"... in quiet and in trust your strength lies." Is 30:15b

Love ~ Hate – Curse ~ Pray – Give ~ Forgive

Love your enemies ~ Be merciful

Do not Judge ~ Do not Condemn

"Do to others as you would have them do to you."
Luke 6:31

We were created by Love to love and be loved. When seeking a definition of 'love', the *Catechism of the Catholic Church* refers one to the word 'charity'. "*The theological virtue by which we love God above all things for his own sake, and our neighbor as ourselves for the love of God (1822).*"

No one wants to be spoken to in an angry or hurtful manner. No one wants to be judged or condemned, especially unfairly. Our Judge is God, Who, as we know, judges according to the heart of each of us. "*If God doesn't judge us for our many failings, who are we to judge others harshly?*"¹

We are called to be merciful and kind, to forgive even our enemies, just as our Lord did also. Loving even our enemies, which may seem radical, is to will the good of the other. When someone has experienced the painful loss of a loved one who was a victim of murder, we may ask ourselves how that individual could ever forgive the other. Yet, frequently, we read that through forgiving another for such a heinous crime, the individual suffering the loss begins the necessary healing process.

"*If we don't take time to reflect on the ways we have been forgiven, it will be hard to be merciful to others. And yet we set this as our goal each time we pray the Our Father: 'Forgive us our sins as we forgive those who sin against us.'*"¹

As Stewards, we are called to be *Mindful* (living in the present without baggage from our past or fear of the future); *Prayerful* (always living in the presence of our loving God); *Grateful* (thanking God for all of His blessings – both big and little); *Gracious* (receiving and welcoming ALL of God's creation); *Committed* (living each day with the knowledge everything belongs to God); and *Accountable* (valuing our parish community and what we can, as a family, do to make this world a better place for all).

Fuimos creados por el Amor para amar y ser amados. Al buscar una definición de 'amor', el *Catecismo de la Iglesia Católica* se refiere a la palabra 'caridad'. "*La virtud teologal por la cual amamos a Dios sobre todas las cosas por sí mismo, y a nuestro prójimo como a nosotros mismos por amor de Dios (1822).*"

Nadie quiere que le hablen de una manera enojada o hiriente. Nadie quiere ser juzgado o condenado, especialmente injustamente. Nuestro Juez es Dios, Quien, como sabemos, juzga según el corazón de cada uno de nosotros. "*Si Dios no nos juzga por nuestras muchas fallas, ¿quiénes somos nosotros para juzgar a los demás con dureza?*"¹

Estamos llamados a ser misericordiosos y amables, a perdonar incluso a nuestros enemigos, tal como también lo hizo nuestro Señor. Amar incluso a nuestros enemigos, lo que puede parecer radical, es querer el bien del otro. Cuando alguien ha experimentado la dolorosa pérdida de un ser querido que fue víctima de un asesinato, podemos preguntarnos cómo ese individuo podría perdonar al otro. Sin embargo, con frecuencia leemos que, al perdonar a otro por un crimen tan atroz, el individuo que sufre la pérdida comienza el proceso de curación necesario.

"*Si no nos tomamos el tiempo para reflexionar sobre las formas en que hemos sido perdonados, será difícil ser misericordiosos con los demás. Y, sin embargo, fijamos este como nuestro objetivo cada vez que rezamos el Padre Nuestro: 'Perdónanos nuestros pecados como nosotros perdonamos a los que pecan contra nosotros.'*"¹

Como Corresponsables, estamos llamados a ser *Conscientes* (vivir en el presente sin el equipaje de nuestro pasado o miedo al futuro); *En oración* (siempre viviendo en la presencia de nuestro amoroso Dios); *Agradecido* (agradeciendo a Dios por todas Sus bendiciones, tanto grandes como pequeñas); *Misericordioso* (recibiendo y dando la bienvenida a TODA la creación de Dios); *Comprometidos* (vivir cada día con el conocimiento de que todo es de Dios); y *Responsable* (valorando nuestra comunidad parroquial y lo que podemos hacer como familia para hacer de este mundo un lugar mejor para todos).

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A CHANGE IN THE DIOCESAN MASK POLICY

When the pandemic began, there were all kinds of ideas and worries circulating and it was hard to know what was really happening. There were a lot of open-ended questions. Would the virus really die off in the summer? How many precautions were sufficient? Could a safe vaccine be developed and if so how long would that take? Science knew quite a bit about the virus, but there were still unknowns and it took time to address them. This was complicated by the fact that science is not monolithic. A general consensus needs to develop and that takes time. Science also prides itself on reversing its conclusions when more evidence warrants it. For quite a while about the only thing we knew for certain was that we didn't know.

