Gratitude in Action: Our Way of Life / Gratitude en Acción: Nuestra forma de Vida

Stewardship begins within each of us, individually. Stewards must be willing to identify God as Creator and the One to whom we, and all we possess, belong.

He created each of us in His image and likeness; we belong to Him. All WE ARE, everything about us, is gift from God, and we are called to share this gift, ourselves, with others.

All WE POSSESS and call our own, really does not belong to us. It, too, is gift from God and we merely attend to its care. This includes, not only our material possessions, but our spouses and children, those in our care, those we support. They, too, belong to God and are gifts from God to us. Our friends are gifts also.

Embracing and living a Stewardship way of life allows us to accept a humble, simple way, which further allows us to grow deeper in relationship with Jesus. We find ourselves much less concerned with self, and instead, nurturing a desire and longing to follow in the footsteps of our Lord. Following Jesus, we encourage others to meet our Lord as we have and seek His way of life, caring more for the needs of others than self.

We are the Body of Christ. This is the third and final session of our Parish Mission this month facilitated by Tracy Earl Welliver, MTS. In our Parish Mission Statement, we identify ourselves as the “body of Christ”. What should that mean for each of us?

Tracy says Jesus calls us into relationship (personal stewardship) and then into community (organized activities/works of parish life). What are the dimensions of community and the various lenses through which to look at community?

We talk about the ways of our world we find distasteful, the changes that should be made. We will explore the power we possess as a Stewardship community to transform the world around us and make it a better place.

“Joy is deeper than mere happiness. It’s less influenced by external circumstances. Events and people and material things can make us happy. But if we bring an inner disposition of joy to our lives, we will be surprised by the way we can change the people around us.”¹

La corresponsabilidad comienza dentro de cada uno de nosotros, individualmente. Los corresponsables deben estar dispuestos a identificar a Dios como el Creador y al cual pertenecemos, y todo lo que poseemos.

Él nos creó a cada uno de nosotros a su imagen y semejanza; Nosotros le pertenecemos. TODOS SOMOS, todo acerca de nosotros, es un regalo de Dios, y estamos llamados a compartir este regalo, nosotros mismos, con los demás.

Todos lo que POSESAMOS y llamamos nuestro, realmente no nos pertenece. También es un regalo de Dios y nosotros simplemente nos ocupamos de su cuidado. Esto incluye, no solo nuestras posesiones materiales, sino también a nuestros cónyuges e hijos, aquellos a nuestro cuidado, aquellos a quienes apoyamos. Ellos también pertenecen a Dios y son regalos de Dios para nosotros. Nuestros amigos también son regalos.

Abrazar y vivir un estilo de vida de Corresponsabilidad nos permite aceptar un modo humilde y sencillo, que nos permite profundizar aún más en la relación con Jesús. Nos encontramos mucho menos preocupados por nosotros mismos, y en cambio, alimentamos un deseo y una avidez de seguir los pasos de nuestro Señor. Siguiendo a Jesús, alentamos a los demás a que conozcan a nuestro Señor como lo hemos hecho y buscamos Su forma de vida, cuidando más las necesidades de los demás que nuestras propias.

Somos el Cuerpo de Cristo. Esta es la tercera y última sesión de nuestra Misión Parroquial este mes facilitada por Tracy Earl Welliver, MTS. En nuestra Declaración de Misión Parroquial, nos identificamos como el “cuerpo de Cristo”. ¿Qué debería significar eso para cada uno de nosotros?

Tracy dice que Jesús nos llama a la relación (corresponsabilidad personal) y luego a la comunidad (actividades organizadas / trabajos de la vida parroquial). ¿Cuáles son las dimensiones de la comunidad y los diferentes lentes a través de los cuales mirar a la comunidad?

Hablamos de las formas de nuestro mundo que encontramos desagradable, los cambios que deben hacerse. Exploraremos el poder que poseemos como comunidad de corresponsabilidad para transformar el mundo que nos rodea y hacer que sea un lugar mejor.

“La alegría es más profunda que la mera felicidad. Está menos influenciado por circunstancias externas. Los eventos y las personas y las cosas materiales pueden hacernos felices. Pero si traemos una disposición interna de alegría a nuestras vidas, nos sorprenderá la forma en que podemos cambiar a las personas que nos rodean”¹.

Pastor's Message by Father Oscar Martin Picos
3rd Sunday of the Resurrection / 3º Domingo de Resurrección



Today's Gospel recounts the third appearance of Jesus after His Resurrection. This time He appears to seven of His disciples at the Sea of Tiberias. On two previous occasions, the Lord came to them on Sunday. This time he visits them on an ordinary workday, when they are busy with their daily chores.

They have fished all night and caught nothing. This is what happens to many Christians after years and years of hard apostolic work, when it seems that all their efforts have been useless. How many nights working to get nothing!

