Anticipation awaits us. Good, or less than pleasant, we experience expectations, predictions, in general, events, happenings and occurrences for which we may not be prepared.

Life evolves with pleasant, exciting and uplifting experiences which bring joy, new energy and a higher level of enthusiasm to us.

The birth of a child may be a joyous, long-awaited celebration. Birthdays, weddings and anniversaries all call us to gather and share with others the happiness taking place in their lives. A new home or job brings gladness. A hard-fought, exhilarating competition gives way to a joy-filled victory.

Life also challenges us with moments of anxiety, depression, sadness, and perhaps, even bitterness.

Sickness, especially a lengthy or serious illness, can change our usual way of living as we attempt to regain our good health and strength. Temporary unemployment also may cause us to change our ways so we can compensate for the lack of income.

Broken relationships bring heartache; we seek to nurse the hurt. Depression may enter into our feelings of loss and abandonment, thus making our recovery more difficult.

There may be times when we feel alone, deprived of the good things many others we know are experiencing, and questioning why we cannot share the same. We may find ourselves feeling bitter. That bitterness within us may create a person we do not know, someone we really choose not to be.

Where is God in all of this? Where is God when we truly need Him?

**Her schedule** was complicated but she found the time to join a Bible study program at her parish. She was a welcome addition, pleasant and inquisitive, and she knew some people in the course already. Yet from time to time she was distant and hesitant during class and she had trouble putting her finger on the reason. It hovered just beyond her consciousness and when she tried to explain it, it seemed to disappear. One day after class she was all smiles. She explained that a phrase mentioned by one of the participants shed light on her preoccupation and offered a way forward. "All this," she said, "from one simple phrase!" She went on to explain that a strict upbringing meant that she was particularly aware of her faults but not much aware of much else. The phrase that brought light was, "God knows we are flawed and he loves us anyway."

A similar breakthrough is recorded in this weekend's second reading. Day after day the priests of the Old Testament ministered in the temple offering "those same sacrifices that can never take away sins." But Christ "offered one sacrifice for sins, and took his seat forever at the right hand of God..." The missing piece, long awaited, had come to replace futility with salvation. But the riches continue to inspire. Christ, true God and true man, takes his seat forever at the right hand of God. In Christ humanity will always be in heaven. The promises of old - the promises we will hear in Advent - about a broken people made whole and brought back to the Promised Land are now more than fulfilled.

And Christ is still with us on earth even while he is in heaven. He couldn't leave us even as he blazed the trail into glory for us. Ephesians 1:15-23 and 1 Corinthians 12:27 tell us that the Body of Christ, his humanity, is here on earth amongst us. It is so because the heavenly kingdom is in the world as a kind of shadow made real or a piercing light in the midst of grey. "'The kingdom of Christ [is] already present in mystery,' on earth, the seed and the beginning of the Kingdom.... '[T]he Church on earth is endowed already with a sanctity that is real but imperfect.' Christ's kingdom already manifests its presence through the miraculous signs that attend its proclamation by the Church (Catechism of the Catholic Church #669-670)."

Spectacular news no matter how it is phrased.

Skeptics respond that it all is pretty words and vain aspirations. Everything is that way for the skeptic except for the things one skeptic holds dear. And yet these are the very things another skeptic ruthlessly denies. A choice is to be made. Either both hope and light are illusions or follow the lead of the Church making its way through the grey to the piercing light.

Un día después de clase estaba muy contenta. Explicó que una frase mencionada por uno de los participantes identificaba su preocupación y le ofrecía una solución a su dilema. "Todo esto", dijo, "¿de una simple frase!" Aclaraba que su estricta educación significaba que era particularmente consciente de sus defectos, pero no muy consciente de nada más. La frase que trajo entendimiento era: "Dios sabe que somos defectuosos y nos ama de todos modos".

Un avance similar se registra en la segunda lectura de este fin de semana. Día tras día los sacerdotes del Antiguo Testamento ministraban en el templo y ofrecían "los mismos sacrificios, porque de ningún modo pueden borrar los pecados." Cristo era diferente. Él "ofreció por los pecados, para siempre jamás, un solo sacrificio; está sentado a la derecha de Dios...". La pieza faltante, largamente esperada, vino a reemplazar la futilidad con la salvación. También las riquezas nos inspiran de una manera diferente. Cristo, verdadero Dios y verdadero hombre, toma su asiento para siempre a la diestra de Dios. En Cristo la humanidad siempre estará en el cielo. Las promesas de antaño, las promesas que escucharemos en Adviento, sobre un pueblo roto traído de vuelta a la Tierra Prometida ahora están más que cumplidas.

Cristo todavía está con nosotros en la tierra, aun cuando Él está en el cielo. No pudo dejarnos cuando dejó el mundo para la gloria del cielo. Efesios 1:15-23 y 1 Corintios 12:27 nos dicen que el Cuerpo de Cristo, su humanidad, está aquí en la tierra entre nosotros. Es así porque el reino celestial está en el mundo como una especie de sombra hecha real o una luz penetrante en medio del gris. "'El reino de Cristo [está] ya presente en el misterio', en la tierra, la semilla y el comienzo del Reino.... 'La Iglesia en la tierra ya está dotada de una santidad que es real pero imperfecta'. El reino de Cristo ya manifiesta su presencia a través de las señales milagrosas que asisten a su proclamación por la Iglesia (Catecismo de la Iglesia Católica #669-670)".

Noticias espectaculares no importa cómo se fraseo.

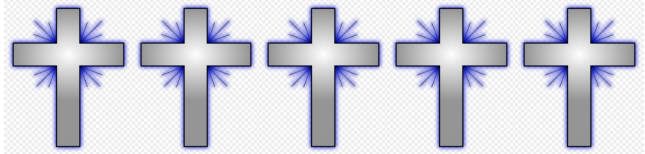

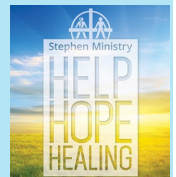

## Saint Joseph SUMMIT

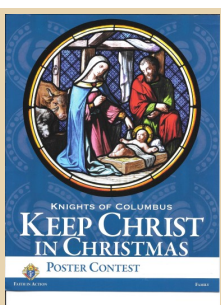

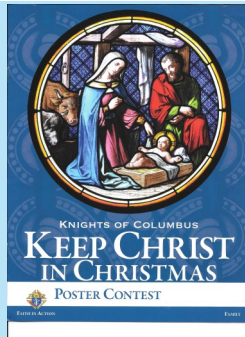


