## STEWARDSHIP / CORRESPONSABILIDAD

### Gratitude in Action: Our Way of Life / Gratitud en Acción: Nuestra forma de Vida

Uncertainty about traveling in unfamiliar surroundings, losing our way, or getting lost can all be rather stressful. Should any of these occur during the nighttime hours of darkness, the stress level may rise even higher.

Our lifestyles, where we choose to live, how we commute, may all change over the years. Our ability to come and go on our own without concern for specific directions, a mapped route or how much time we allow for travel to an appointment or meeting, may become a more important factor in our later years. Lack of planning may cause confusion, thus creating not only stress, but frustration, irritation and sometimes anger.

Although the last line of Luke's Gospel today is not necessarily intended in the situations identified above, no doubt we lift our prayer to God's attention if these situations do occur.

*"For the Son of Man has come to seek and to save what was lost." (Luke 19:10)*

Is it safe to "assume" I am not the only one who has found myself on a path in life I never really intended to travel? Work and its varied commitments; friends who may not share a similar journey of faith; or activities that interfere with church and ministry events/schedules, can all tread on our God-centeredness, perhaps creating an interruption in fulfilling God's Will. So, what do we do? How do we handle these interferences?

*"Many sheep do not recognize the presence of the Good Shepherd in the Church today and insist on wandering off on their own, expecting to enjoy the false freedom of living independently. They allow themselves to be deaf to the voice of the Shepherd."*<sup>1</sup>

Prayer is most often the avenue we seek to get ourselves back on the right path. It is also a tremendous aid if we can "live in the moment, the now". We take one day, one hour, one minute at a time to overcome our weaknesses, renew our God-given strengths, and again identify the guideposts God has provided to guide our feet in the footsteps of Jesus.

*"The Good Shepherd wanders day and night throughout the whole world, seeking out the lost, the bruised, and the troubled sheep. In ways we can never comprehend, he touches their lives and comforts and heals and strengthens their troubled and anguished spirits, broken bodies, and minds. The Good Shepherd will never abandon his flock."*<sup>1</sup>

Jesus, our Shepherd, will never abandon or forsake us. Can we assure Him of our fidelity?

La incertidumbre sobre viajar en un entorno desconocido, perder el camino o perderse puede ser bastante estresante. Si alguno de estos ocurre durante las horas nocturnas de oscuridad, el nivel de estrés puede aumentar aún más.

Nuestros estilos de vida, dónde elegimos vivir, cómo viajamos, pueden cambiar a lo largo de los años. Nuestra capacidad de ir y venir por nuestra cuenta sin preocuparse por direcciones específicas, una ruta mapeada o cuánto tiempo dejamos para viajar a una cita o reunión, puede convertirse en un factor más importante en nuestros años posteriores. La falta de planificación puede causar confusión, creando así no solo estrés, sino también frustración, irritación y, a veces, enojo.

Aunque la última línea del Evangelio de Lucas hoy no está necesariamente destinada a las situaciones identificadas anteriormente, sin duda levantamos nuestra oración a la atención de Dios si estas situaciones ocurren.

*"Porque el Hijo del hombre vino a buscar y a salvar lo que se había perdido"* (Lucas 19:10)

¿Es seguro "asumir" que no soy el único que se ha encontrado en un camino en la vida que nunca tuve la intención de viajar? El trabajo y sus variados compromisos; amigos que pueden no compartir un viaje de fe similar; o actividades que interfieren con los eventos / horarios de la iglesia y el ministerio, todos pueden pisar nuestro centro de Dios, tal vez creando una interrupción en el cumplimiento de la Voluntad de Dios. ¿Así que hacemos? ¿Cómo manejamos estas interferencias?

*Muchas ovejas no reconocen la presencia del Buen Pastor en la Iglesia hoy e insisten en alejarse por su cuenta, esperando disfrutar de la falsa libertad de vivir independientemente. Se dejan quedar sordos a la voz del Pastor".<sup>1</sup>*

La oración es a menudo el camino que buscamos para volver al camino correcto. También es una gran ayuda si podemos "vivir el momento, el ahora". Nos tomamos un día, una hora, un minuto a la vez para superar nuestras debilidades, renovar nuestras fortalezas dadas por Dios e identificar de nuevo las guías que Dios ha provisto para guiar nuestros pies siguiendo los pasos de Jesús.