Jesus arrives when the day is dawning. He stands on the shore, but the disciples do not know Who He is. They have not caught any fish. They row toward the Stranger with empty nets, in need. He tells them to cast their nets to the right side of the boat and they will find fish. Those who obey Christ never leave empty-handed. The fishing is abundant.

John, the beloved disciple, is the first to recognize Jesus and make Him known to the others. Love makes us recognize people and circumstances that can transform our lives. It is not surprising that it is John who proclaims the Lord. He was the last disciple to see the Master alive before His death on the cross. Now he is the first one in the boat to recognize the resurrected Lord.

Peter throws himself into the sea. Those who have been with Jesus and recognize Him risen are not afraid to throw themselves into the waters of life to reach Him. This time, there is no storm causing Peter to sink. He is already safe from both temptations and weaknesses.

While John contemplates Christ and Peter throws himself into the sea, the other disciples continue rowing ashore *"dragging the net full of fish"* (John 21:8). Each member of the Church has a specific mission, and it is important to remember that we are all part of an immense body in which each individual fulfills a unique function. Sometimes our spiritual immaturity allows us to feel jealous of brothers and sisters who seem closer to Jesus than we are. Instead of sharing their joy, we lose time envying the intimate relationship with the Lord they have achieved with His help. Whenever you envy another's spirituality, ask yourself if you are one of the disciples dragging the net full of fish to the shore and turn your envy into prayer that magnifies both of you.

El Evangelio de hoy nos narra la tercera aparición de Jesús después de resucitado. Esta vez se aparece a siete de sus discípulos junto al lado de Tiberiades. En las dos anteriores apariciones el Señor se aparece en domingo, en esta ocasión lo hace cualquier día de la semana, les visita cuando están ocupados en sus quehaceres diarios, en el trabajo.

Fueron a pescar por la noche y no recogieron nada. Es lo que le ocurre a muchos cristianos después de años y años de duros trabajos apostólicos, donde parece que todos sus esfuerzos han sido inútiles. ¡Cuántas noches trabajando para no conseguir nada!

Jesús llega cuando está empezando el día; está en la orilla; pero los discípulos no sabían que era Él. No habían pescado nada. Llegaron a Jesús necesitados y vacíos. Les manda echar las redes a la derecha y les dice que esta vez sí que pescarían. El que obedece a Cristo nunca se va con las manos vacías. La pesca fue abundantísima.

Juan, el discípulo amado, fue el primero que lo reconoció y lo dio a conocer a los demás. El amor nos hace reconocer a las personas y a las circunstancias que pueden transformar nuestra vida; no es extraño que sea Juan el que lo proclame; él fue el último discípulo que vio al Maestro con vida antes de su muerte en la cruz. Ahora es el primero que en esta escena lo reconoce resucitado.

Pedro se echó al mar. Quienes han estado con Jesús y le reconocen resucitado no tienen miedo en echarse a las aguas de la vida para llegar hasta Él. Ahora ni hay tormenta ni Pedro se hunde. Está ya a salvo tanto de las tentaciones como de las debilidades.

Mientras Juan contempla a Cristo y Pedro se lanza al mar los otros discípulos continúan en la barca *"arrastrando la red llena de peces"* (Juan 21:8). Cada miembro de la Iglesia tiene una misión específica. Es bueno que cada uno de los cristianos tengamos bien claro que formamos parte de un cuerpo inmenso donde cada uno cumple su función. Muchas veces la inmadurez espiritual lleva a los miembros activos de la Iglesia a tener celos de los hermanos y hermanas que tienen una mayor cercanía de Jesús. En lugar de alegrarse con la experiencia gozosa del hermano que está cerca de Dios, se pierde el tiempo envidiando al que ha logrado con su ayuda mantenerse en Él. Cada vez que tengas celos de cualquier agente de pastoral pregúntate si eres uno de aquellos discípulos que arrastraba la barca llena de peces y convierte tus celos y tu envidia en oración por él, así lo harás grande a él y te engrandecerás tú...

After the seven disciples consume the bread and fish Jesus gives them, the Lord begins to question Peter. Having denied Jesus three times, Peter is now asked three times if he loves the One he betrayed. Three times Peter answers, "Yes, Lord, You know that I love You" (John 21: 15-17). The one who turned his back on Jesus now looks at Him face to face with love. Peter does what we must do so many times in life.

Despite the repeated betrayals of sin in our daily lives, when we approach the Lord the question is always the same: "Do you love me?" Overcoming sin with our love for God is always an option. Because I love God, I do not want to be separated from Him. Because I love God, I see others as brothers and sisters. Because I love God, He asks me....

It is my turn to respond affirmatively every day to the love of God: "Yes, Lord, You know that I love You."
