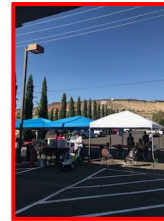
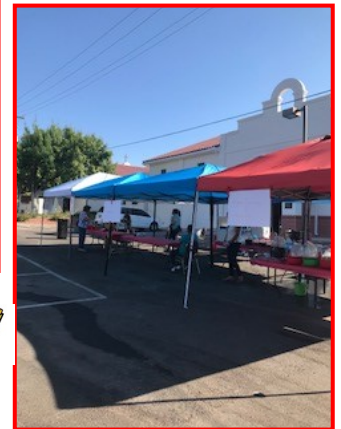
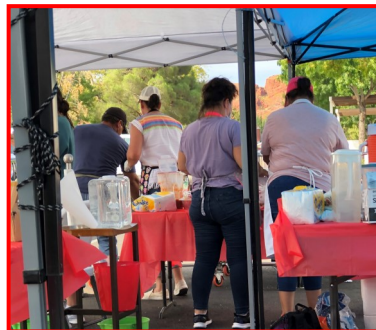
Cinco In September

Gratitude in Action: Our Way of Life / Gratitude en Acción: Nuestra forma de Vida

Jesus invites us to His feast daily. He invites us to come, taste and see the goodness He offers. The Lamb, led to the slaughter for the salvation of our souls, invites us to His banquet where we can partake of the Bread of Life as nourishment and strength on our earthly journey.

Do we snub Him? Do we ignore His invitation? Or do we eagerly approach the Banquet Table, aware of our unworthiness, and at the same time, filled with gratitude for the invitation extended to us?

Stewards are disciples of Jesus Christ. As disciples, we choose to share in His Life and His Death, while partaking of the life-giving, nourishing strength of His Most Precious Body as we, too, expectantly and hopefully await our day of Resurrection. What will that final hour, that last day be for us?

Everyday Christian Stewards identify themselves in six different ways. A Steward is *mindful*, living each moment in a manner pleasing to God, with expectant hope of being clothed in the garment of eternal life with Christ.

Stewards are *prayerfully* aware of God's presence throughout each day as they *gratefully* thank God for all His many blessings, large and small. They praise God for His goodness, *graciously* receiving everyone, all of His creation, in a welcoming and kind manner.

Everyday Stewards daily remind themselves and others that everything one has or receives is gift from God. Everything, our every breath, belongs to God, our Creator! Without Him, we do not exist.

"Pause for a moment and look around you. Simply thank God for all the gifts that you have right now, all the gifts saved from the wreck of life: the lamp that illumines this page, the chair that gives you comfort, the home that provides shelter. That's a good exercise of stewardship."

*"Thank God for the sun and stars in the sky, for the support of friends, for the opportunities of a new day, for the ability to laugh and cry. A disciple receives everything with gratitude. It is prayer that helps keep the heart grateful and filled with joy."*¹

Christian Stewards remind themselves of the value each of us has in God's plan. We are family, each with gifts given us by God, with a purpose and role in our families, our parish family, our global family, and ultimately our eternal family.

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In a world rent by relativism it seemed strange to hear a cardinal of the Church speaking about the role of subjectivity in morality. It seemed as if the cardinal condoned the kind of subjective, individualistic morality which stands against

objective moral teachings and which works so well with relativism. Was the cardinal actually advocating an anything-goes approach to morality? Not at all. Morality does have a subjective or individualistic aspect to it. This subjective aspect is not individuals deciding what's right or wrong based on their own personal preferences or desires, but rather the consciences of individuals working with objective moral truths to best respond to the challenges of life.

Offhand it might seem that St. Paul is stressing what he as an individual can do in this weekend's second reading. This first paragraph of this reading begins with the sentence "Brothers and sisters: I know how to live in humble circumstances; I know also how to live with abundance." The same paragraph ends with the sentence "Still, it was kind of you to share in my distress." Paul seems to be saying that he could have endured his trials quite well by himself but that it was kind of others to help him. Paul seems to be boasting.

