

Circle November 8 on your calendars. The Bishop will be in town and he will be free to golf with nine other parishioners at the Ledges Golf Club at 10:00 a.m. At 7:00 p.m. he will be the guest of honor at a dinner in Kuzy Hall to explain his vision for the Church in Southern Utah and for the Catholic Foundation of Utah, the organization managing endowments for the diocese.



Raffle tickets are being prepared for golfing with the Bishop. Tickets will be sold after Masses on October 30 and 31. Tickets will also be available in the parish office. Each ticket, which is tax deductible, will be \$50. Selected winners will be responsible for a \$35-green fee which includes a cart. Nine parishioners will be selected, each to play six holes with the Bishop. Selected golfers can play all 18 holes. Proceeds will benefit the Washington Fields project and the nine raffle ticket winners will be selected November 1 and notified by telephone.



Seats for the dinner with the Bishop are now open and because the dinner is a fundraiser, the tickets will be \$1,000 per person and \$1,750 per couple. Just stop by the office for a ticket. The dinner will feature live music by our music director, Nedje Douyon. Appetizers, followed by Seared Atlantic Salmon dinner and delicious dessert will be prepared by Chef Salvador Guido, all amidst great company. This event is expensive but so is building a new church. Don't worry if this dinner isn't feasible for everyone; there will be other opportunities by which you can help make a difference.

Gratitude in Action: Our Way of Life / Gratitud en Acción: Nuestra forma de Vida

How do we love with soul, with mind, with strength? How do we love neighbor as we love ourself?

There are many minds, many different ideas and perspectives with suggested ways of expressing this love for God and neighbor. Each of us is different and our means of expression are also different.

Loving God with our heart is easy, especially when we have a personal relationship with Him. Conversation with God comes naturally, like speaking to a loved one or dear friend.

My soul loves God is a very spiritual way that is beyond speech, connected in a divine manner that words cannot express, or if such an expression is attempted, it fails.

My mind is centered on God in all I undertake. Waking moments of work, whether home or office, are aware of the presence of God, not only in the work itself, but in the faces of those encountered during work.

Our minds center on God in prayer, whether alone or in communion with others at Mass, in prayer groups, or ministering to the sick and suffering. Our minds and hearts, our voices, our very souls are raised in joyous praise, humble petition, or grateful thanksgiving as we glorify and honor Him by who we are and what we do.

Centering our lives on God, opening our hearts and minds to His Way and His Will, our souls cannot help but feel and thus convey the strength with which we love Him in return for the great love He has for each of us.

"God has a special purpose, a special love, a special providence for all those he has created. ... Every moment of our life has a purpose, every action of ours, no matter how dull or routine or trivial it may seem in itself, has a dignity and a worth beyond human understanding. ... it means that no moment can be wasted, no opportunity missed, since each has a purpose in man's life, each has a purpose in God's plan. ..."

No one can know greater peace, no one can be more committed, no one can achieve a greater sense of fulfillment in his life than the man who believes in this truth of the faith and strives daily to put it into practice. ... seems too simple, ... find how difficult it is. ... find out as well the joy and the peace and the happiness it can bring. For what can ultimately trouble the soul that accepts every moment of every day as a gift from the hands of God and strives always to do his will? ... Nothing can touch us that does not come from his hand, nothing can trouble us because all things come from his hand." (Magnificat 2021: Servant of God Walter J. Mi alma ama a Dios es una forma muy espiritual que está más allá del habla, conectada de una manera divina que las palabras no pueden expresar, o si se intenta tal expresión, falla.

"Dios tiene un propósito especial, un amor especial, una providencia especial para todos aquellos que ha creado. ... Cada momento de nuestra vida tiene un propósito, cada acción nuestra, no importa cuán aburrida, rutinaria o trivial pueda parecer en sí misma, tiene una dignidad y un valor más allá de la comprensión humana. ... significa que no se puede perder ningún momento, no se puede perder ninguna oportunidad, ya que cada uno tiene un propósito en la vida del hombre, cada uno tiene un propósito en el plan de Dios. ..."

Nadie puede conocer una paz mayor, nadie puede estar más comprometido, nadie puede alcanzar un mayor sentido de plenitud en su vida que el hombre que cree en esta verdad de la fe y se esfuerza día a día por ponerla en práctica. ... parece demasiado simple, ... descubre lo difícil que es. ... Descubre también la alegría, la paz y la felicidad que puede traer. Porque, ¿qué puede en última instancia perturbar al alma que acepta cada momento de cada día como un regalo de las manos de Dios y se esfuerza siempre por hacer su voluntad? ... Nada puede tocarnos que no venga de su mano, nada puede perturbarnos porque todas las cosas vienen de su mano".

PASTOR'S MESSAGE / MENSAJE DEL PADRE: FATHER DAVID BITTMENN



An old saying reminds us that people will occasionally stumble over the truth. When they do, they will pick themselves up and continue as before. There's a lot going on in life with all of its emotional, physical, economic, and social demands. People usually do miss a truth or two. From time to time experiences and perspectives from the past help spot some missed truths. In that spirit this weekend's second reading presents a verbal picture of priests of the Old Testament who together formed a great line of truth and light over centuries as they all performed similar tasks in the worship of the One God. Generation after generation offered their lives to keep before the community the experiences and perspectives of worship and righteousness in order to communicate truths that should not be passed over through the demands life makes upon us. It's not difficult to picture the curves and stretches in this great line, the times when communicating worship and righteousness was particularly difficult for reasons that probably still apply today.