*"El Buen Pastor ronda día y noche por todo el mundo, buscando a los perdidos, los heridos y las ovejas problemáticas. En formas que nunca podemos comprender, toca sus vidas y sus comodidades y cura y fortalece sus espíritus atribulados y angustiados, cuerpos rotos y mentes. El Buen Pastor nunca abandonará a su rebaño".<sup>1</sup>*

**Here's a bit of information** about some recent developments in the parish. First, our Couples for Christ youth group (started at the end of August) continues, but it is designed for those who wish to enter the larger Couples for Christ program. Not all youth may be interested in this approach. Michele Gonzales, Heather Philmon, and Edna Escobosa-Lloyd proposed following the Life Teen program for a general youth group. This program combines activities with Scripture and prayer at every meeting, and meeting materials and schedules are provided beforehand. All that's needed are adults to facilitate and middle school and high school youth to attend. Right now we're double checking a few things about the Life Teen format and we're gathering adults to facilitate it. Any man or woman interested in working with Michele, Heather, and Edna should talk to them or call Fr. Dave.

The thrift store continues its good work of drawing people together and provided for the needs of the parish and the community. Currently a series of meetings between Fr. Dave, Don Drake, Barbara Harrison, and the thrift store leaders—Jackie Rickman and Diane Cellini—are working to make better uses of available space. Other meeting topics include ways to move inventory faster and determining concrete ways of knowing which items sell and which ones do not. This last point is behind the idea of using updated cash registers in the thrift store, machines that track departments, prices, and sales. Any thrift store worker who has suggestions about these topics and ideas is welcome to share them with Jackie, Diane, or Fr. Dave.

Carole Drake, our pastoral assistant and community outreach director, has been working with the Stephen Ministries group. This group helps train people to be able to respond to those who are in pain, grief-stricken, facing a grim illness, etc. This Saturday Carole attended a Stephen Ministries seminar and next Saturday parishioners who have already expressed an interest in Stephen Ministries will meet in the Scanlan building at 9:00 am.

Work continues on Kuzy Hall overseen by Jerry Trojan and Deacon Carlos Mendez.

Representatives of parish groups and ministries continue to meet every month to examine what the parish does and what we could do regarding the Diocesan Pastoral Plan. This plan focuses on areas of faith formation, vocations, stewardship, Eucharist and Catholic identity (which stresses unity), and dignity of the human person. Marcella Wintz and Edna Escobosa-Lloyd are putting together plans for reviving the Theology of the Body program for youth and young adults.

Thanks to all who took part in our stewardship outreach Sunday last month. There is plenty to do.

Todo lo que se necesita son adultos para facilitar la asistencia a los jóvenes de secundaria y preparatoria. En este momento estamos revisando algunas cosas sobre el formato Life Teen y estamos reuniendo adultos para facilitarlo. Cualquier hombre o mujer interesado en trabajar con Michele, Heather y Edna debe hablar con ellos o llamar al Padre Dave.

La tienda de segunda mano continúa con su buen trabajo de unir a las personas y satisfacer las necesidades de la parroquia y la comunidad. Actualmente una serie de reuniones con el Padre Dave, Don Drake, Barbara Harrison y los líderes de tiendas de segunda mano, Jackie Rickman y Diane Cellini, están trabajando para hacer un mejor uso del espacio disponible. Otros temas de la reunión incluyen formas de mover el inventario más rápido y determinar formas concretas de saber qué artículos se venden y cuáles no. Este último punto está detrás de la idea de usar cajas registradoras actualizadas en la tienda de segunda mano, máquinas que rastrean departamentos, precios y ventas. Cualquier trabajador de una tienda de segunda mano que tenga sugerencias sobre estos temas e ideas puede compartirlas con Jackie, Diane o el Padre Dave.

Carole Drake, nuestra asistente pastoral y directora de alcance comunitario, ha estado trabajando con el grupo de Ministerios Stephen. Este grupo ayuda a capacitar a las personas para que puedan responder a aquellos que están sufriendo, afligidos, sufriendo una enfermedad grave, etc. Este sábado Carole asistió a un seminario de Stephen Ministries y los feligreses del próximo sábado que ya han expresado interés en el Stephen Ministerios se reunirán en el edificio Scanlan a las 9:00 am.

El trabajo continúa en Kuzy Hall supervisado por Jerry Trojan y el Diácono Carlos Méndez.