Yet Paul doesn't like to boast of his accomplishments. When defending his status as an apostle against other so-called apostles, Paul reminded the Corinthians "what anyone dares to boast of (I am speaking foolishness) I also dare.... Are they ministers of Christ? (I am talking like an insane person.) I am still more, with far greater labors, far more imprisonments, far worse beatings, and numerous brushes with death (2 Corinthians 11:21, 23)." Paul concludes by noting, "If I must boast, I will boast of the things that show my weakness (2 Corinthians 11:30)."

Paul's intent in the second reading is in the words, "I can do all things in him who strengthens me."

In Galatians 2:20 Paul elaborates a bit: "I have been crucified with Christ; yet I live, no longer I, but Christ lives in me...." Paul could honestly say that in times of despair Christ was with him and in times of elation Christ was with him. In Paul's life the words of Ephesians 4:6 were not just words but reality: "one God and Father of all who is over all and through all and in all."

Objectivity and subjectivity are usually two different things, whether or not they work together or work opposed to each other. In St. Paul's life, and the lives of other saints, the two merge a bit in Christ.

En un mundo desgarrado por el relativismo parecía extraño escuchar a un cardenal de la Iglesia hablando sobre el papel de la subjetividad en la moral. Parecía como si el cardenal perdonara el tipo de moralidad subjetiva e individualista que se opone a las enseñanzas morales objetivas y que funciona tan bien con el relativismo. ¿Estaba el cardenal defendiendo realmente un enfoque de la moralidad de que cualquier cosa vale? De ningún modo. La moralidad tiene un aspecto subjetivo o individualista. Este aspecto subjetivo no consiste en que los individuos decidan qué es correcto o incorrecto en función de sus propias preferencias o deseos personales, sino más bien la conciencia de los individuos que trabajan con verdades morales objetivas para responder mejor a los desafíos de la vida.

A primera vista, podría parecer que San Pablo está enfatizando lo que él como individuo puede hacer en la segunda lectura de este fin de semana. Este primer párrafo de esta lectura comienza con la frase "Hermanos y hermanas: sé vivir en circunstancias humildes; También sé cómo vivir en abundancia". El mismo párrafo termina con la oración "Aun así, fue muy amable de su parte compartir mi angustia." Pablo parece estar diciendo que podría haber soportado sus pruebas bastante bien por sí mismo, pero que fueron otros los que lo ayudaron. Pablo parece estar jactándose.

Sin embargo, a Pablo no le gusta presumir de sus logros. Al defender su condición de apóstol frente a otros supuestos apóstoles, Pablo les recordó a los corintios "de lo que alguien se atreve a jactarse (estoy hablando tonterías) yo también me atrevo.... ¿Son ministros de Cristo? (Hablo como un loco.) Soy aún más, con trabajos mucho mayores, muchos más encarcelamientos, palizas mucho peores y numerosos roces con la muerte (2 Corintios 11:21, 23)." Pablo concluye señalando: "Si debo jactarme, me gloriaré en las cosas que muestran mi debilidad (2 Corintios 11:30)."

La intención de Pablo en la segunda lectura está en las palabras: "Todo lo puedo en el que me fortalece". En Gálatas 2:20 Pablo elabora un poco: "Fui crucificado con Cristo; pero yo vivo, ya no yo, más Cristo vive en mí..." Pablo podía decir honestamente que en tiempos de desesperación Cristo estaba con él y en tiempos de júbilo Cristo estaba con él. En la vida de Pablo, las palabras de Efesios 4: 6 no eran solo palabras, sino realidad: "un Dios y Padre de todos, el cual es sobre todos, por todos y en todos".

La objetividad y la subjetividad suelen ser dos cosas diferentes, tanto si funcionan juntas como si no. En la vida de San Pablo y en la vida de otros santos, los dos se unen un poco en Cristo.