There's something noble about people doing very similar things year after year in the service of something greater. There's also something humbling because their great efforts were at the service of holding the line. They marked time until a more effective priest would arrive. This priest would fulfill the sense of truth and light painstakingly maintained and this same priest would offer more. There's a sense of this in the second reading when it explains that this promised priest "has no need, as did the high priests, to offer sacrifices day after day, first for his own sins and then for those of the people; he did that once for all when he offered himself." Jesus the priest of priests did not bring sacrifice after sacrifice knowing full well that many more sacrifices would be necessary. Instead Jesus opened the door of salvation once for all by means of one sacrifice.

Some will understand Christ opens a door. The presence of God in their lives moves them through the door. Others will see the gift of God's presence in the lives as something precious and to be protected at all costs. They will continue their habits because these habits are lauded in Scripture and because they seem to be associated with God's presence. So far so good. But that's all they do. They are stuck and they don't move toward the door. They pile up sacrifice after sacrifice knowing full well that more sacrifices will be necessary. They are not in a bad position, but their pain serves only as a reason for more sacrifices rather than a reason to move a bit toward Christ's door. It takes effort to stay still while others pass by with ease. There's an old saying: people will stumble over the truth but they will pick themselves up and continue as before.

Un dicho viejo nos recuerda que la gente ocasionalmente tropeza con la verdad. Cuando lo haga, se levantará y continuará como antes. Hay mucho que hacer en la vida con todas sus demandas emocionales, físicas, económicas y sociales. La gente normalmente pierde una verdad o dos. De vez en cuando las experiencias y perspectivas del pasado ayudan a detectar algunas verdades perdidas. En ese espíritu, la segunda lectura de este fin de semana presenta una imagen verbal de los sacerdotes del Antiguo Testamento que juntos formaron una gran línea de verdad y luz a lo largo de los siglos, ya que todos realizaron tareas similares en la adoración del único Dios. Generación tras generación ofrecieron sus vidas para mantener ante la comunidad las experiencias y perspectivas de adoración y justicia con el fin de comunicar verdades que no deben ser ignoradas en las exigencias que la vida nos hace. No es difícil imaginar las curvas y estiramientos en esta gran línea, los tiempos en que comunicar adoración y justicia era particularmente difícil por razones que probablemente todavía se aplican hoy en día.

Hay algo noble en la gente haciendo cosas muy similares año tras año al servicio de algo mayor. También hay algo humillante porque sus grandes esfuerzos estuvieron al servicio de mantener más que crecer. Esperaron hasta que llegaría un sacerdote más eficaz. Este sacerdote cumpliría el sentido de la verdad y de la luz cuidadosamente mantenido y este mismo sacerdote ofrecería más. Hay un sentido de esto en la segunda lectura cuando explica que este sacerdote prometido "no necesite ofrecer sacrificios cada día – como los sumos sacerdotes, que ofrecían primero por los propios pecados, después por los del pueblo – porque lo hizo de una vez para siempre, ofreciéndose a sí mismo." Jesús, el sacerdote de los sacerdotes, no traía sacrificio después del sacrificio sabiendo muy bien que serían necesarios muchos más sacrificios. En cambio, Jesús abrió la puerta de la salvación de una vez por todas por medio de un sacrificio.

Algunos entenderán que Cristo abre una puerta. La presencia de Dios en sus vidas los mueve a través de la puerta. Otros verán el don de la presencia de Dios en las vidas como algo precioso y que debe ser protegido a toda costa. Continuarán sus hábitos porque estos hábitos son alabados en las Escrituras y porque parecen estar asociados con la presencia de Dios. Hasta ahora, bien. Pero eso es todo lo que hacen. Están atascados y no se mueven hacia la puerta. Acumulan sacrificio después de sacrificio sabiendo perfectamente que serán necesarios más sacrificios. No están en una mala posición, pero su dolor sirve sólo como una razón para más sacrificios en lugar de una razón para moverse un poco hacia la puerta de Cristo. Se necesita esfuerzo para permanecer quieto mientras otros pasan con facilidad. Hay un dicho viejo: la gente tropezará con la verdad, pero se levantará y continuará como antes.



The origins of the Equestrian Order of the Holy Sepulchre of Jerusalem date back to the First Crusade in the year 1099, over 900 years ago. As a Papal Order, today, our members dedicate themselves to personal sanctification, fidelity to the teachings of the Roman Catholic Church, and support of the Christian Community in the Holy Land.

Knights and Dames continue this tradition through prayer and pilgrimage, active involvement in their parish and diocese and a commitment of financial resources to support Catholic Institutions in the Holy Land.

The Equestrian Order of the Holy Sepulchre of Jerusalem is the only lay institution of the Vatican State charged with the task of providing for the needs of the Latin Patriarchate of Jerusalem and of all the activities and initiatives to support the Christian presence in the Holy Land. The Christian presence is currently less than 2% in the land where Jesus was born, lived and died.

Financial contributions by members of the Order are used throughout the Archdiocese of Jerusalem, which includes Israel, the Palestinian Territories, Jordan and Cyprus.

Areas of support include:

- Parishes, churches and community centers
- Convents, seminaries and seminarians
- Clinics, hospitals and orphanages
- Parish grade schools, high schools and Bethlehem University
- Humanitarian assistance for food and medical supplies