In times of unknowns, risk increases and different people respond to risk differently. Public health officials tended to err on the side of caution. Others thought the pandemic was not that bad and they assessed the risk of Covid-19 differently. Still others did more than public health officials recommended while some groups took the opposite position, believing the whole pandemic to be a hoax. All of this was clouded still further by polarization of the pandemic on both the left and the right. In the face of uncertainty, ready-made answers were appealing and it was easier to pigeonhole people with little consideration given to their own thoughts on the matter.

In the midst of all of this confusion, quite a few people held their views and expressed them civilly. Such a combination is not polemical. Thanks to all of these folks.

As the pandemic continued, people setting Covid-19 precaution policies changed them. Some claimed it was the superiority of their own position which caused these changes. That may be so, but it could also be because science moved a different way or because the pandemic itself ebbed and flowed. This last reason explains the bishop's latest changes to the diocesan policy regarding Covid-19 precautions. When the omicron spike was building, the bishop decided to make masks mandatory in Mass and larger gatherings. Now that we are on the downward side of the omicron spike, the bishop decided to make masks in Mass and larger gatherings optional but encouraged. Social distancing is encouraged in this latest policy change as is being vaccinated.

One of the things the bishop approved was offering a section in the church for social distancing while the rest of the pews would be for regular, pre-pandemic seating. We'll follow this idea in the church and in Kuzy hall. Mass will continue to be streamed to Kuzy Hall. Maybe we can manage to fill both places.

The risk in doing this is that the bishop may judge that the pandemic is increasing and what we have relaxed may be reinstated.

UN CAMBIO EN LA POLÍTICA DIOCESANA DE MÁSCARAS

Cuando comenzó la pandemia, había todo tipo de ideas y preocupaciones circulando y era difícil saber lo que realmente estaba sucediendo. Hubo muchas preguntas sin respuestas. ¿El virus realmente moriría en el verano? ¿Cuántas precauciones fueron suficientes? ¿Podría desarrollarse una vacuna segura y, de ser así, cuánto tiempo tardaría eso? La ciencia sabía bastante sobre el virus, pero todavía había incógnitas y tomó tiempo para abordarlas. Esto se complicó por el hecho de que la ciencia no es monolítica. Es necesario desarrollar un consenso general y eso lleva tiempo. La ciencia también se enorgullece de revertir sus conclusiones cuando más evidencia lo amerita. Durante bastante tiempo, lo único que sabíamos con certeza era que no lo sabíamos. En tiempos de incógnitas, el riesgo aumenta y diferentes personas responden al riesgo de manera diferente. Los funcionarios de salud pública tendían a equivocarse por precaución. Otros pensaron que la pandemia no era tan mala y evaluaron el riesgo de Covid-19 de manera diferente. Otros hicieron más de lo que los funcionarios de salud pública recomendaron mientras que algunos grupos tomaron la posición opuesta, creyendo que toda la pandemia era un engaño. La polarización empeoró la situación porque los liberales y conservadores insistieron agresivamente en sus puntos de vista. En tiempos de incertidumbre, las respuestas preparadas eran atractivas y era más fácil juzgar a las personas con poca consideración dada a sus propias ideas sobre el asunto.

En medio de toda esta confusión, muchas personas mantuvieron sus puntos de vista y los expresaron civilmente. Tal combinación no es polémica. Gracias a todas estas personas.

A medida que la pandemia continuó, las personas que establecieron políticas de precaución de Covid-19 las cambiaron. Otras personas afirmaron que estos cambios sucedieron debido a la superioridad de sus propias ideas. Eso puede ser cierto, pero también podría ser porque la ciencia aceptó conclusiones diferentes o porque la pandemia en sí era más débil o más fuerte. Esta última razón explica los últimos cambios del obispo en la política diocesana en la política diocesana con respecto a las precauciones de Covid-19. Cuando Covid-19 era fuerte, el obispo decidió hacer las máscaras obligatorias en la Misa y en las reuniones más grandes. Ahora que Covid-19 es más débil, el obispo decidió hacer las máscaras en la Misa y reuniones más grandes opcionales, pero alentadas. El distanciamiento social y las vacunas también se recomiendan en este último cambio de política.

Una de las cosas que el obispo aprobó fue ofrecer una sección en la iglesia para el distanciamiento social, mientras que el resto de los bancos serían para asientos regulares antes de la pandemia. Seguiremos esta idea en la iglesia y en el salón Kuzy. La Misa continuará siendo transmitida a Kuzy Hall. Tal vez podamos llenar ambos lugares con gente.

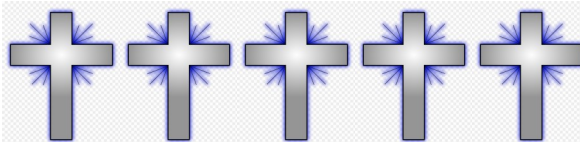
