíritu de creatividad, seguiremos atrapados en el pasado, viviendo nuestra religión desde formas, concepciones y sensibilidades nacidas y desarrolladas en otras épocas y para otros tiempos que no son los nuestros. Pero, entonces, Jesús no podrá contar con nuestra cooperación para engendrar y alimentar la fe en el corazón de los hombres y mujeres de hoy.

Catholic Day at Lagoon - August 19


